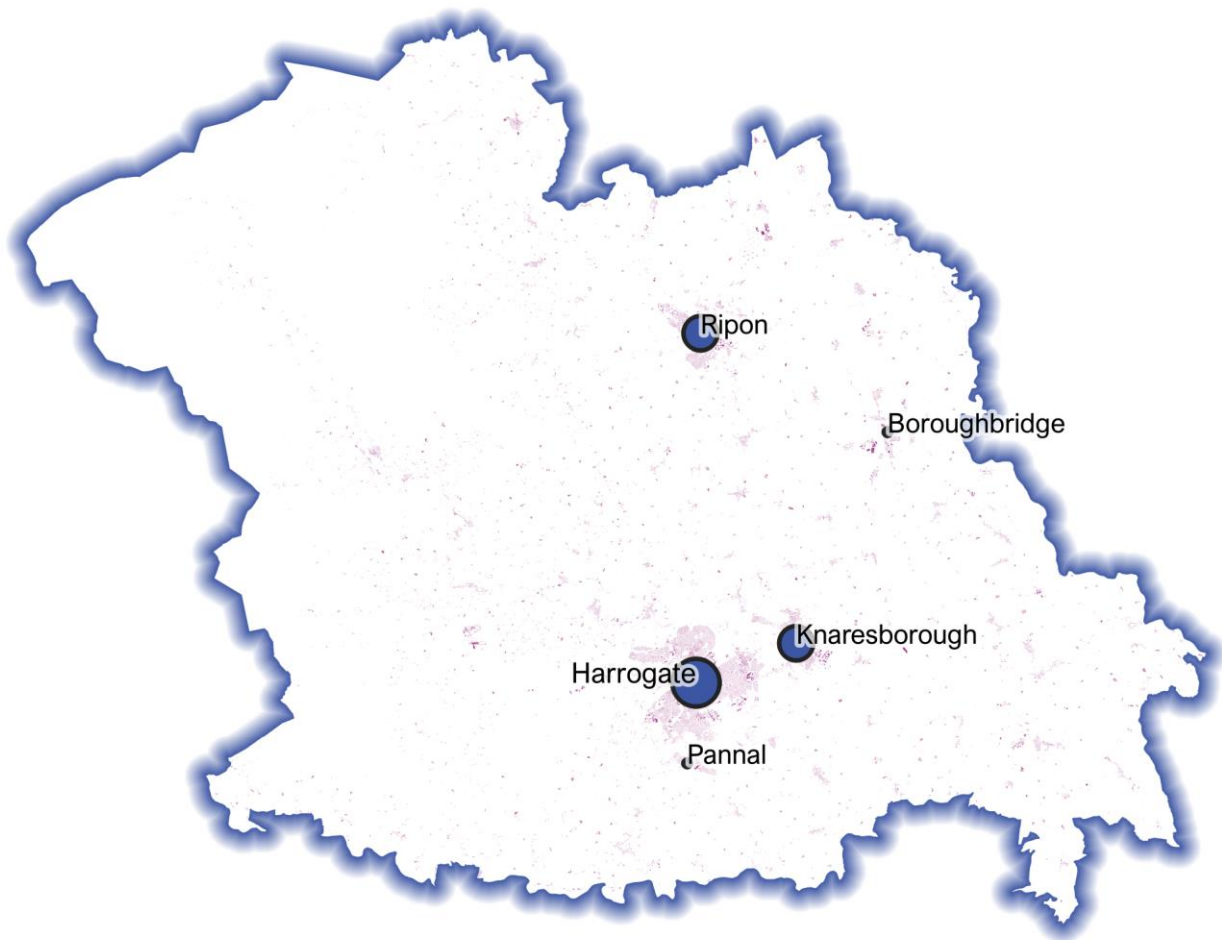

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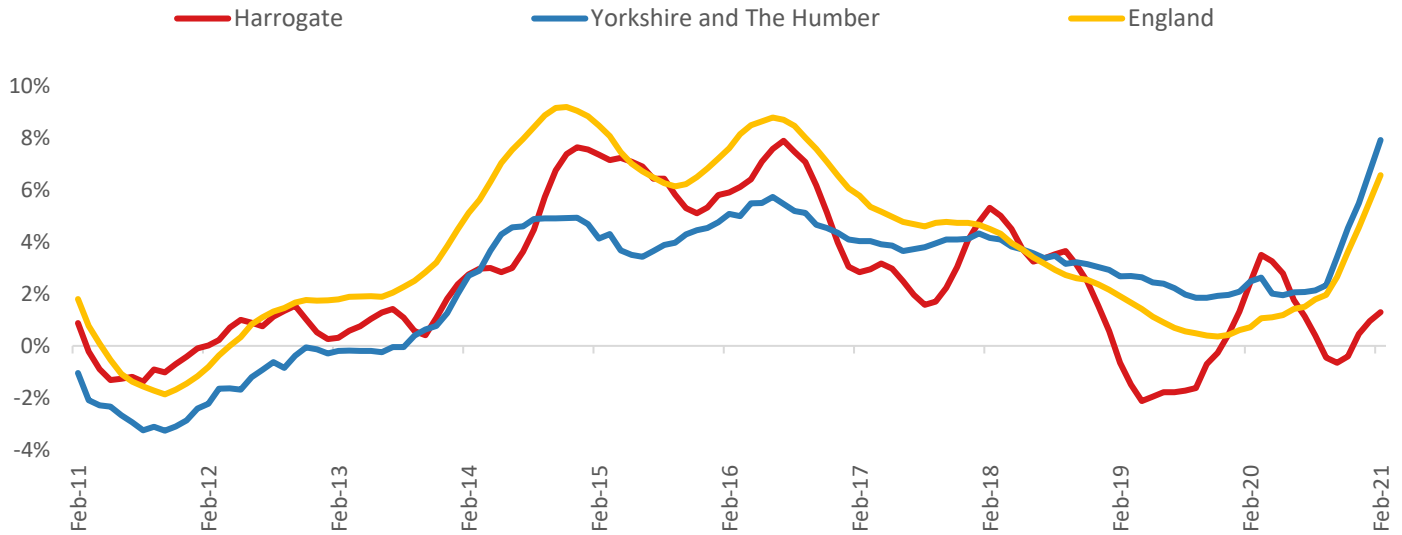

House Price Growth (February 2021 data)

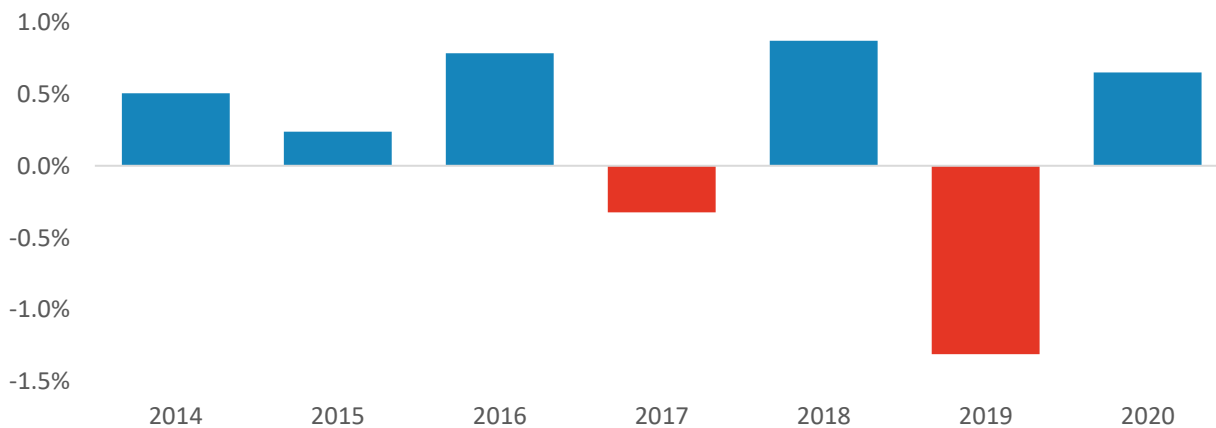
Annual Change in House Prices



House prices in Harrogate grew by 1.3% in the 12 months to February 2021 (based on 6-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 6.6% and prices in Yorkshire and The Humber grew by 7.9% over the same period.

Harrogate house prices are now 20.9% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +19.0% for Yorkshire and The Humber and +36.1% across England.

