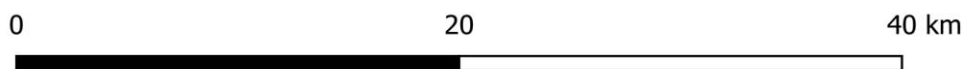
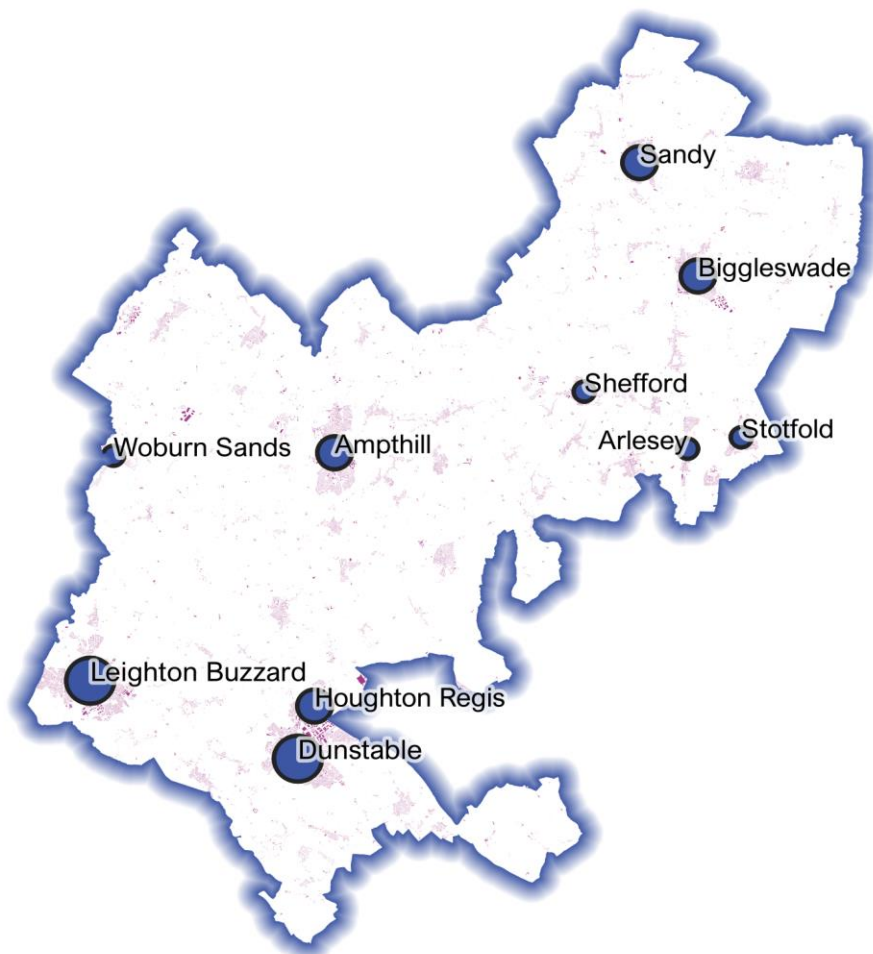

