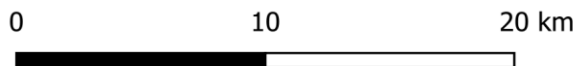
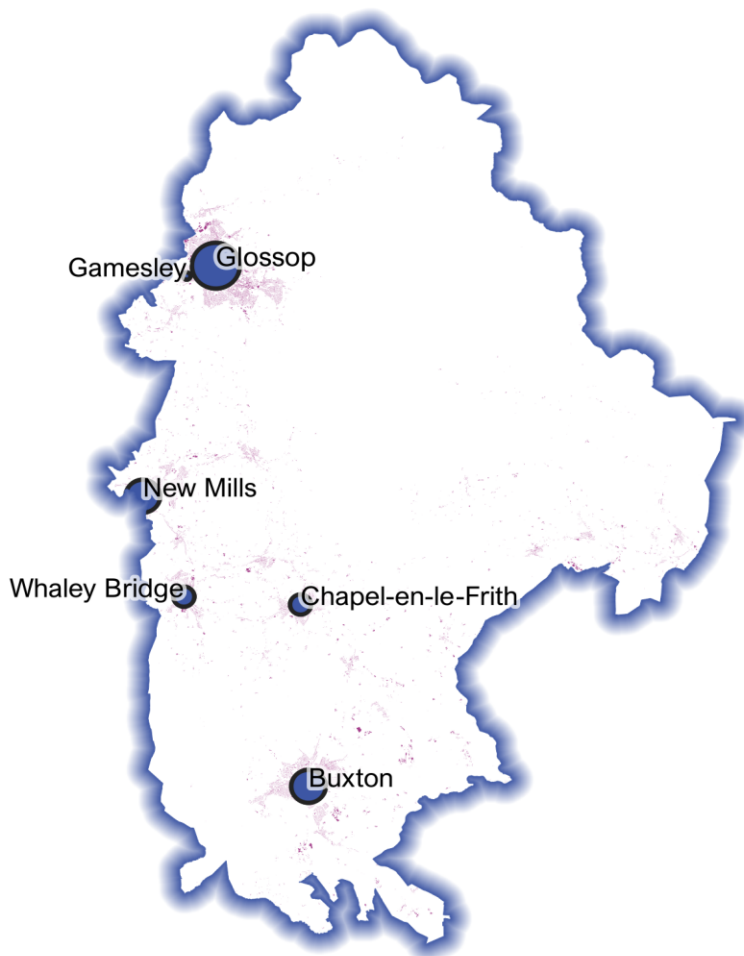

