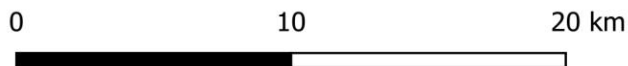
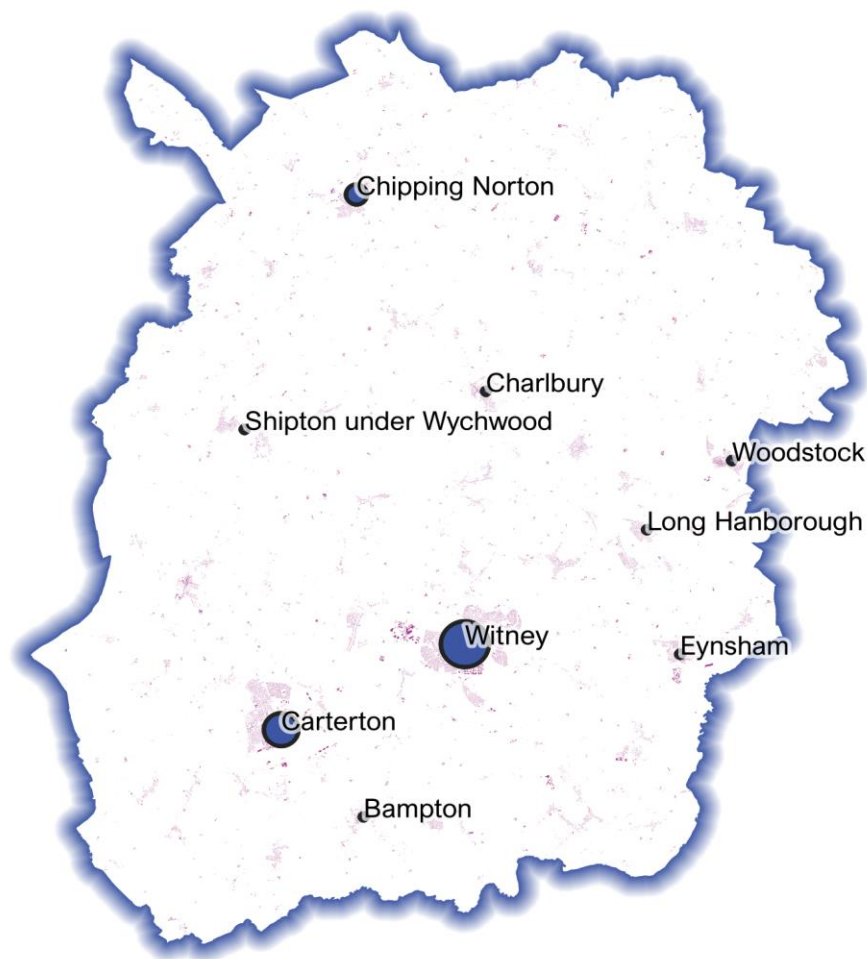