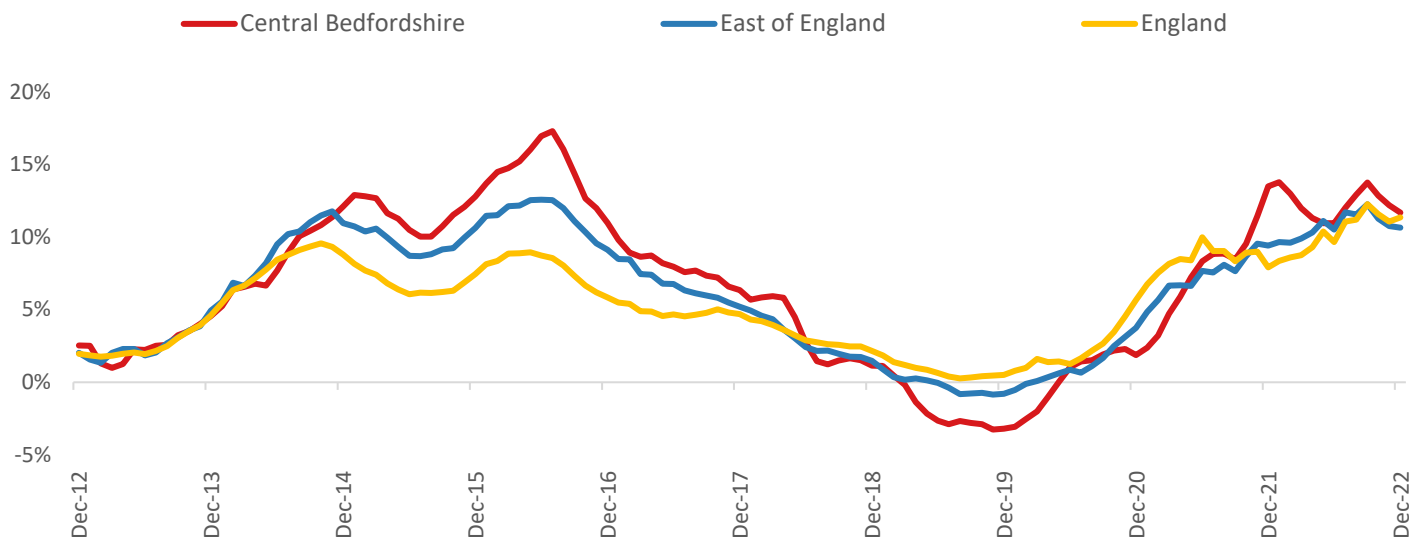

### House Price Growth (December 2022 data)

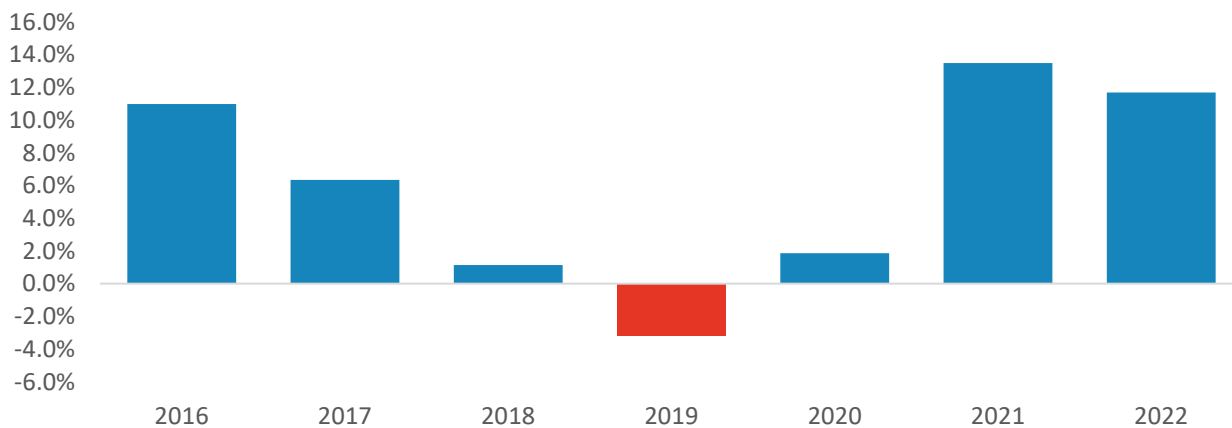
#### Annual Change in House Prices



House prices in Central Bedfordshire grew by 11.7% in the 12 months to December 2022 (based on 3-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 11.3% and prices in the East of England grew by 10.6% over the same period.

Central Bedfordshire house prices are now 78.2% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +74.4% for the East of England and +62.2% across England.