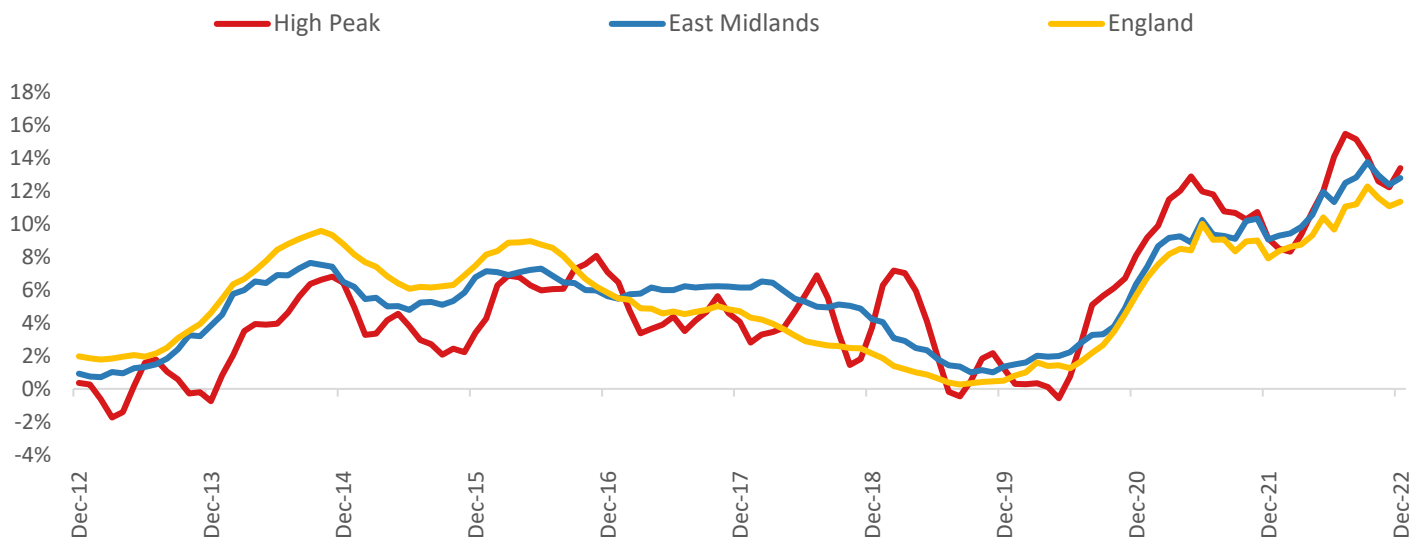

House Price Growth (December 2022 data)

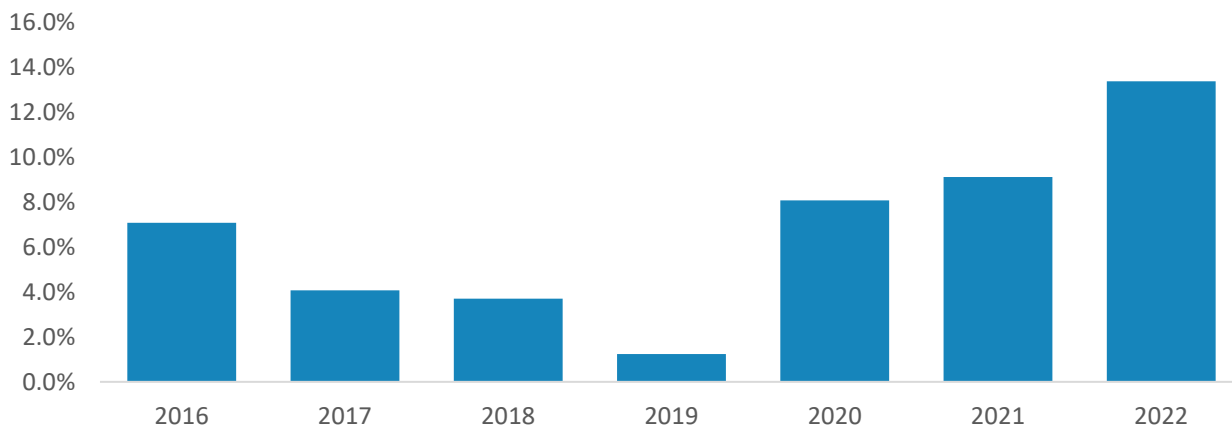
Annual Change in House Prices



House prices in High Peak grew by 13.4% in the 12 months to December 2022 (based on 3-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 11.3% and prices in the East Midlands grew by 12.8% over the same period.

High Peak house prices are now 51.6% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +60.9% for the East Midlands and +62.2% across England.

