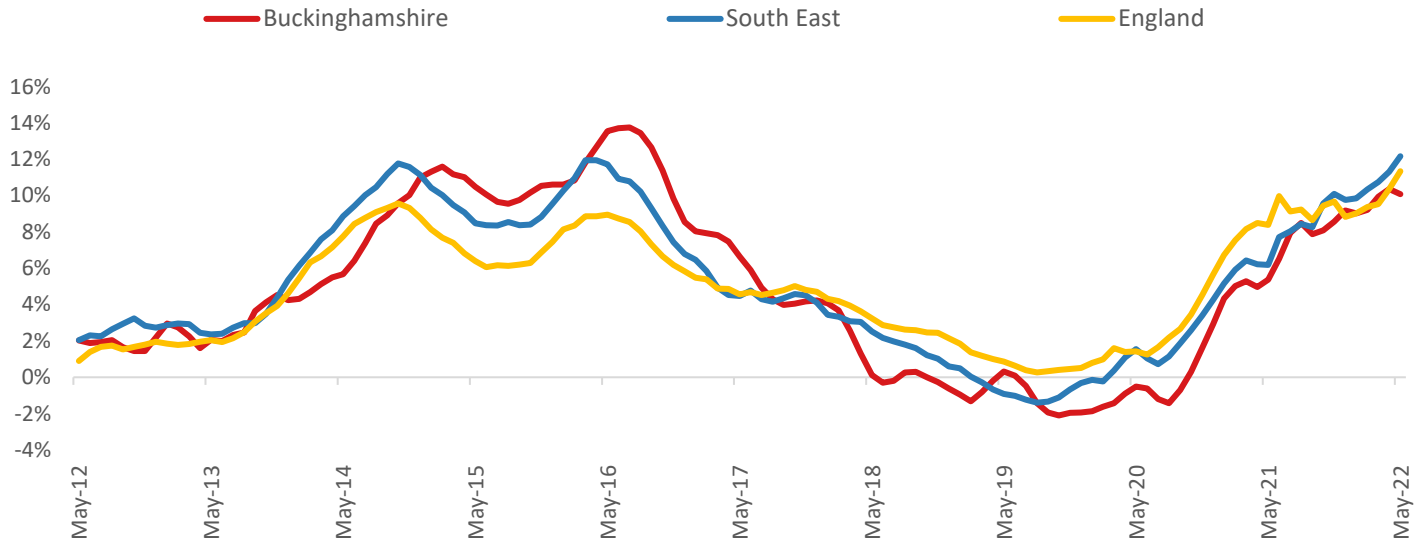

**House Price Growth (May 2022 data)**

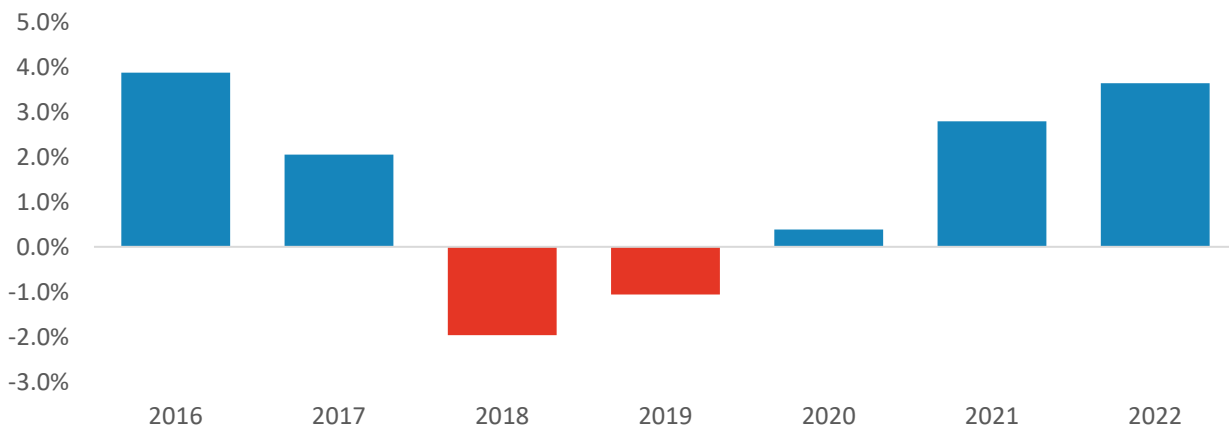
*Annual Change in House Prices*



House prices in Buckinghamshire grew by 10.1% in the 12 months to May 2022 (based on 3-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 11.3% and prices in the South East grew by 12.2% over the same period.