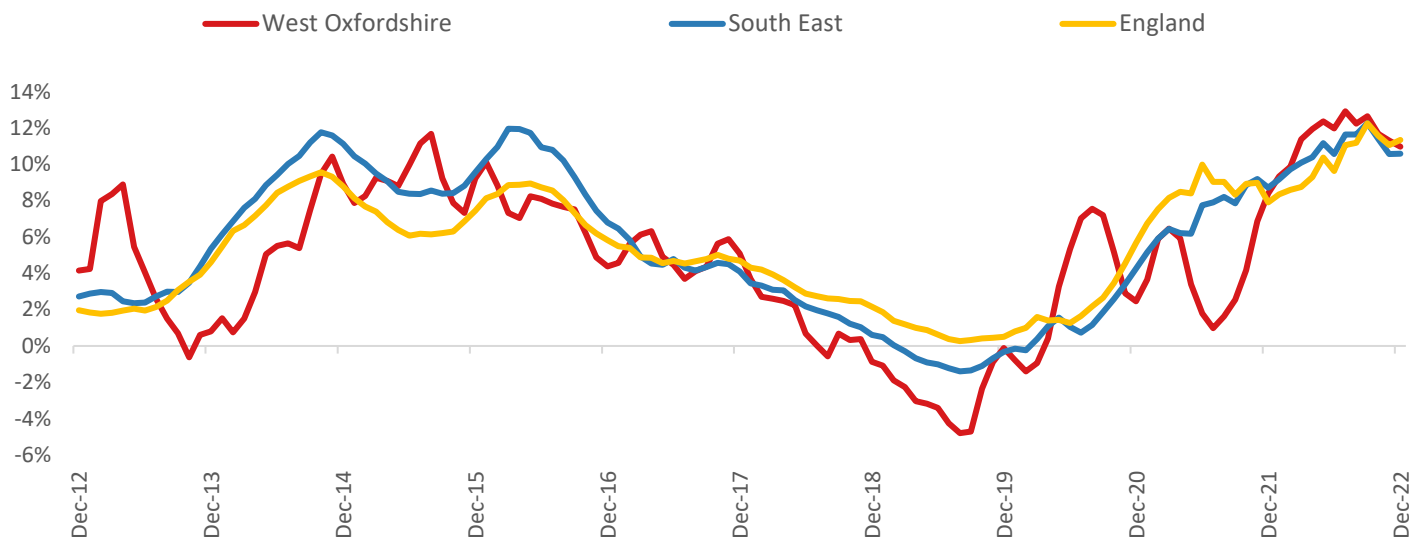

House Price Growth (December 2022 data)

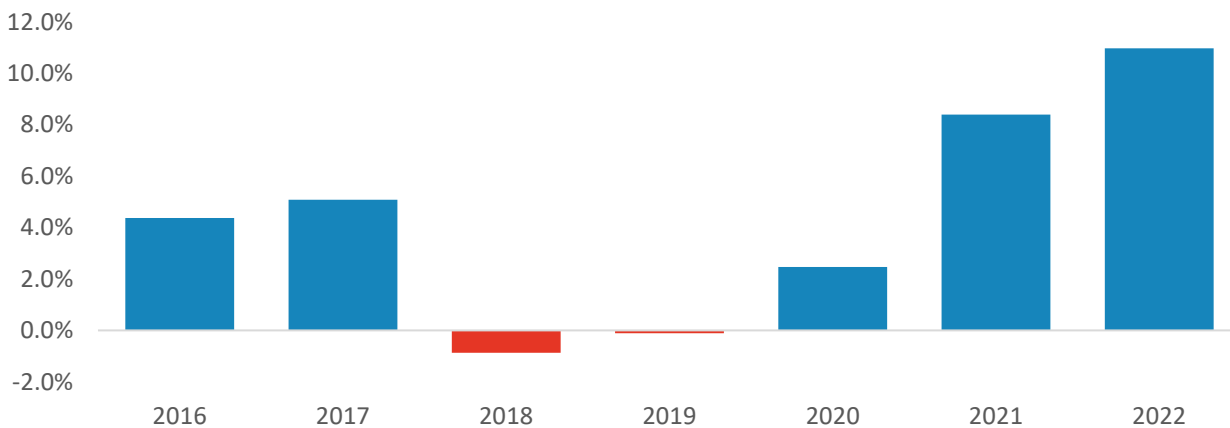
Annual Change in House Prices



House prices in West Oxfordshire grew by 11.0% in the 12 months to December 2022 (based on 3-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 11.3% and prices in the South East grew by 10.6% over the same period.

West Oxfordshire house prices are now 62.3% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +69.9% for the South East and +62.2% across England.