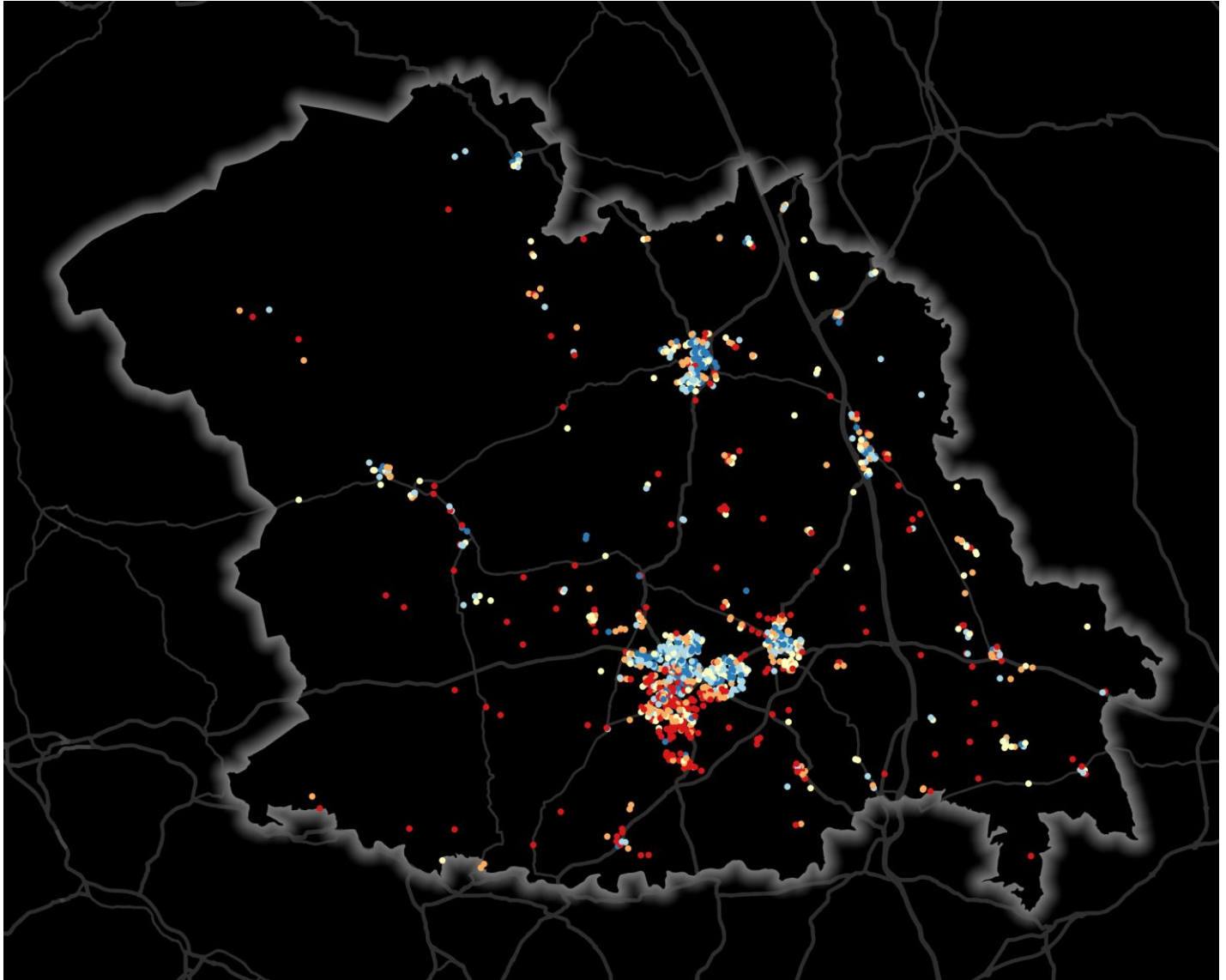
Year-To-Date Change in House Prices, December to February



Local prices have grown by 0.6% in 2021 so far, compared to a fall of 1.3% over the same period last year.

Each point is one postcode, coloured by the average value relative to all sales in this local authority (price bands are LA-specific quintiles).