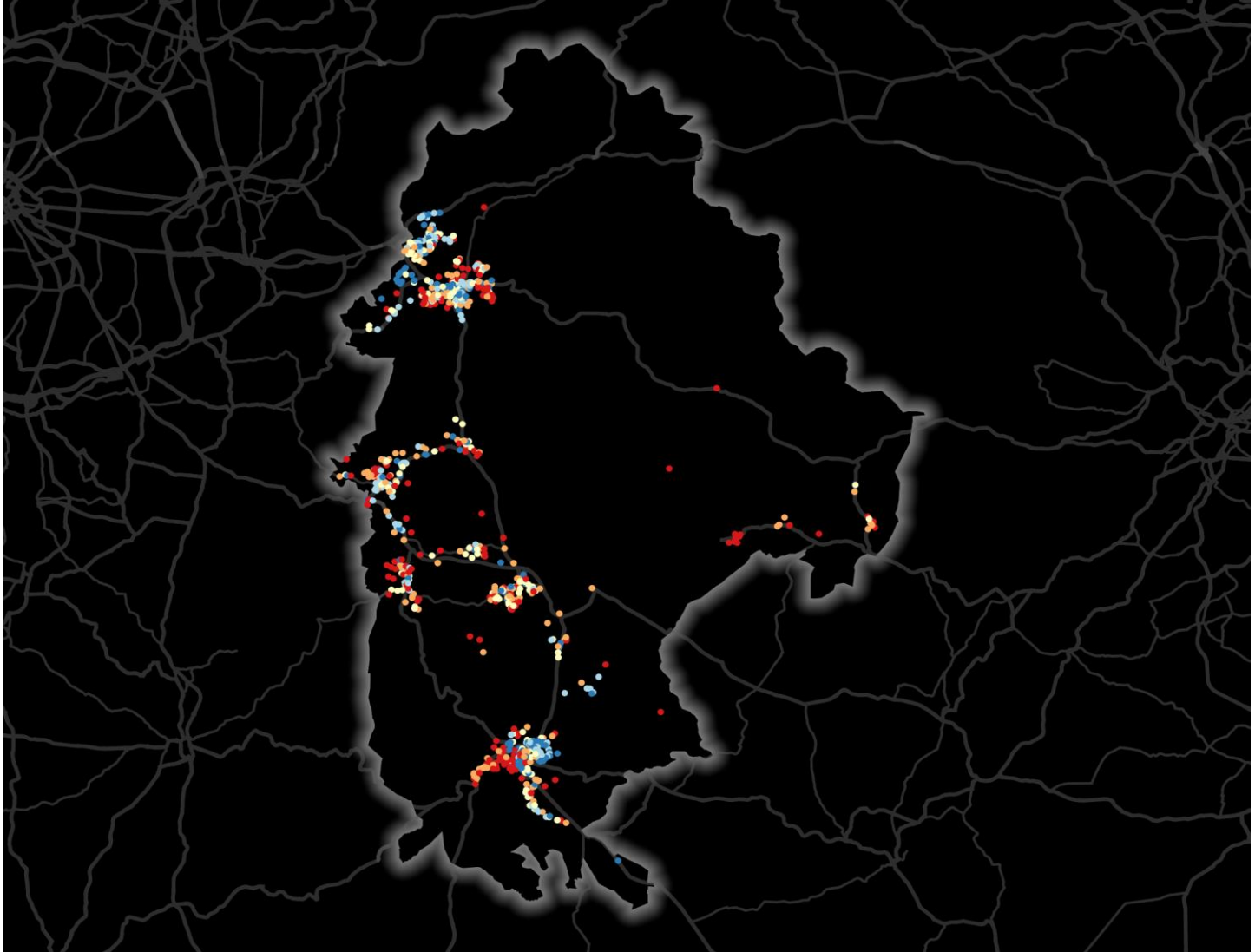
Year-To-Date Change in House Prices, December to December



Local prices have grown by 13.4% in 2022 so far, compared to growth of 9.1% over the same period last year.

Each point is one postcode, coloured by the average value relative to all sales in this local authority (price bands are LA-specific quintiles).

