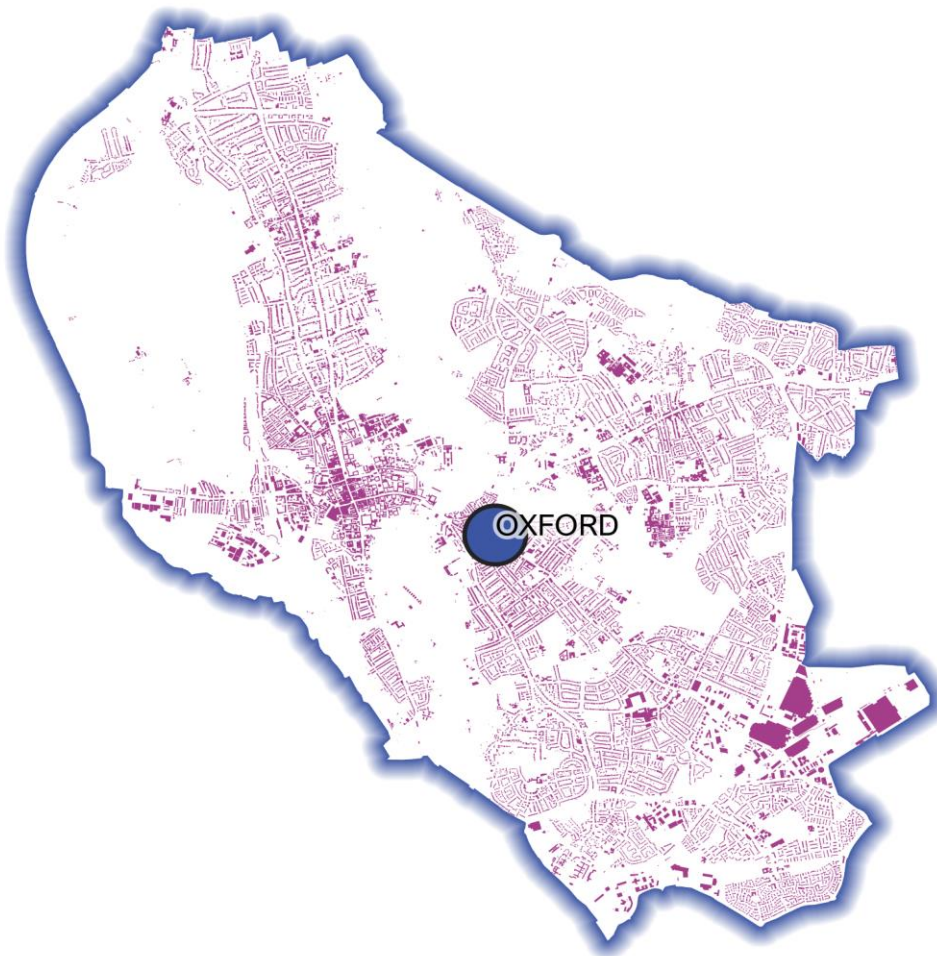

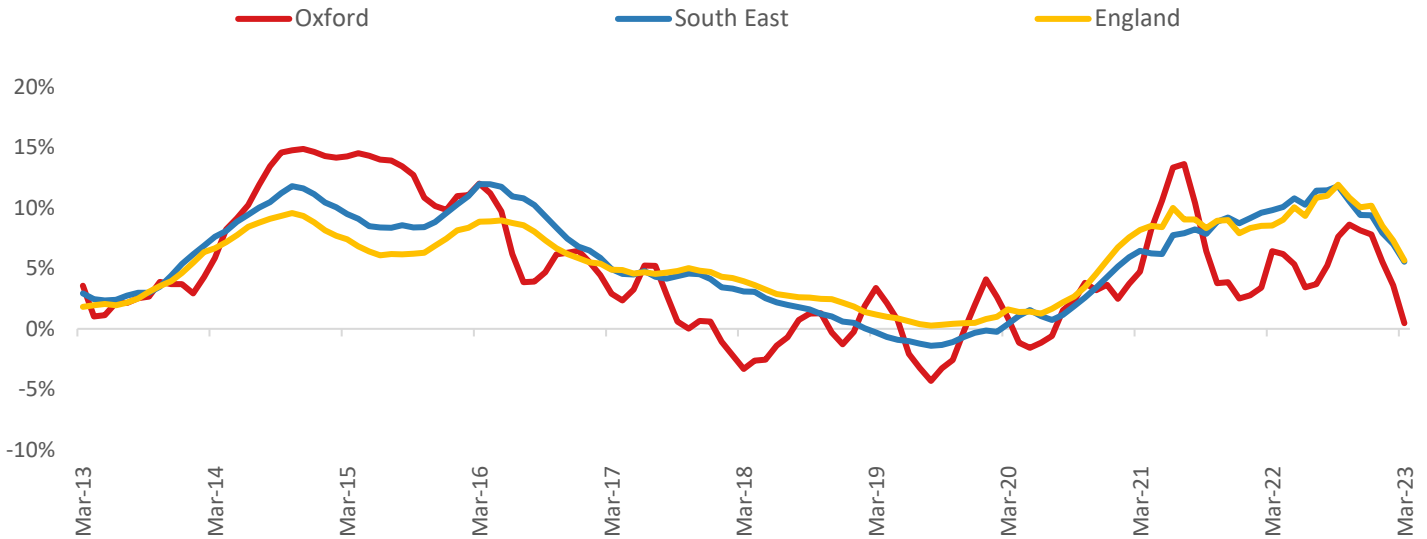

House Price Growth (March 2023 data)

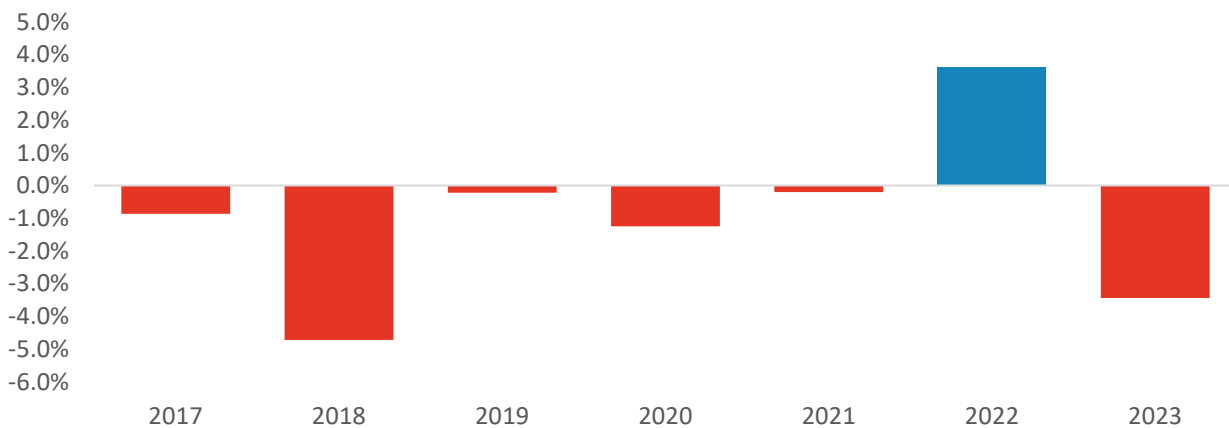
Annual Change in House Prices



House prices in Oxford grew by 0.5% in the 12 months to March 2023 (based on 3-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 5.6% and prices in the South East grew by 5.5% over the same period.

Oxford house prices are now 61.4% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +66.8% for the South East and +58.2% across England.