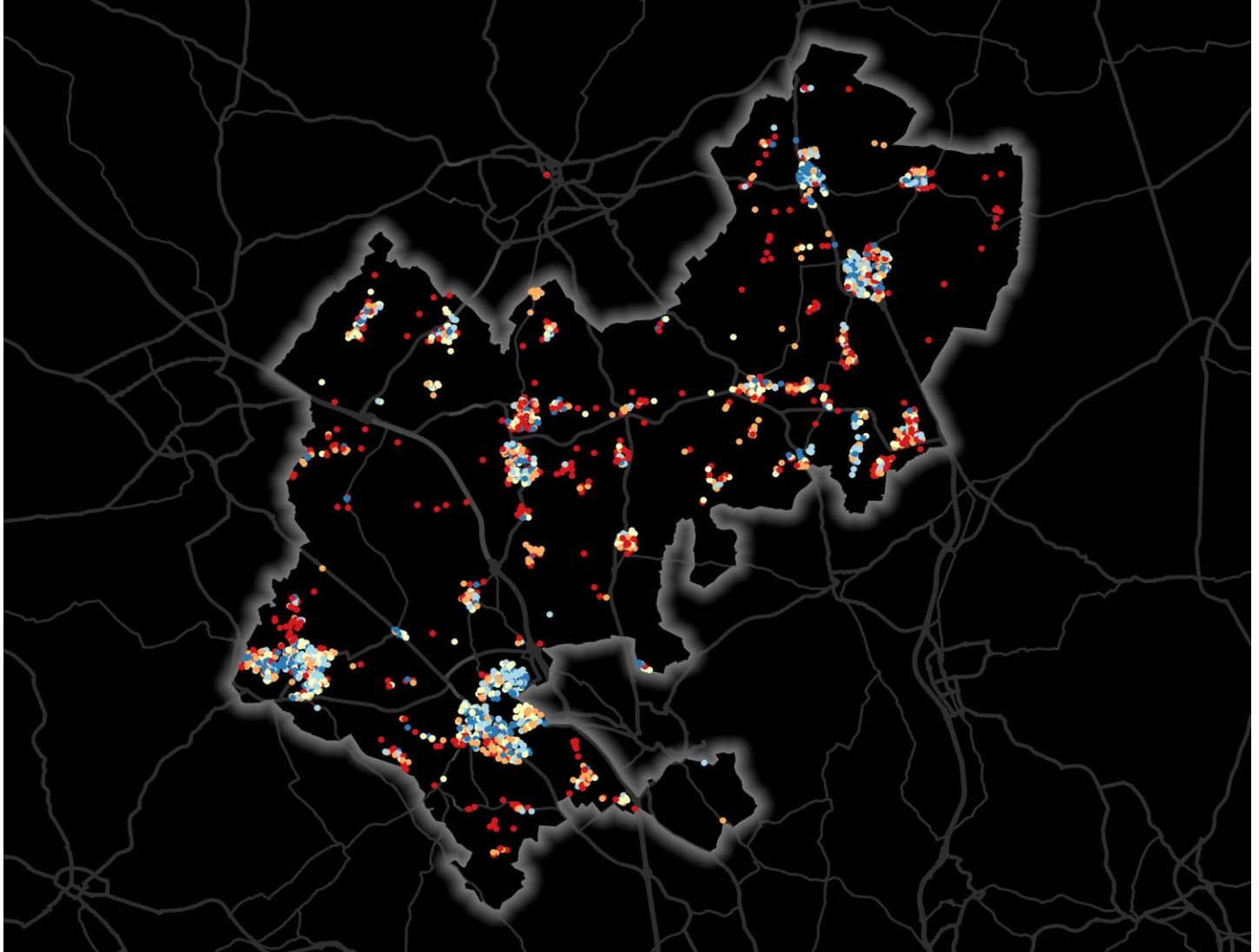
#### Year-To-Date Change in House Prices, December to December



Local prices have grown by 11.7% in 2022 so far, compared to growth of 13.5% over the same period last year.

12 months to December 2022



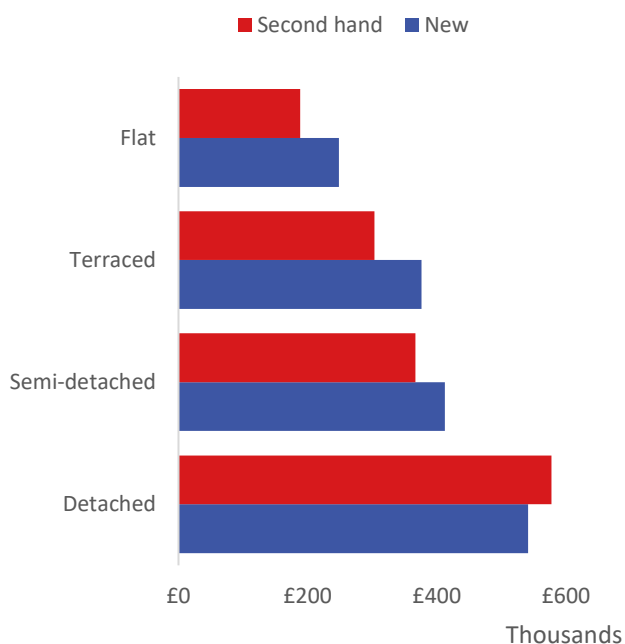
Each point is one postcode, coloured by the average value relative to all sales in this local authority (price bands are LA-specific quintiles).