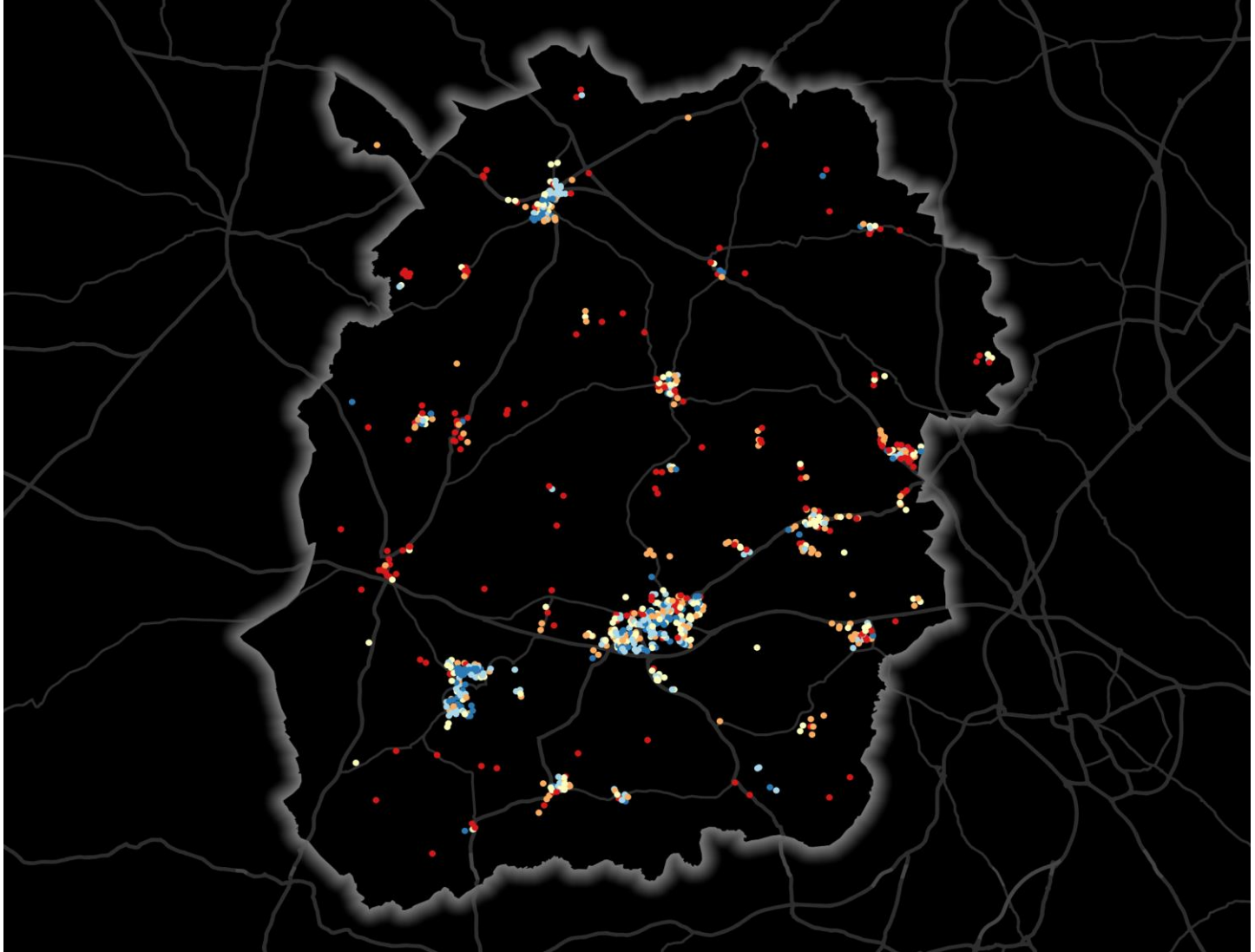
Year-To-Date Change in House Prices, December to December



Local prices have grown by 11.0% in 2022 so far, compared to growth of 8.4% over the same period last year.

Each point is one postcode, coloured by the average value relative to all sales in this local authority (price bands are LA-specific quintiles).