Buckinghamshire house prices are now 59.9% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +62.0% for the South East and +53.8% across England.

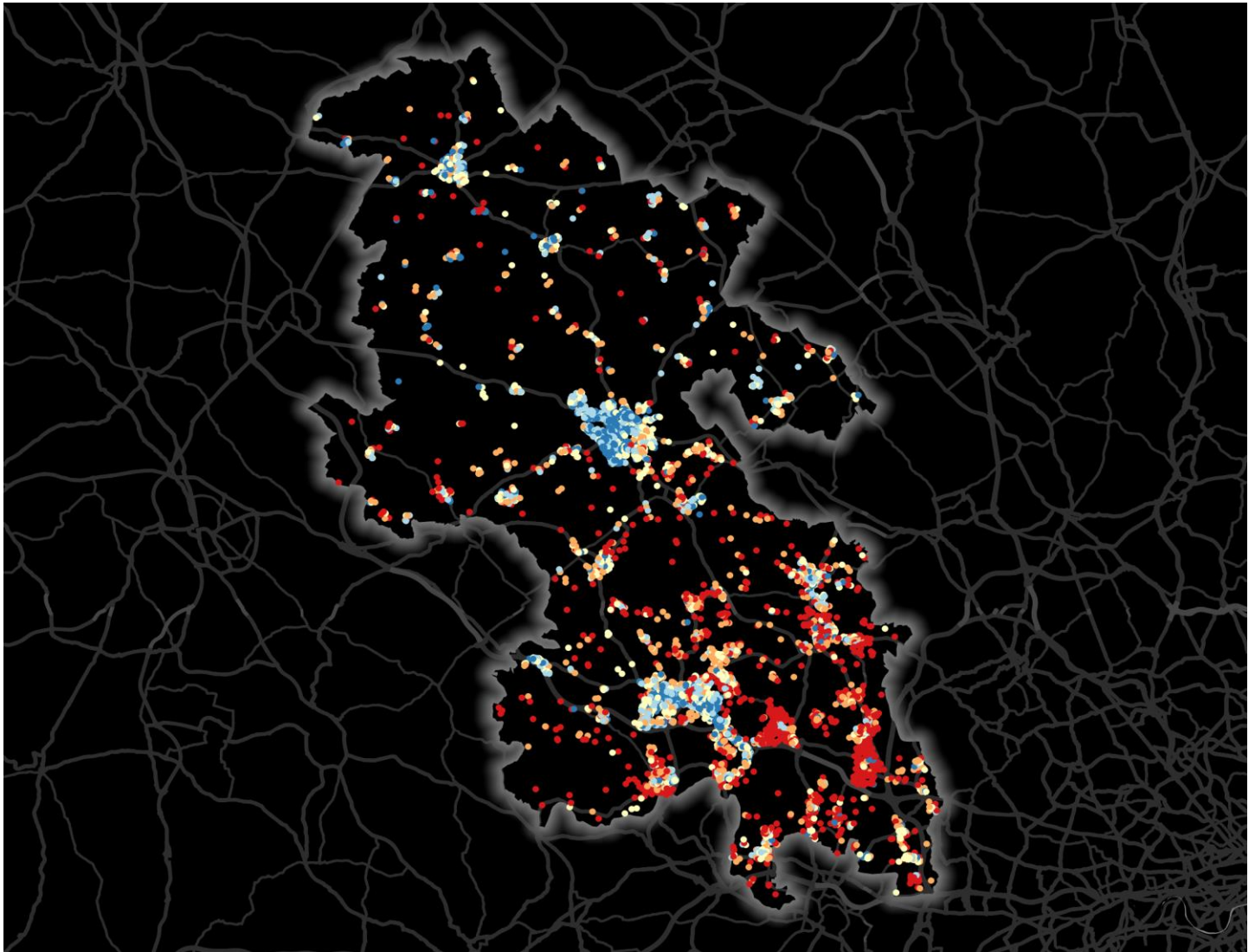
*Year-To-Date Change in House Prices, December to May*



Local prices have grown by 3.6% in 2022 so far, compared to growth of 2.8% over the same period last year.

Each point is one postcode, coloured by the average value relative to all sales in this local authority (price bands are LA-specific quintiles).