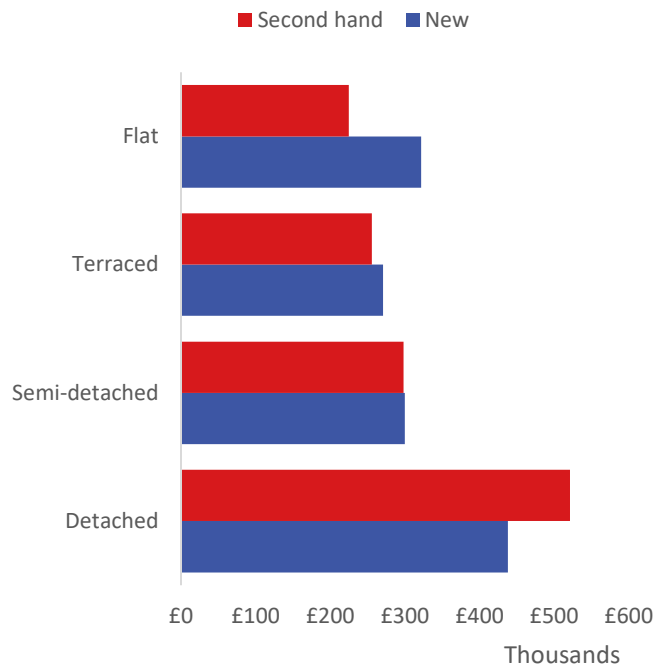

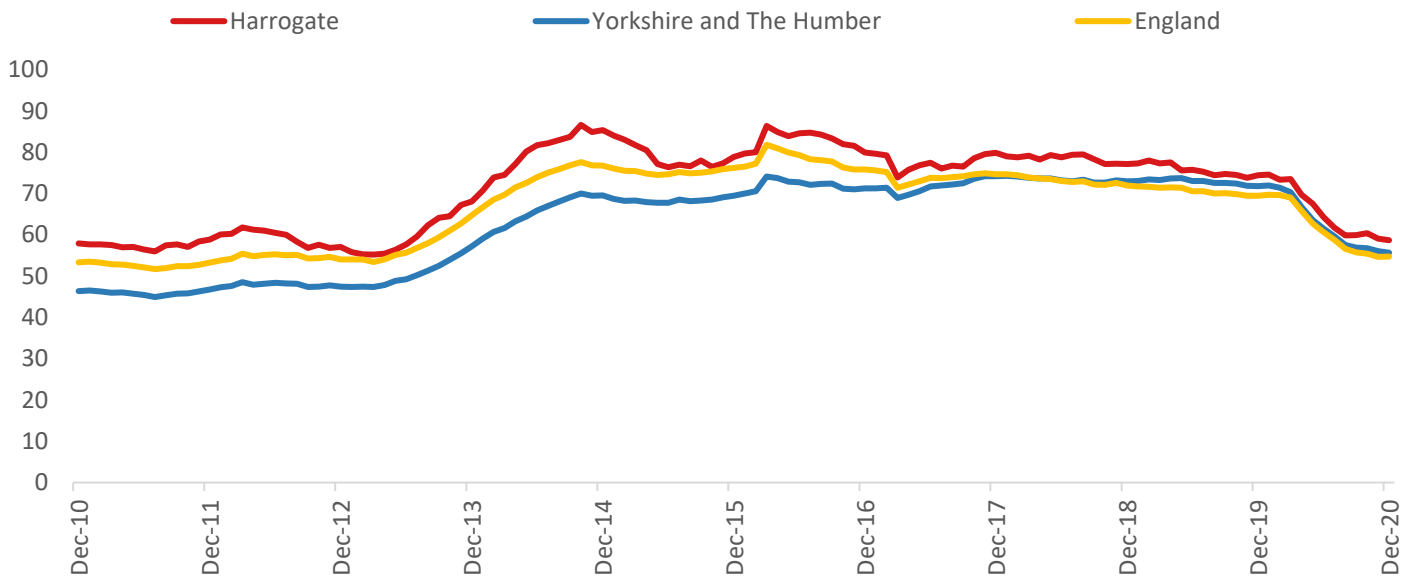

Transactions (December 2020 data)