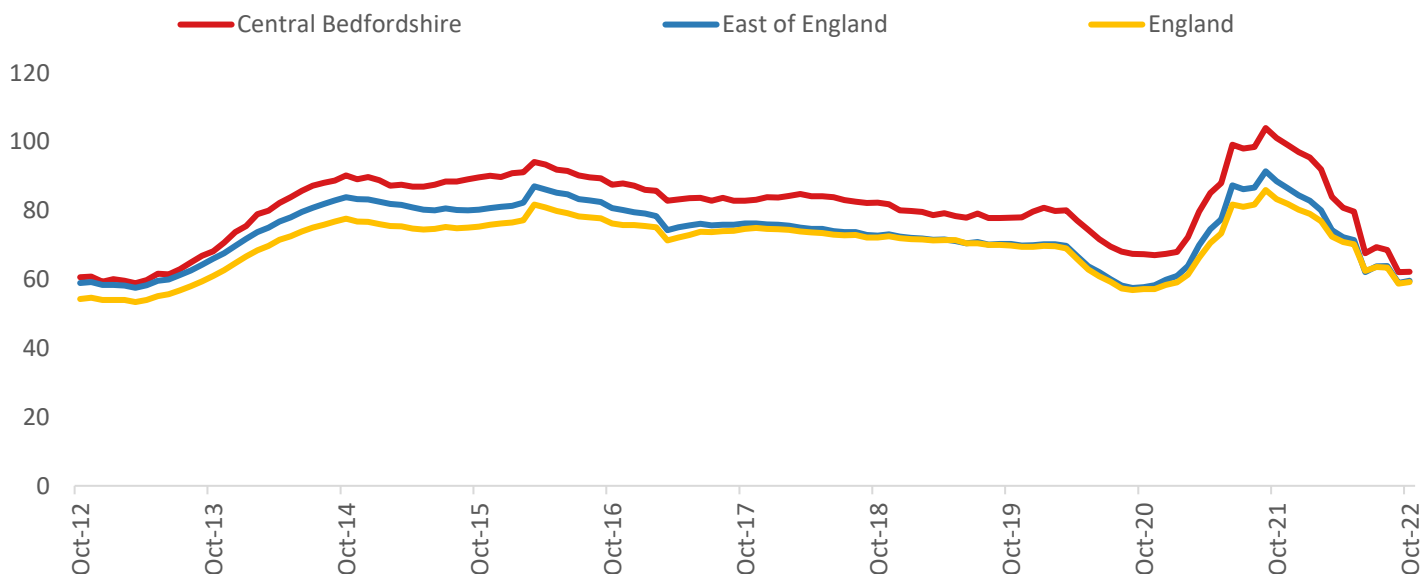

### Transactions (October 2022 data)

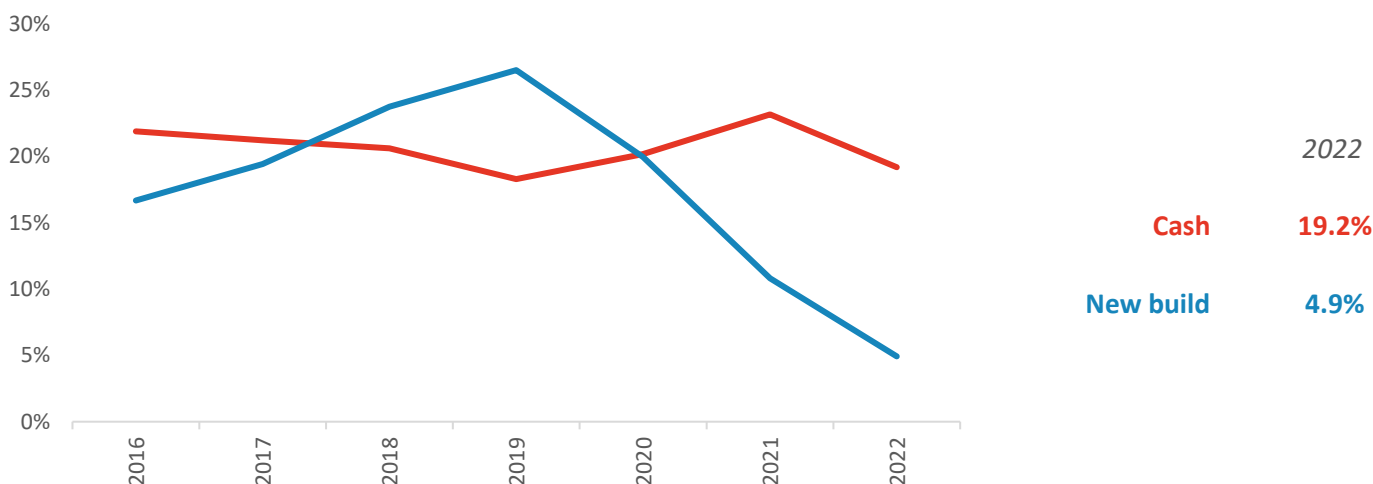
Annual Transactions, Indexed (2001-05 average = 100)



There were 4,116 transactions in Central Bedfordshire during the 12 months to October 2022. This is 62% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is