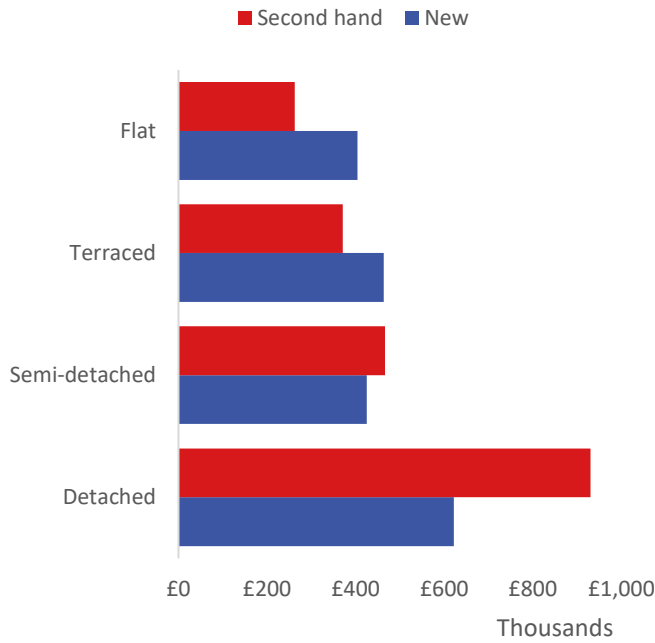

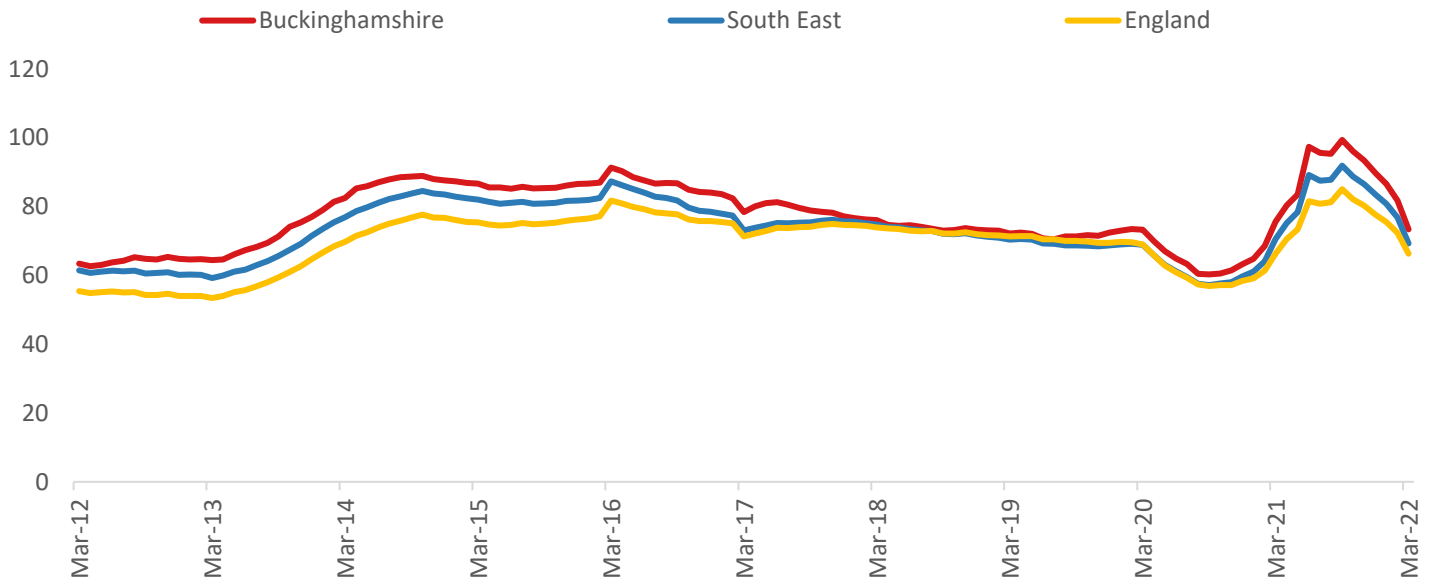

### Transactions (March 2022 data)

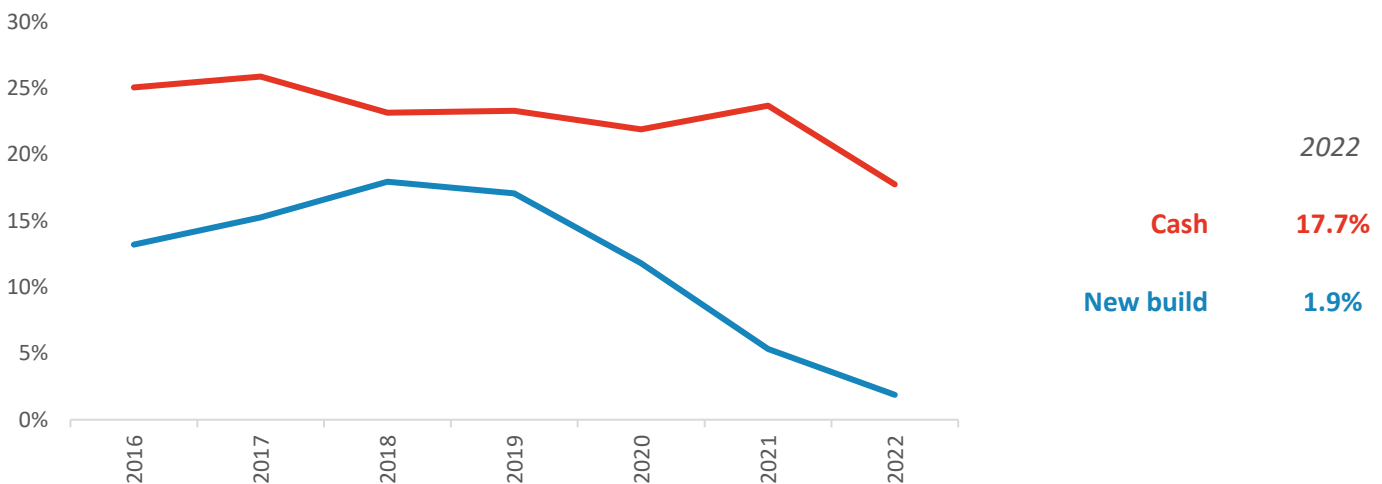
Annual Transactions, Indexed (2001-05 average = 100)



There were 8,215 transactions in Buckinghamshire during the 12 months to March 2022. This is 73% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is below pre-downturn levels.

Transactions in Buckinghamshire have fallen by 16.2% since 2014, compared to changes of -17.1% for South East and -13.6% for England.

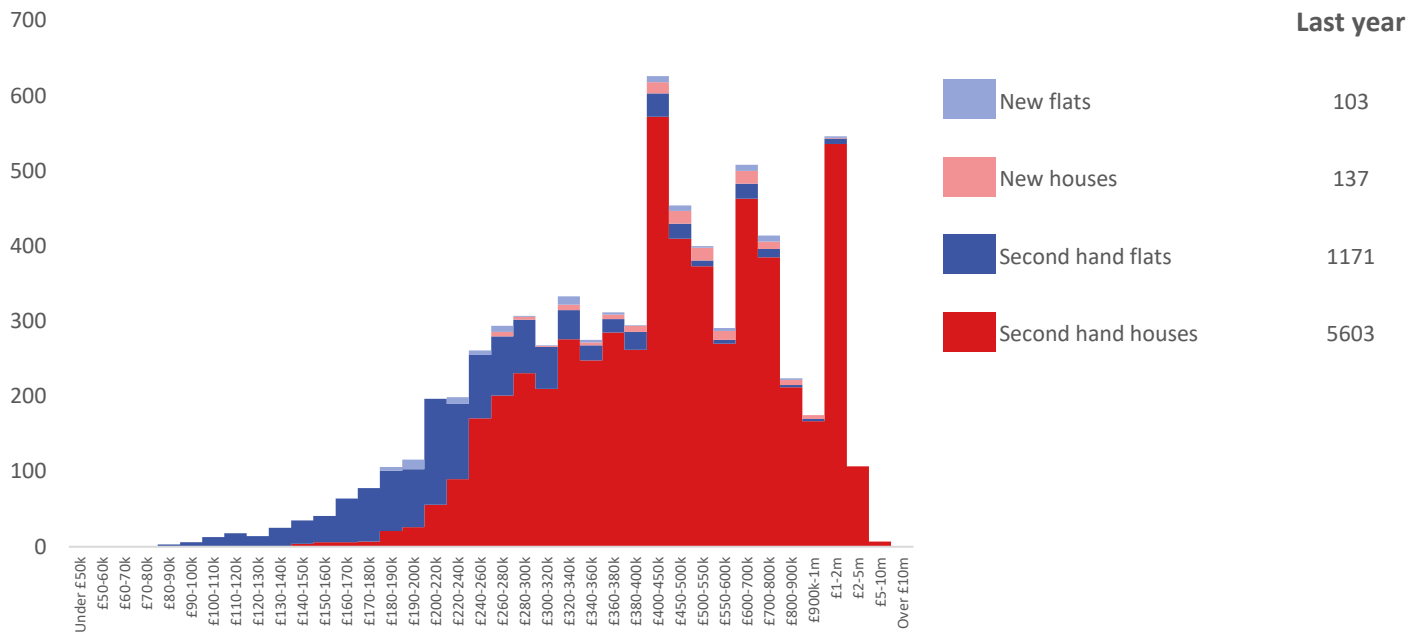
### Cash and New Build Sales as % of Total, by Year