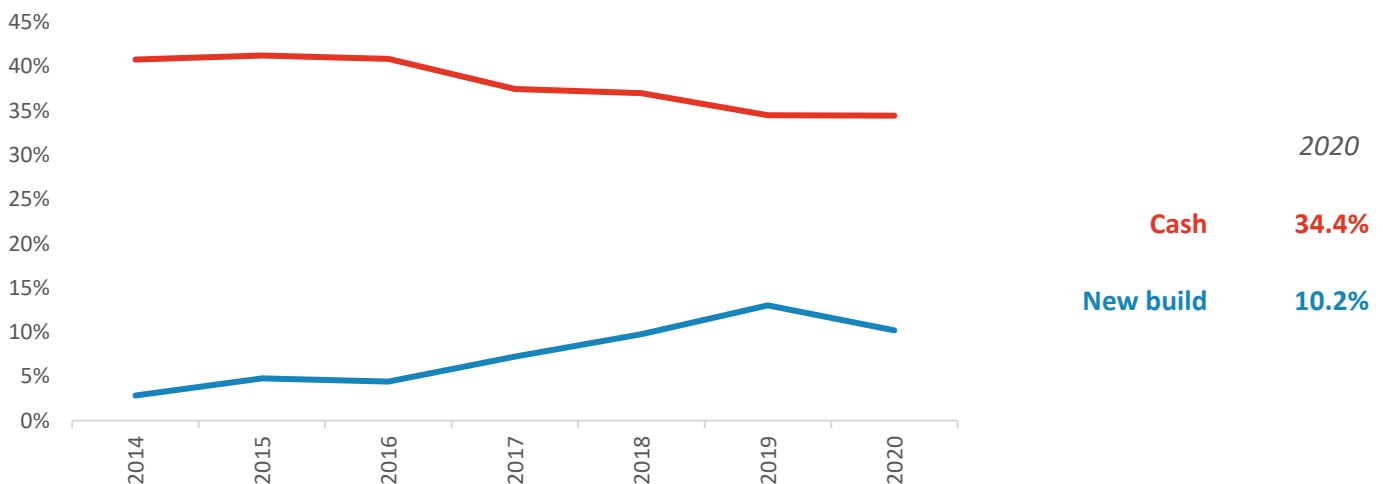
Annual Transactions, Indexed (2001-05 average = 100)



There were 2,180 transactions in Harrogate during the 12 months to December 2020. This is 59% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is significantly below pre-downturn levels.

Transactions in Harrogate have fallen by 31.3% since 2014, compared to changes of -19.9% for Yorkshire and The Humber and -28.7% for England.

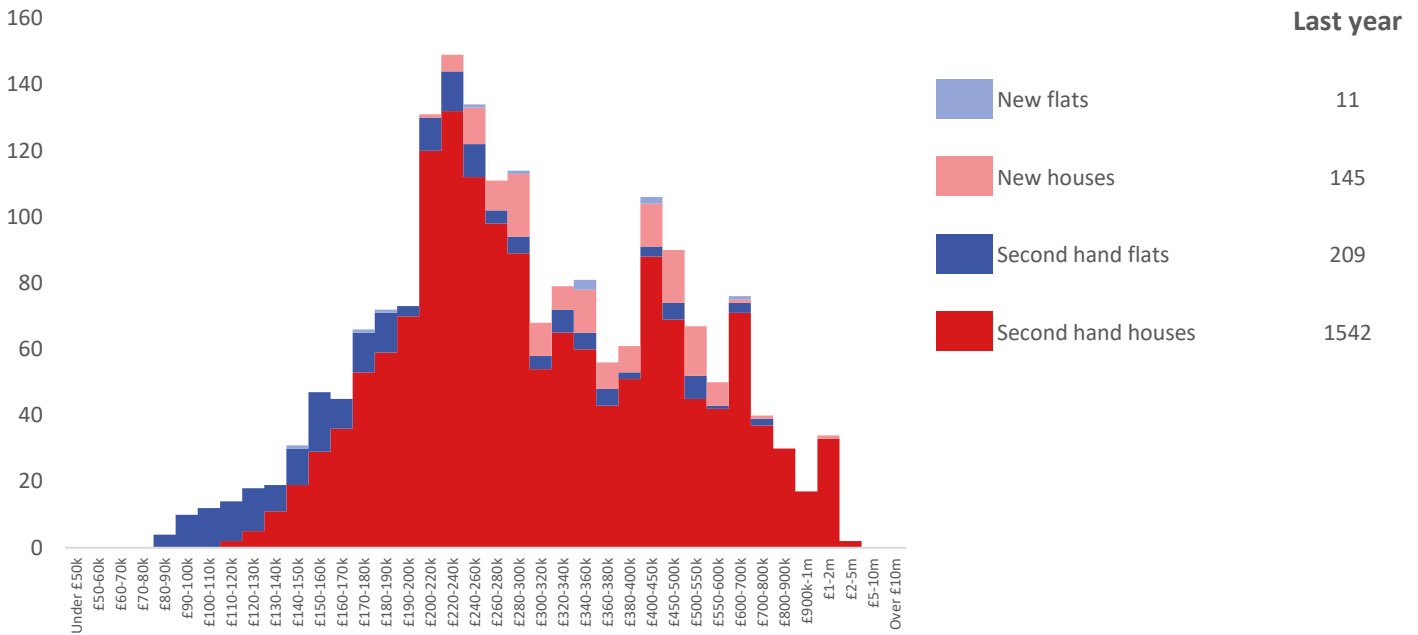
Cash and New Build Sales as % of Total, by Year

