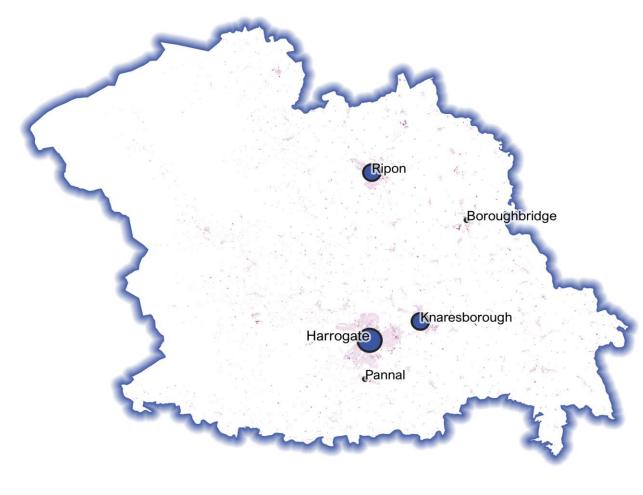

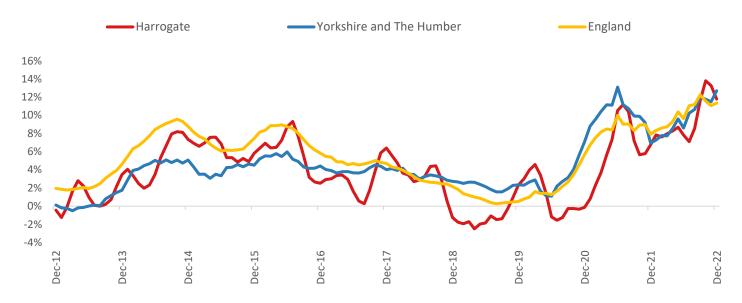

# **House Price Growth (December 2022 data)**

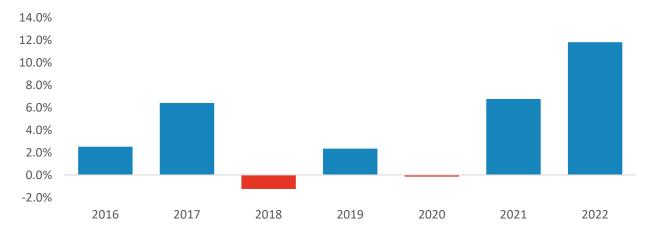
#### **Annual Change in House Prices**



House prices in Harrogate grew by 11.8% in the 12 months to December 2022 (based on 3-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 11.3% and prices in Yorkshire and The Humber grew by 12.7% over the same period.

Harrogate house prices are now 42.3% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +42.6% for Yorkshire and The Humber and +62.2% across England.

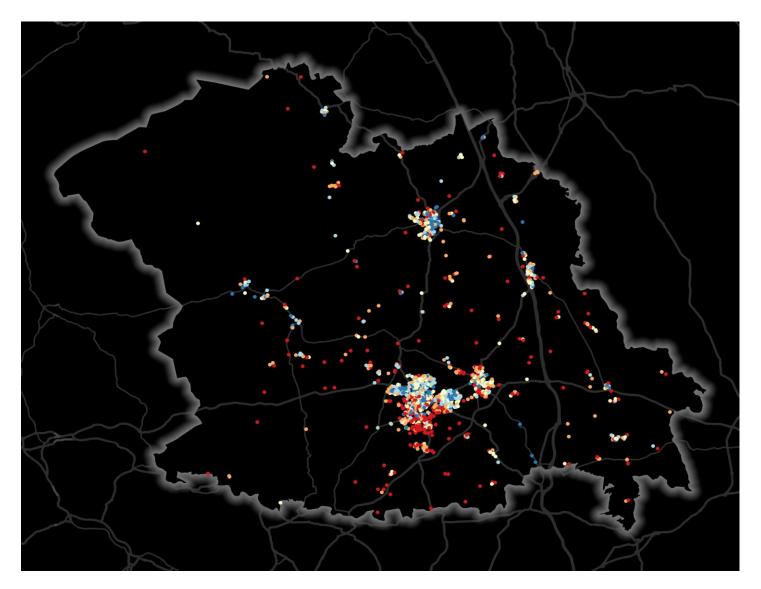
Year-To-Date Change in House Prices, December to December



Local prices have grown by 11.8% in 2022 so far, compared to growth of 6.7% over the same period last year.

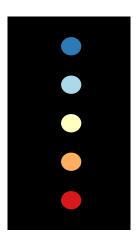
# **House Price Map**

Each point is one postcode, coloured by the average value relative to all sales in this local authority (price bands are LA-specific quintiles).