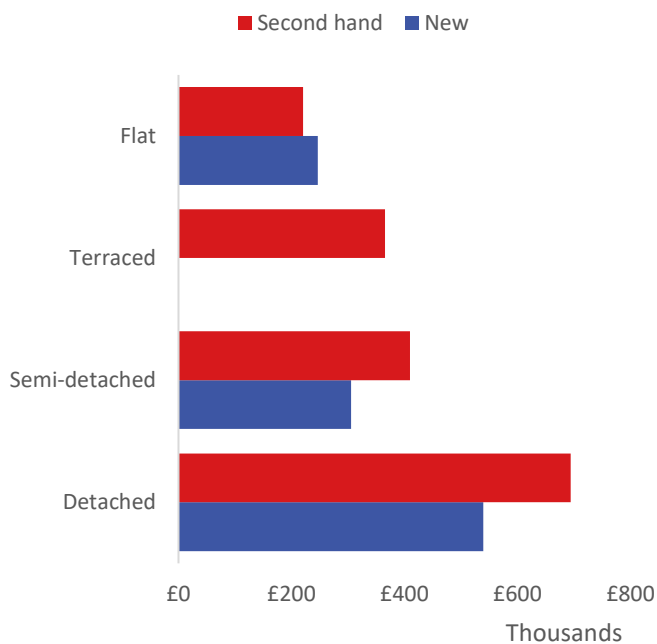

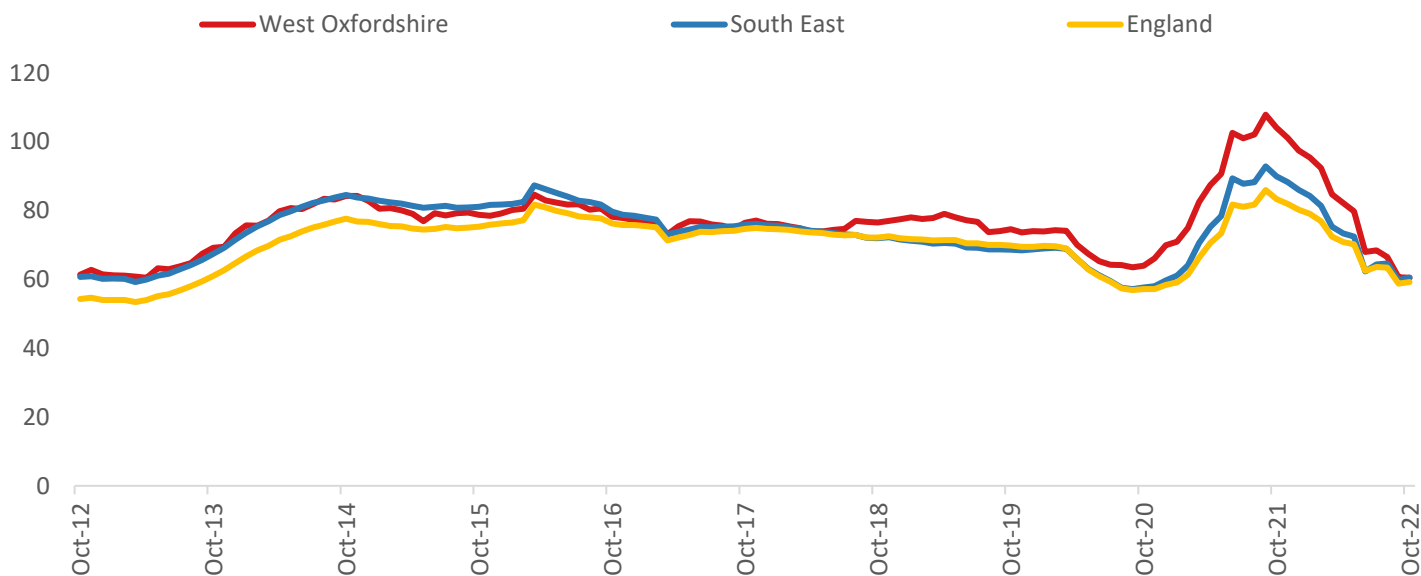

Transactions (October 2022 data)