## Depth of Market by Property Type

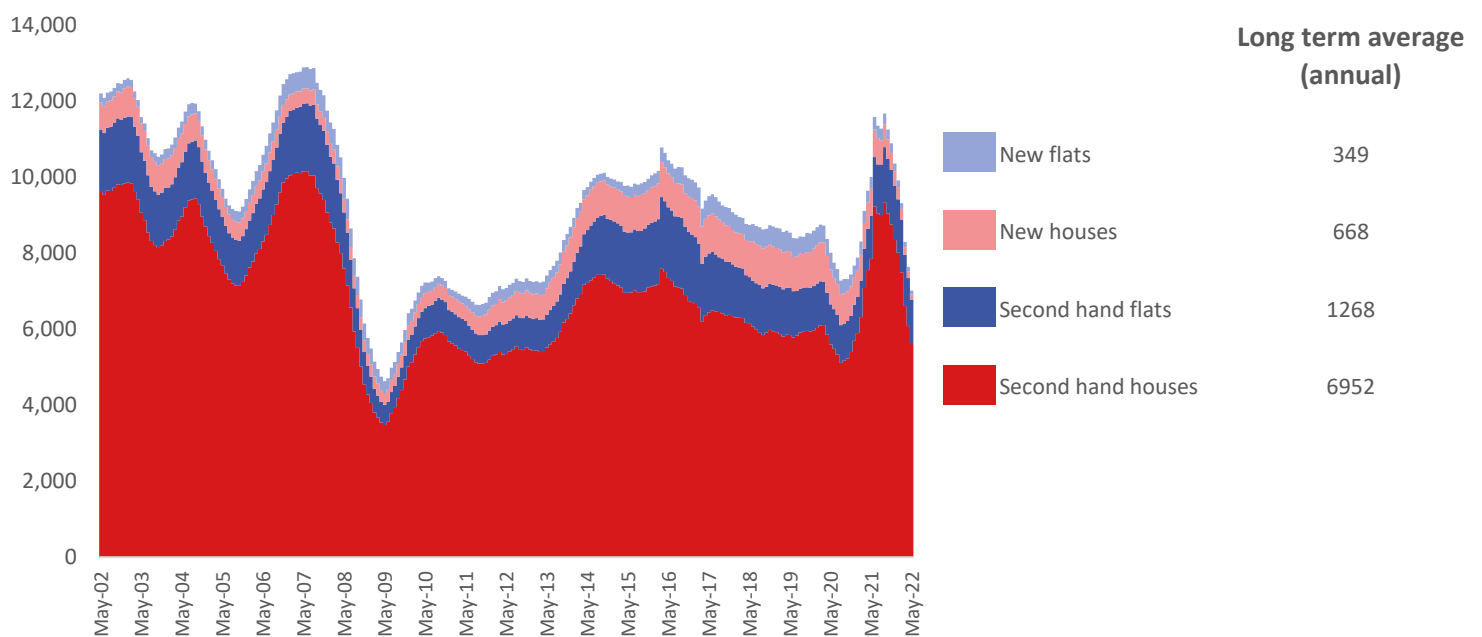
12 months to May 2022



The most common property type transacted over the past 12 months in Buckinghamshire was 'second hand houses' with 5,603 sales, 80% of all sales over the same period. The annual total of 7,014 transactions is equivalent to 76% of the long term average level of activity.

## Timeline of Transactions by Type

Rolling 12 months, past 20 years



The most common property type transacted over the past 20 years was 'second hand houses' with the equivalent of 6,952 sales per year on average, making up 75% of the typical annual total over that period.