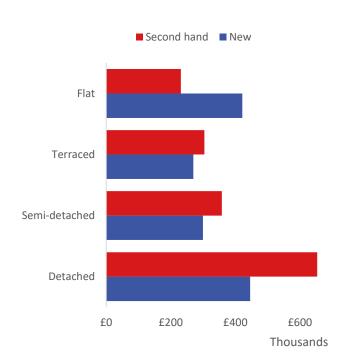

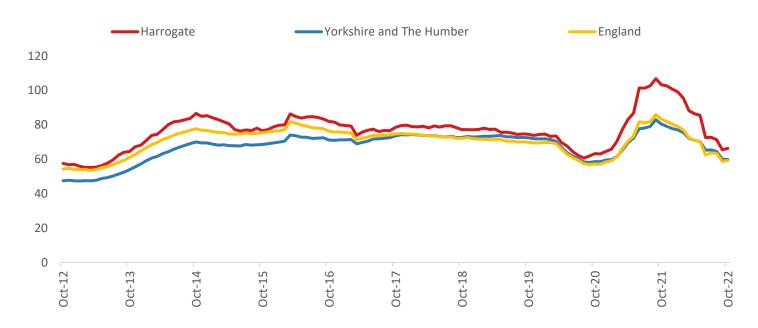

# **Transactions (October 2022 data)**

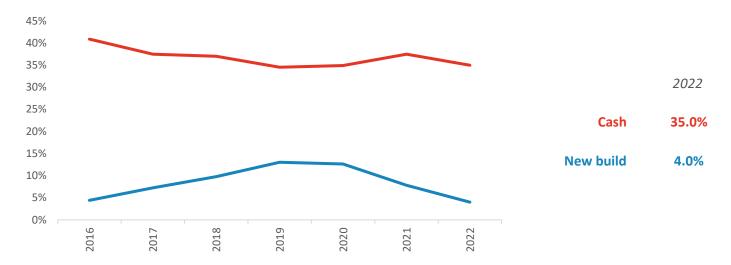
#### Annual Transactions, Indexed (2001-05 average = 100)



There were 2,464 transactions in Harrogate during the 12 months to October 2022. This is 66% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is significantly below pre-downturn levels.

Transactions in Harrogate have fallen by 22.3% since 2014, compared to changes of -13.8% for Yorkshire and The Humber and -22.8% for England.

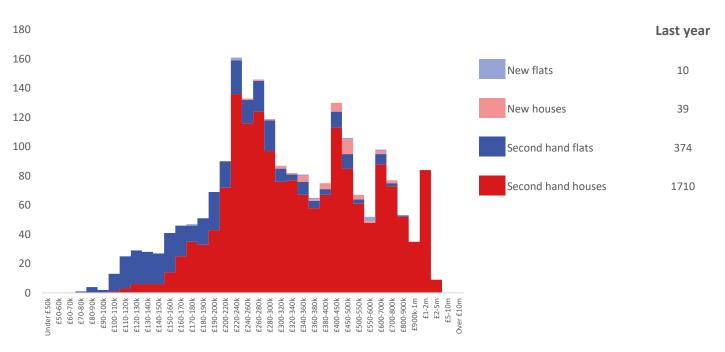
#### Cash and New Build Sales as % of Total, by Year

# **Depth of Market by Property Type**

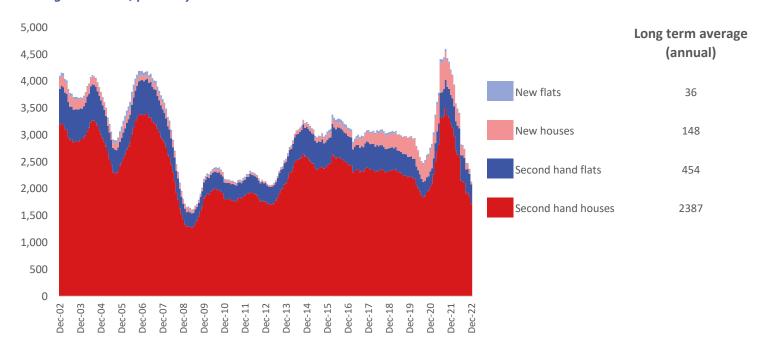
#### 12 months to December 2022



The most common property type transacted over the past 12 months in Harrogate was 'second hand houses' with 1,710 sales, 80% of all sales over the same period. The annual total of 2,133 transactions is equivalent to 71% of the long term average level of activity.

# Rolling 12 months, past 20 years



The most common property type transacted over the past 20 years was 'second hand houses' with the equivalent of 2,387 sales per year on average, making up 79% of the typical annual total over that period.