significantly below pre-downturn levels.

Transactions in Central Bedfordshire have fallen by 30.7% since 2014, compared to changes of -28.4% for East of England and -22.8% for England.

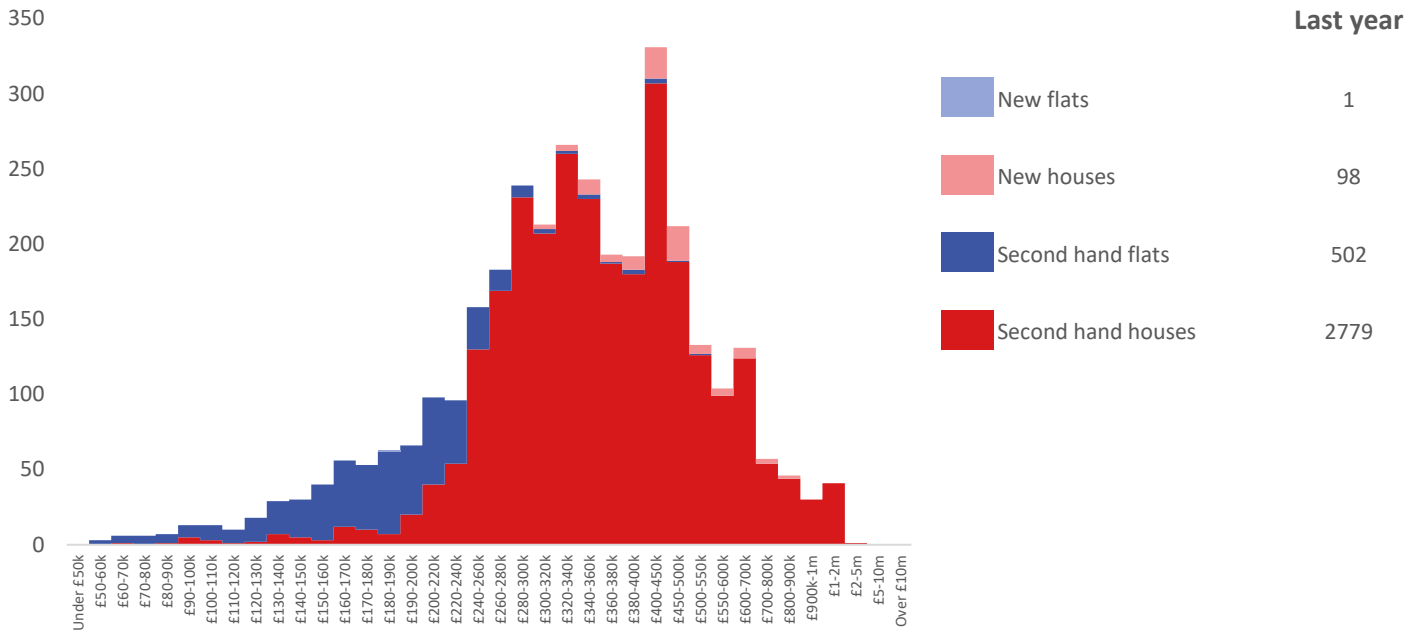
### Cash and New Build Sales as % of Total, by Year