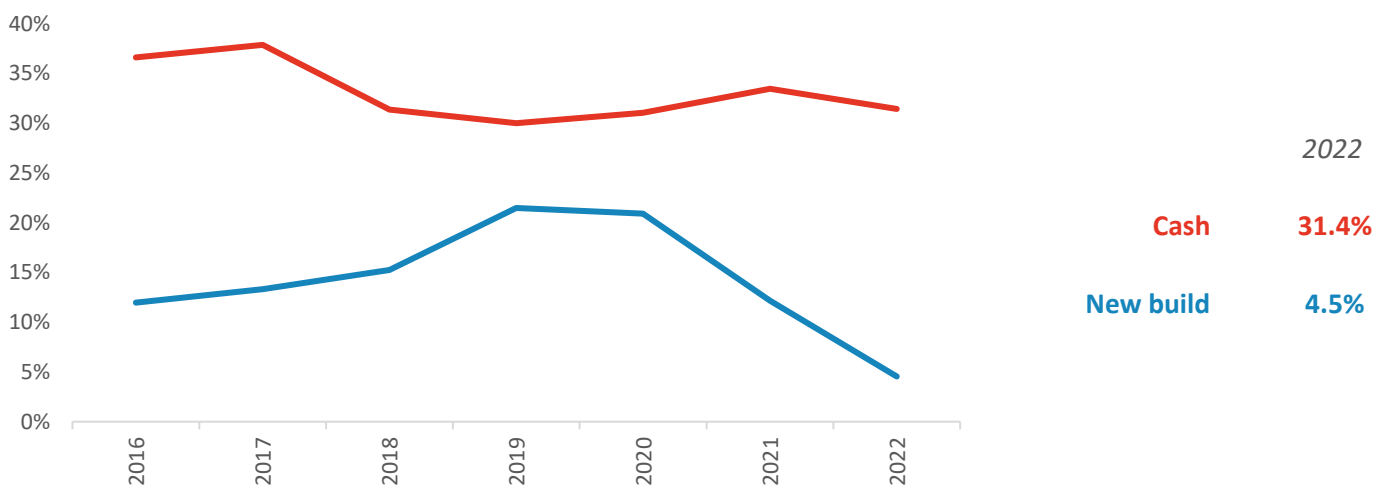
Annual Transactions, Indexed (2001-05 average = 100)



There were 1,419 transactions in West Oxfordshire during the 12 months to October 2022. This is 60% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is significantly below pre-downturn levels.

Transactions in West Oxfordshire have fallen by 27.0% since 2014, compared to changes of -27.5% for South East and -22.8% for England.

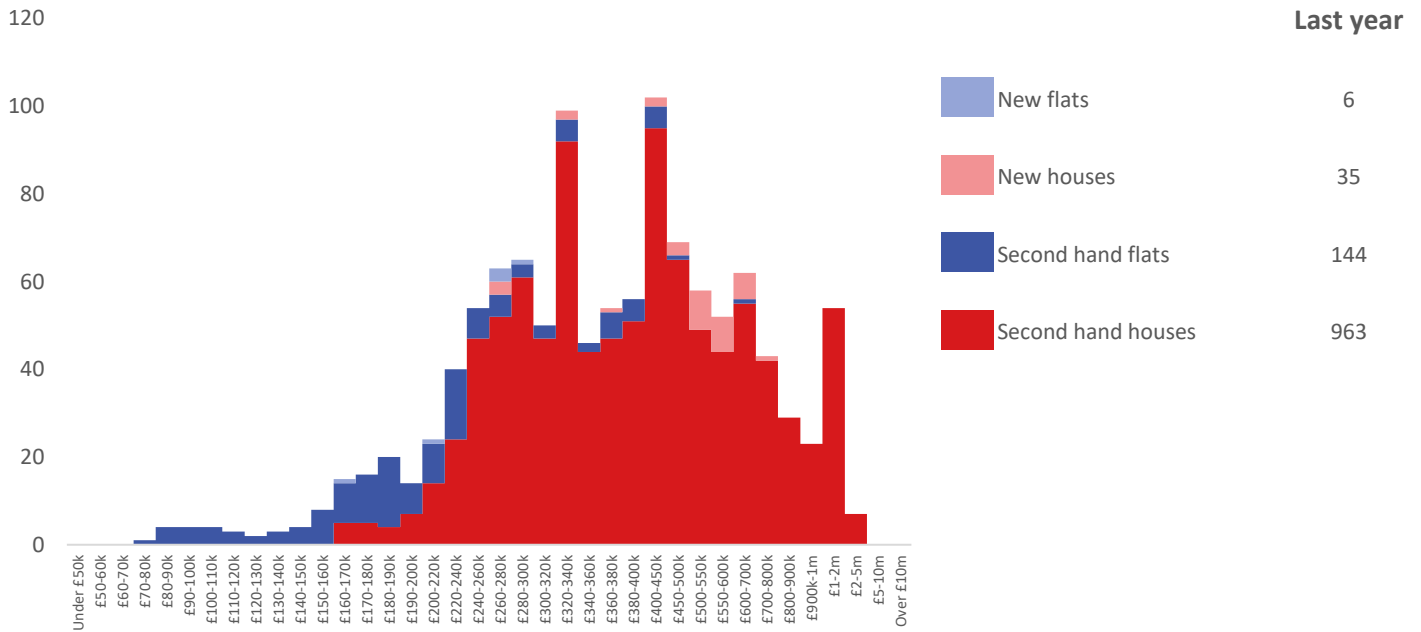
Cash and New Build Sales as % of Total, by Year