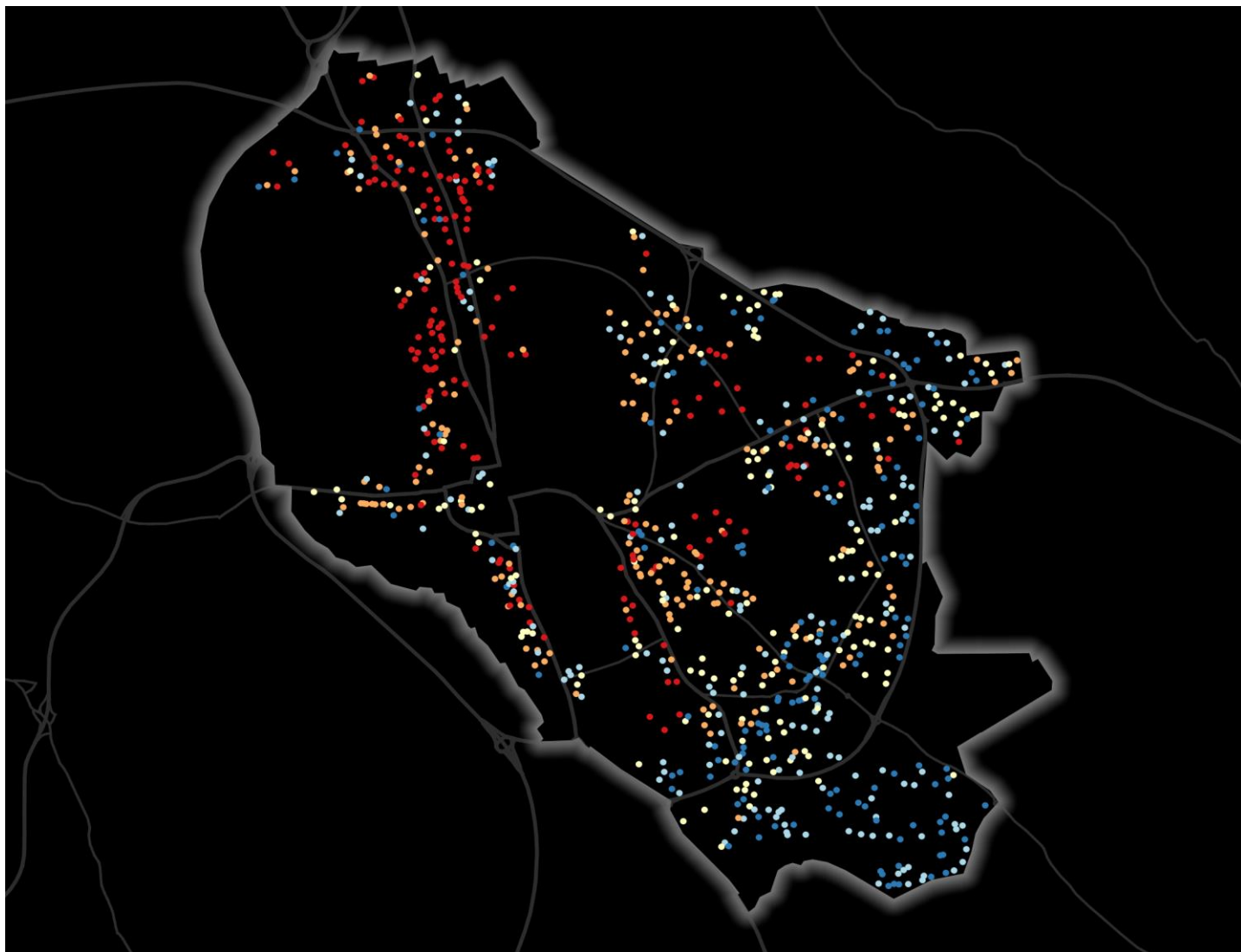
Year-To-Date Change in House Prices, December to March



Local prices have fallen by 3.4% in 2023 so far, compared to growth of 3.6% over the same period last year.

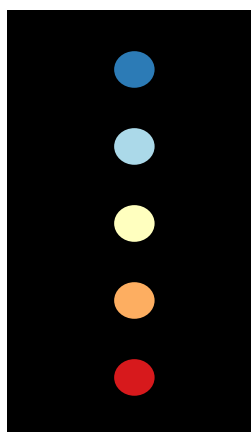
House Price Map

Each point is one postcode, coloured by the average value relative to all sales in this local authority (price bands are LA-specific quintiles).