Depth of Market by Property Type

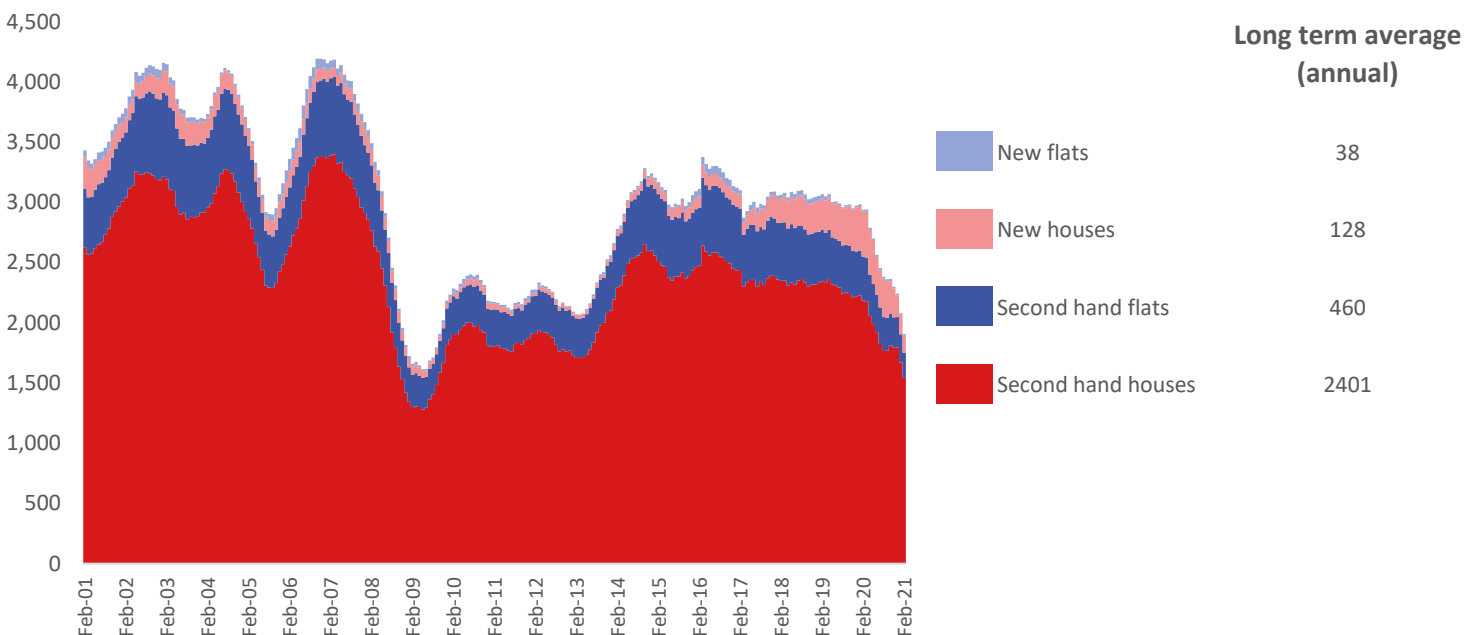
12 months to February 2021



The most common property type transacted over the past 12 months in Harrogate was 'second hand houses' with 1,542 sales, 81% of all sales over the same period. The annual total of 1,907 transactions is equivalent to 63% of the long term average level of activity.

Timeline of Transactions by Type

Rolling 12 months, past 20 years



The most common property type transacted over the past 20 years was 'second hand houses' with the equivalent of 2,401 sales per year on average, making up 79% of the typical annual total over that period.