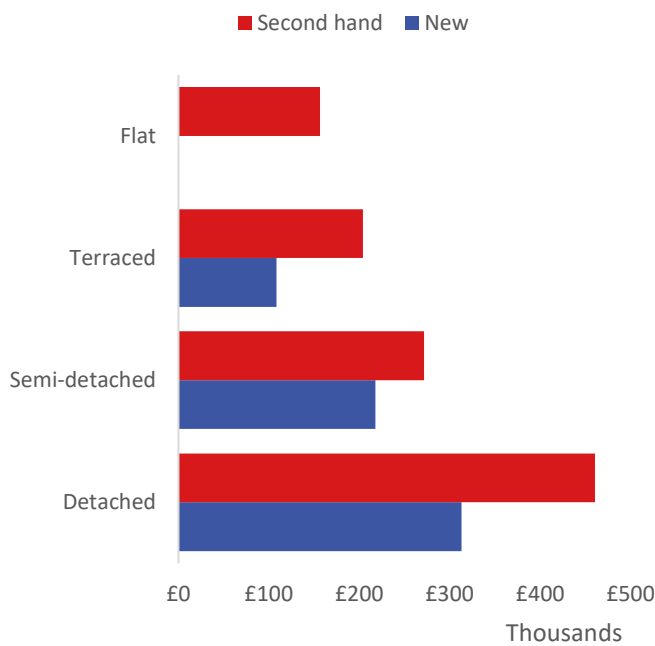

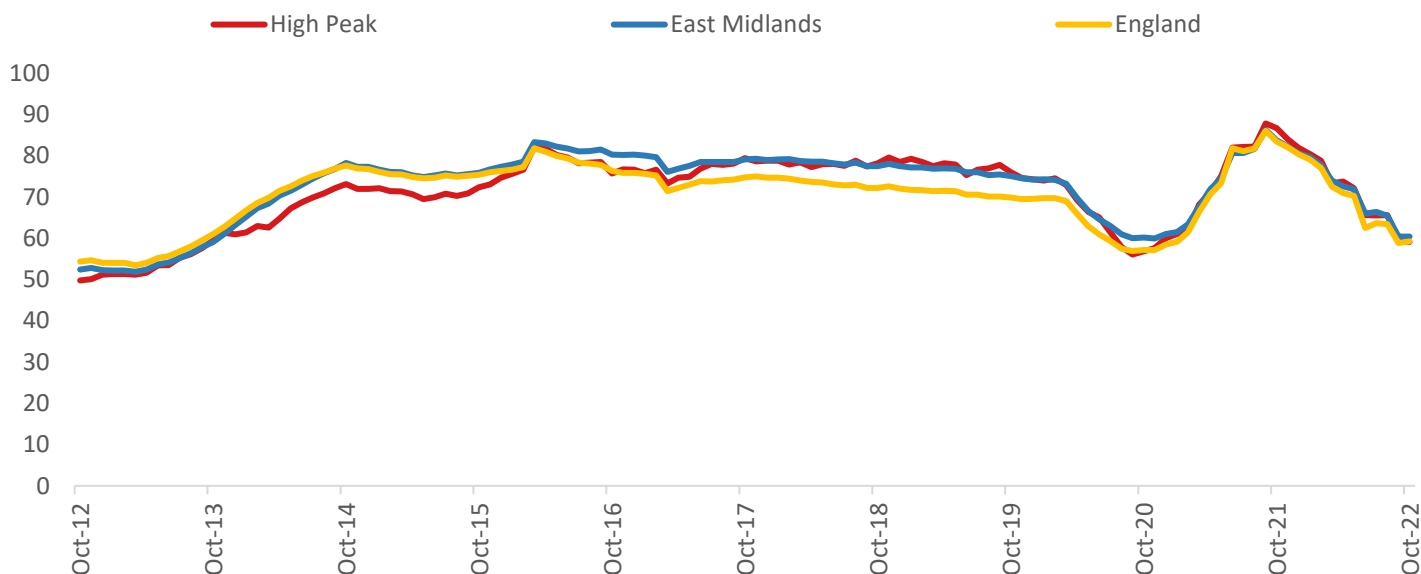

Transactions (October 2022 data)