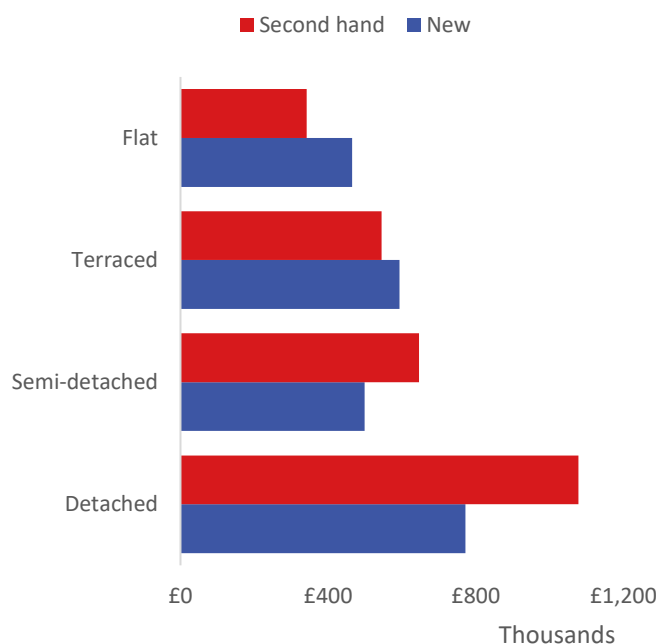

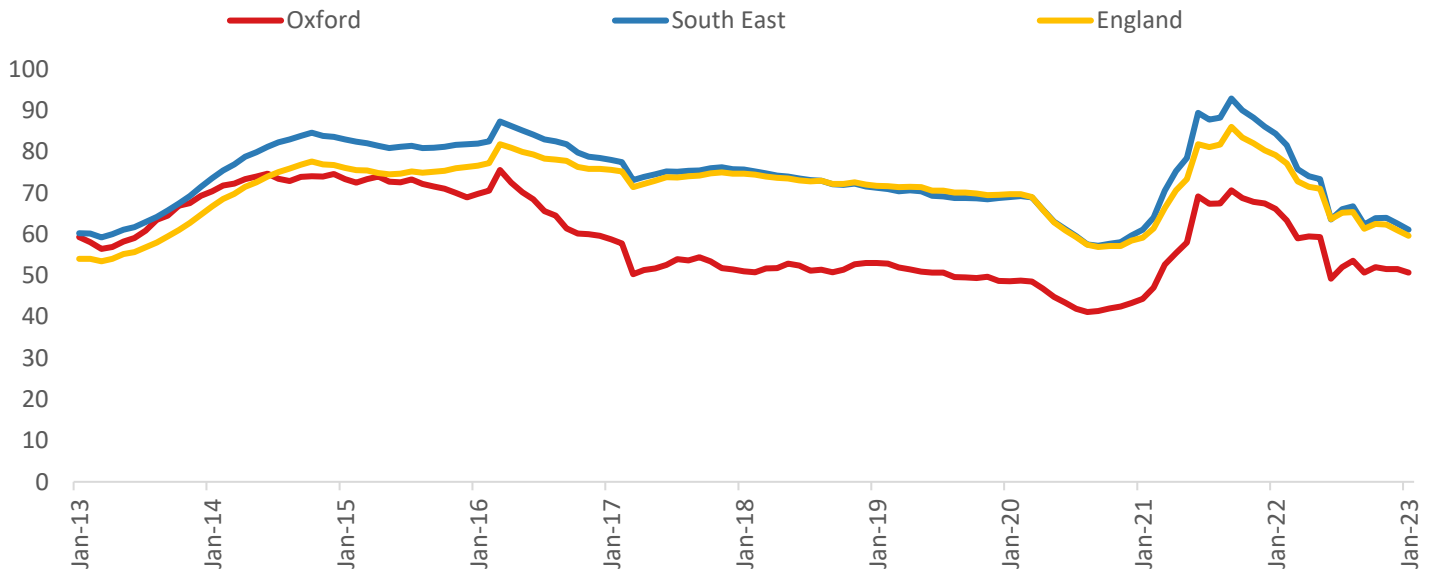

Transactions (January 2023 data)