Depth of Market by Property Type

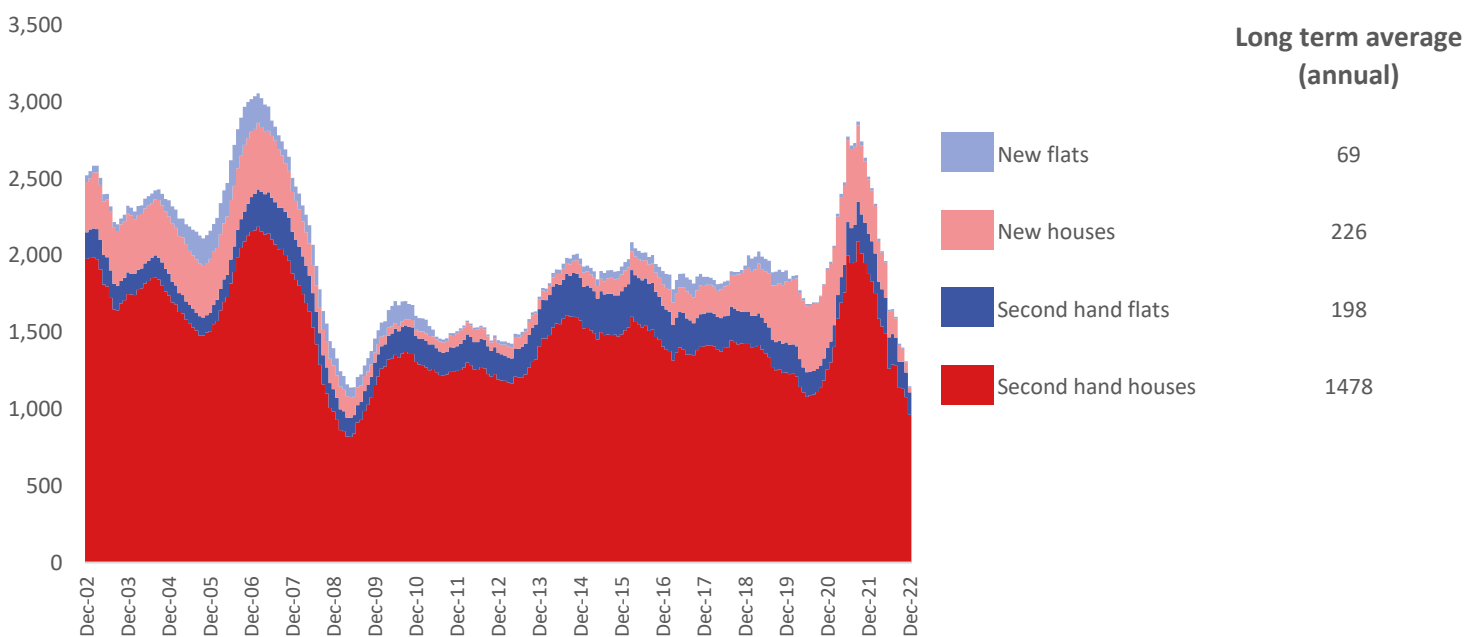
12 months to December 2022



The most common property type transacted over the past 12 months in West Oxfordshire was 'second hand houses' with 963 sales, 84% of all sales over the same period. The annual total of 1,148 transactions is equivalent to 58% of the long term average level of activity.

Timeline of Transactions by Type

Rolling 12 months, past 20 years



The most common property type transacted over the past 20 years was 'second hand houses' with the equivalent of 1,478 sales per year on average, making up 75% of the typical annual total over that period.