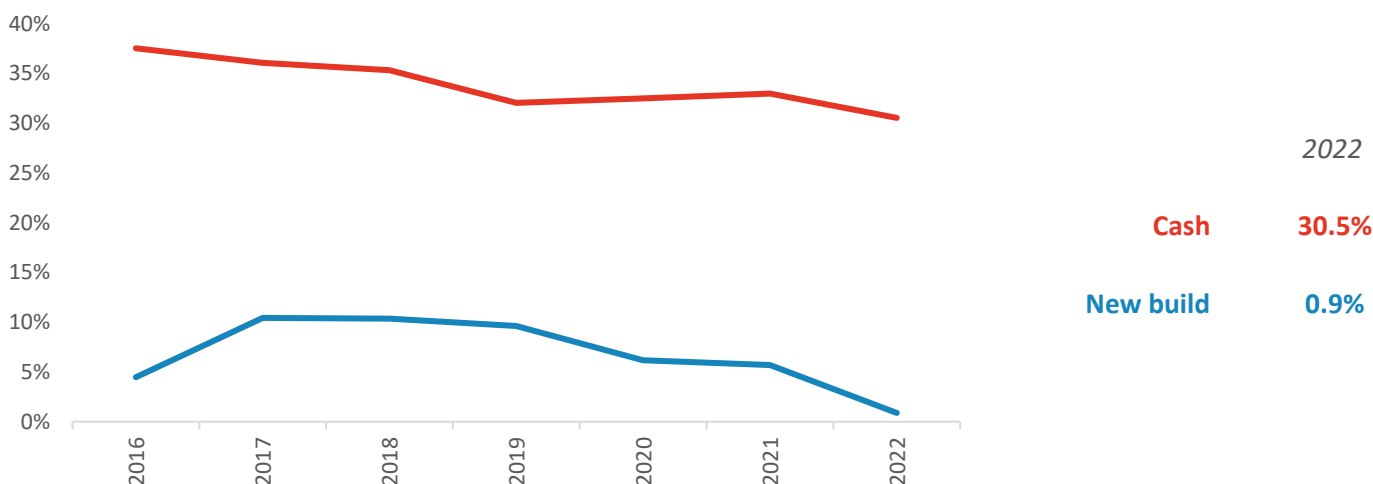
Annual Transactions, Indexed (2001-05 average = 100)



There were 1,259 transactions in High Peak during the 12 months to October 2022. This is 59% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is significantly below pre-downturn levels.

Transactions in High Peak have fallen by 17.8% since 2014, compared to changes of -21.8% for East Midlands and -22.8% for England.

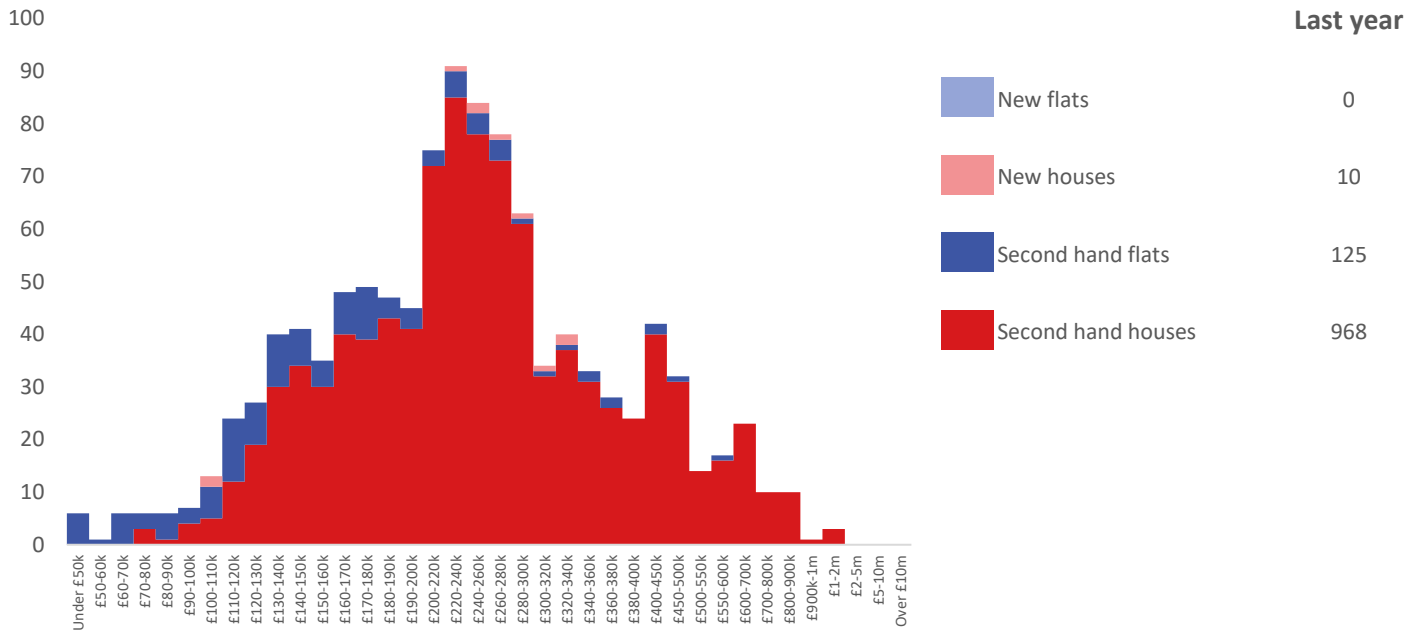
Cash and New Build Sales as % of Total, by Year

