

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

House Price Growth (February 2021 data)


Annual Change in House Prices



House prices in City of London fell by 1.3% in the 12 months to February 2021 (based on 6-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 6.6% and prices in London grew by 4.5% over the same period.

City of London house prices are now 67.8% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +66.5% for London and +36.1% across England.


Year-To-Date Change in House Prices, December to February




Local prices have grown by 0.1% in 2021 so far, compared to growth of 3.5% over the same period last year.

12 months to February 2021







Transactions (December 2020 data)


Annual Transactions, Indexed (2001-05 average = 100)



There were 103 transactions in City of London during the 12 months to December 2020. This is 27% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is significantly below pre-downturn levels.

Transactions in City of London have fallen by 68.1% since 2014, compared to changes of -42.6% for London and -28.7% for England.


Cash and New Build Sales as % of Total, by Year

Depth of Market by Property Type



The most common property type transacted over the past 12 months in City of London was 'second hand flats' with 73 sales, 91% of all sales over the same period. The annual total of 80 transactions is equivalent to 28% of the long term average level of activity.

The most common property type transacted over the past 20 years was 'second hand flats' with the equivalent of 213 sales per year on average, making up 74% of the typical annual total over that period.