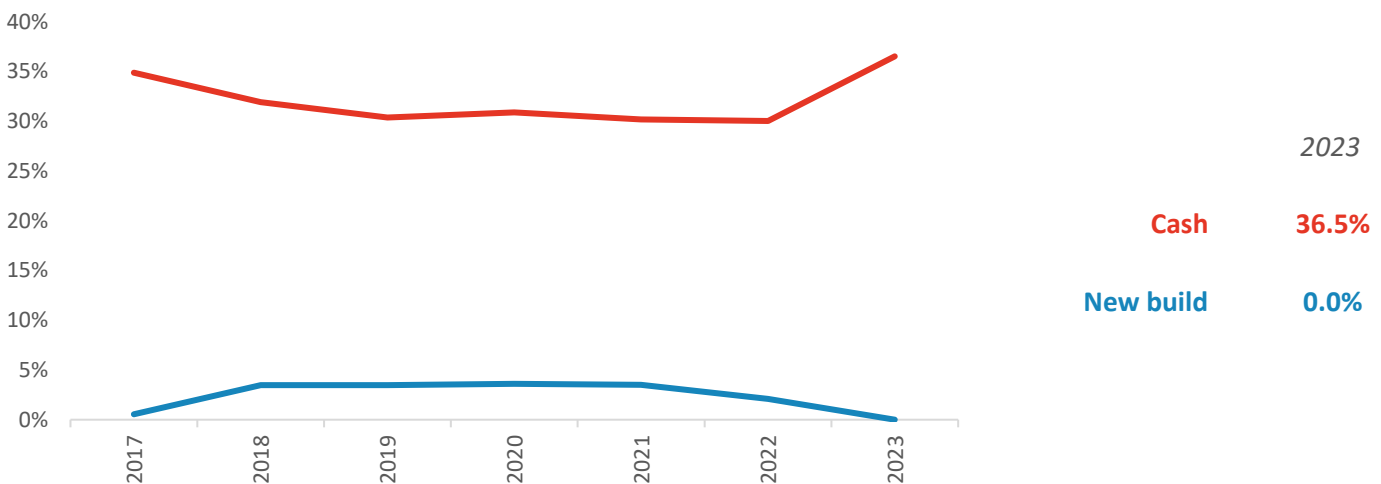
Annual Transactions, Indexed (2001-05 average = 100)



There were 1,265 transactions in Oxford during the 12 months to January 2023. This is 51% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is significantly below pre-downturn levels.

Transactions in Oxford have fallen by 32.0% since 2014, compared to changes of -26.9% for South East and -22.4% for England.

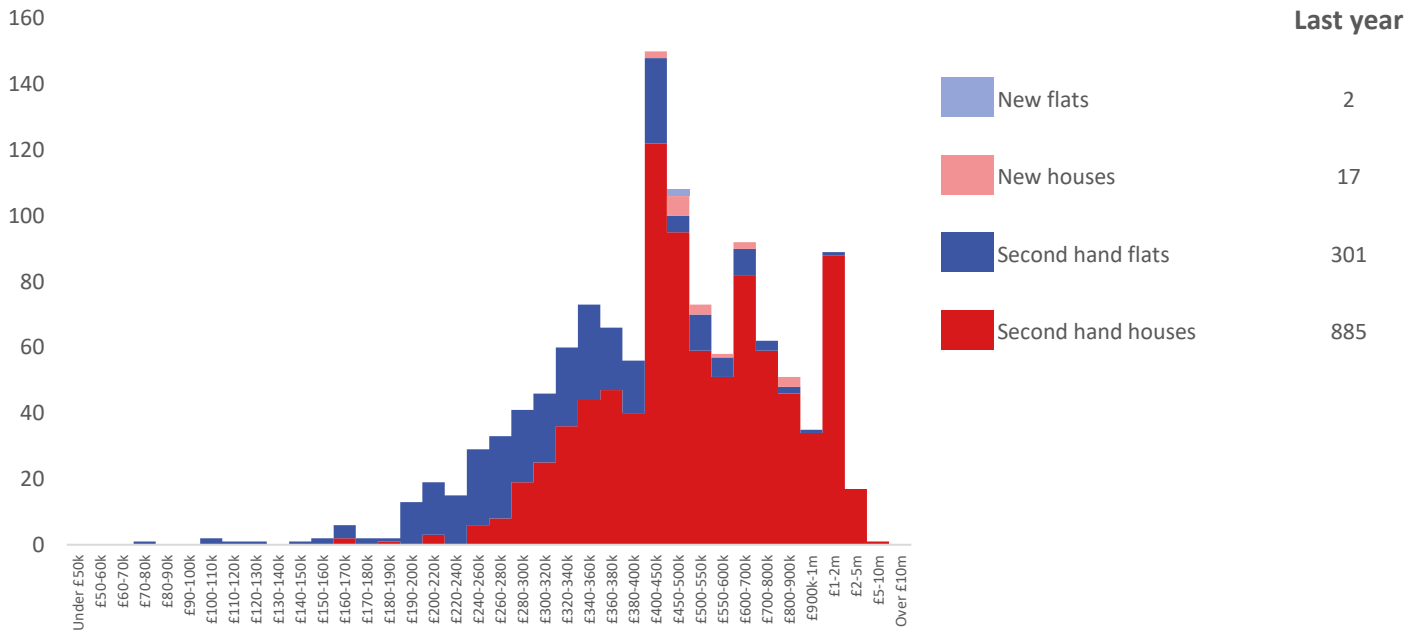
Cash and New Build Sales as % of Total, by Year