Depth of Market by Property Type

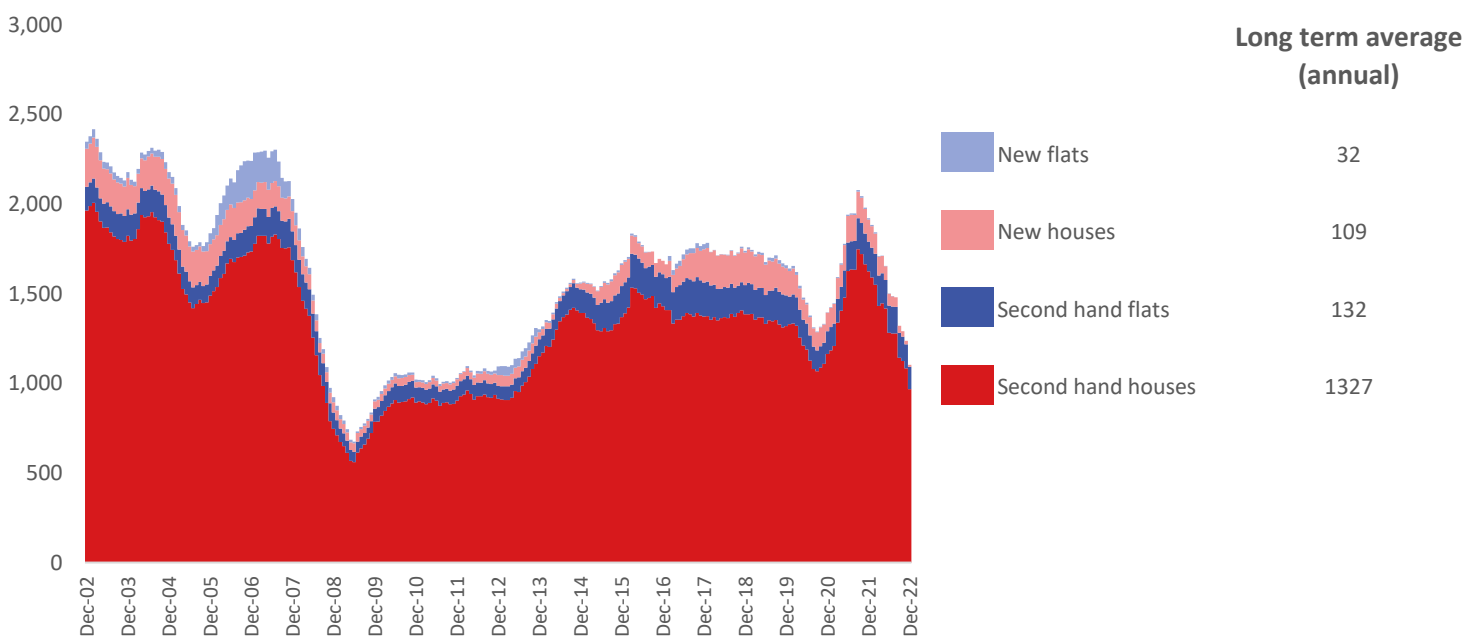
12 months to December 2022



The most common property type transacted over the past 12 months in High Peak was 'second hand houses' with 968 sales, 88% of all sales over the same period. The annual total of 1,103 transactions is equivalent to 69% of the long term average level of activity.

Timeline of Transactions by Type

Rolling 12 months, past 20 years



The most common property type transacted over the past 20 years was 'second hand houses' with the equivalent of 1,327 sales per year on average, making up 83% of the typical annual total over that period.