## Depth of Market by Property Type

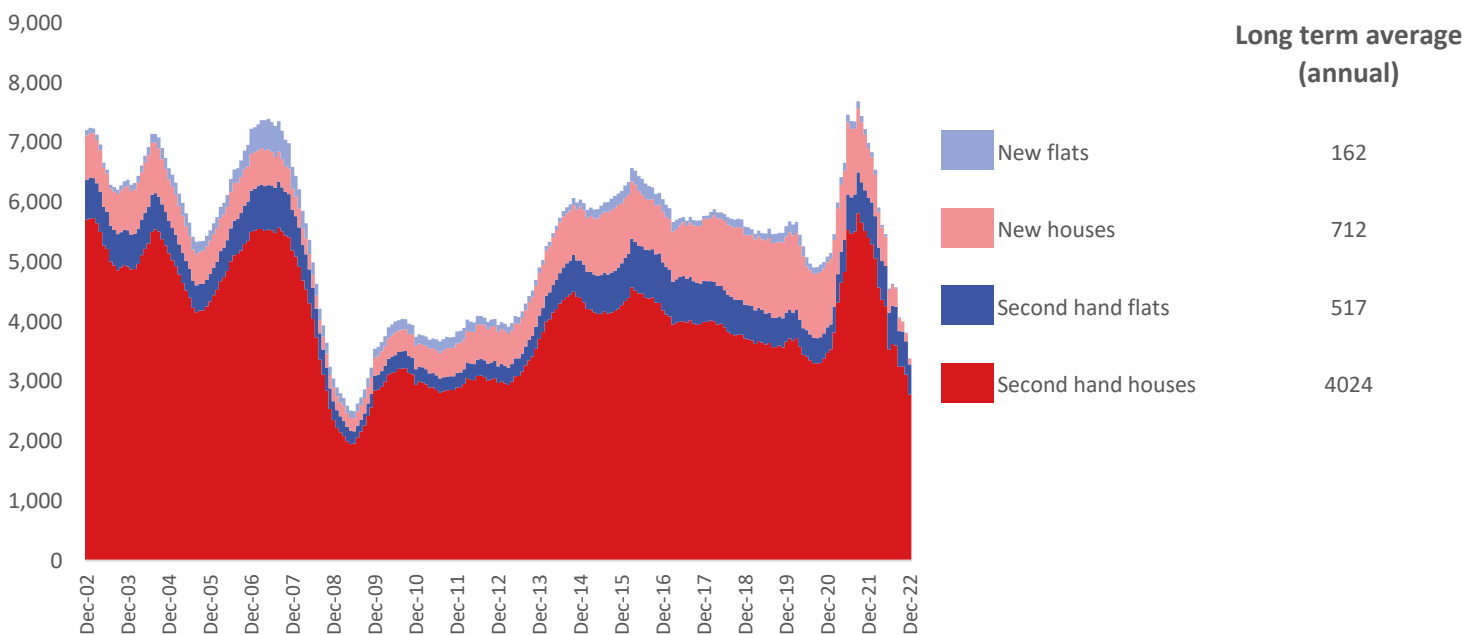
12 months to December 2022



The most common property type transacted over the past 12 months in Central Bedfordshire was 'second hand houses' with 2,779 sales, 82% of all sales over the same period. The annual total of 3,380 transactions is equivalent to 62% of the long term average level of activity.

## Timeline of Transactions by Type

Rolling 12 months, past 20 years



The most common property type transacted over the past 20 years was 'second hand houses' with the equivalent of 4,024 sales per year on average, making up 74% of the typical annual total over that period.