Depth of Market by Property Type

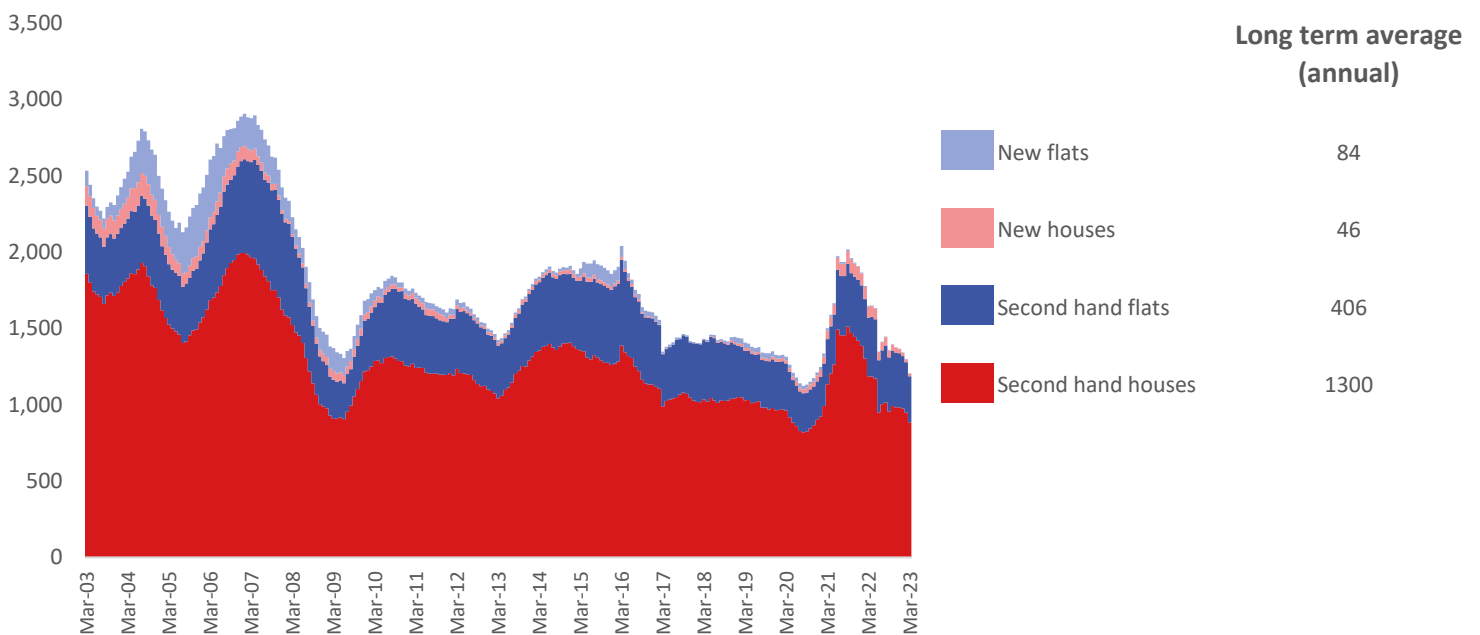
12 months to March 2023



The most common property type transacted over the past 12 months in Oxford was 'second hand houses' with 885 sales, 73% of all sales over the same period. The annual total of 1,205 transactions is equivalent to 66% of the long term average level of activity.

Timeline of Transactions by Type

Rolling 12 months, past 20 years



The most common property type transacted over the past 20 years was 'second hand houses' with the equivalent of 1,300 sales per year on average, making up 71% of the typical annual total over that period.
