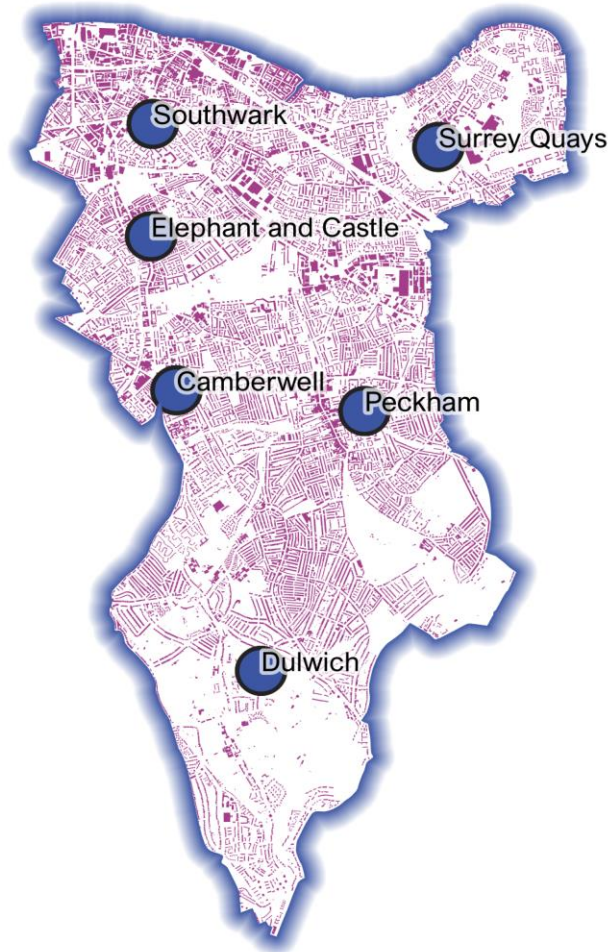

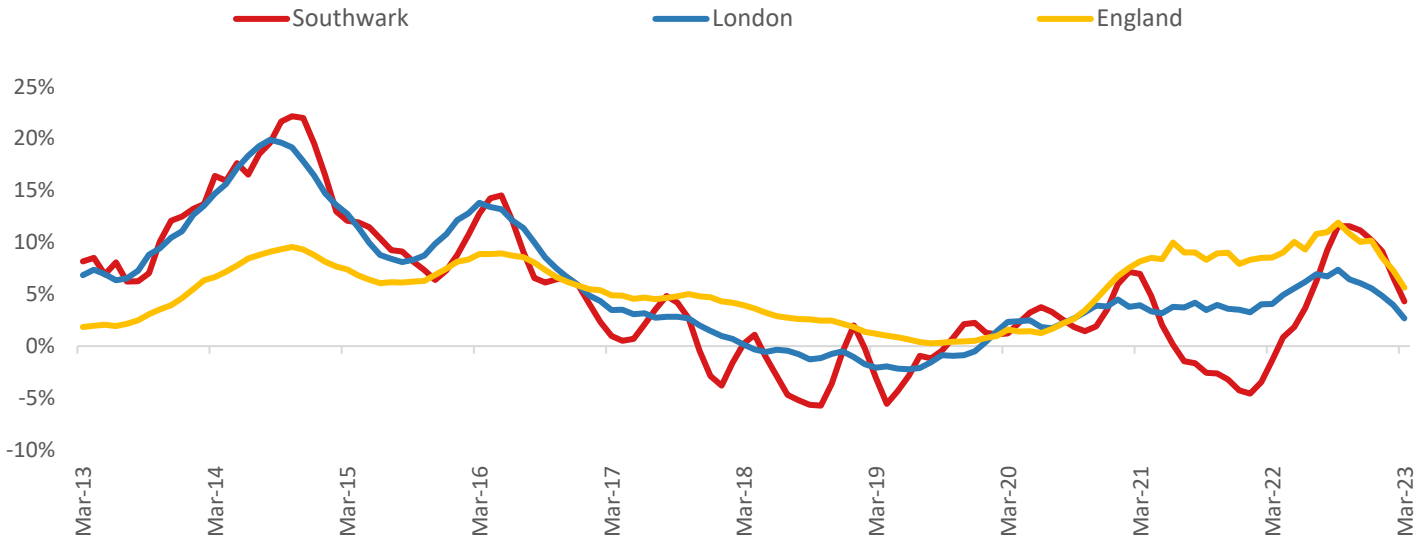

House Price Growth (March 2023 data)

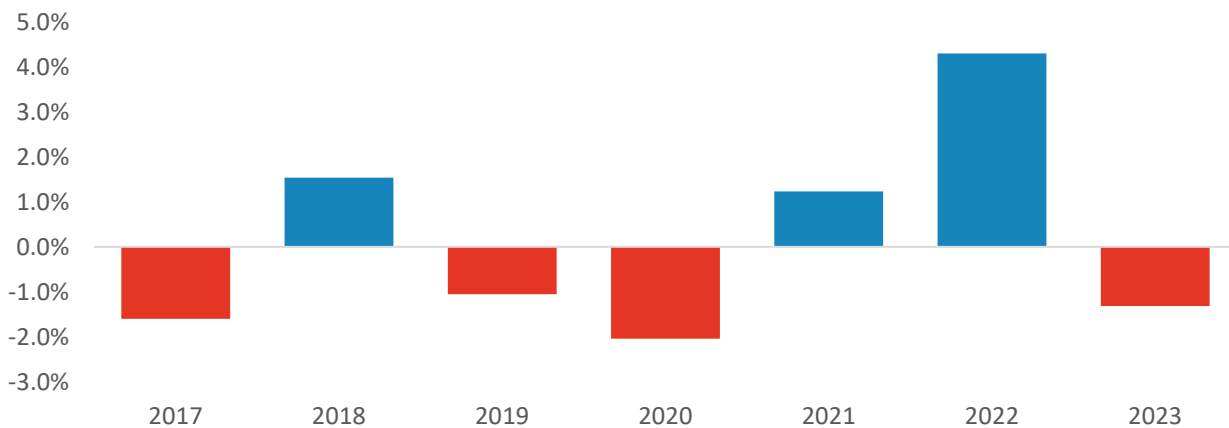
Annual Change in House Prices



House prices in Southwark grew by 4.3% in the 12 months to March 2023 (based on 3-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 5.6% and prices in London grew by 2.7% over the same period.

Southwark house prices are now 82.9% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +77.9% for London and +58.2% across England.

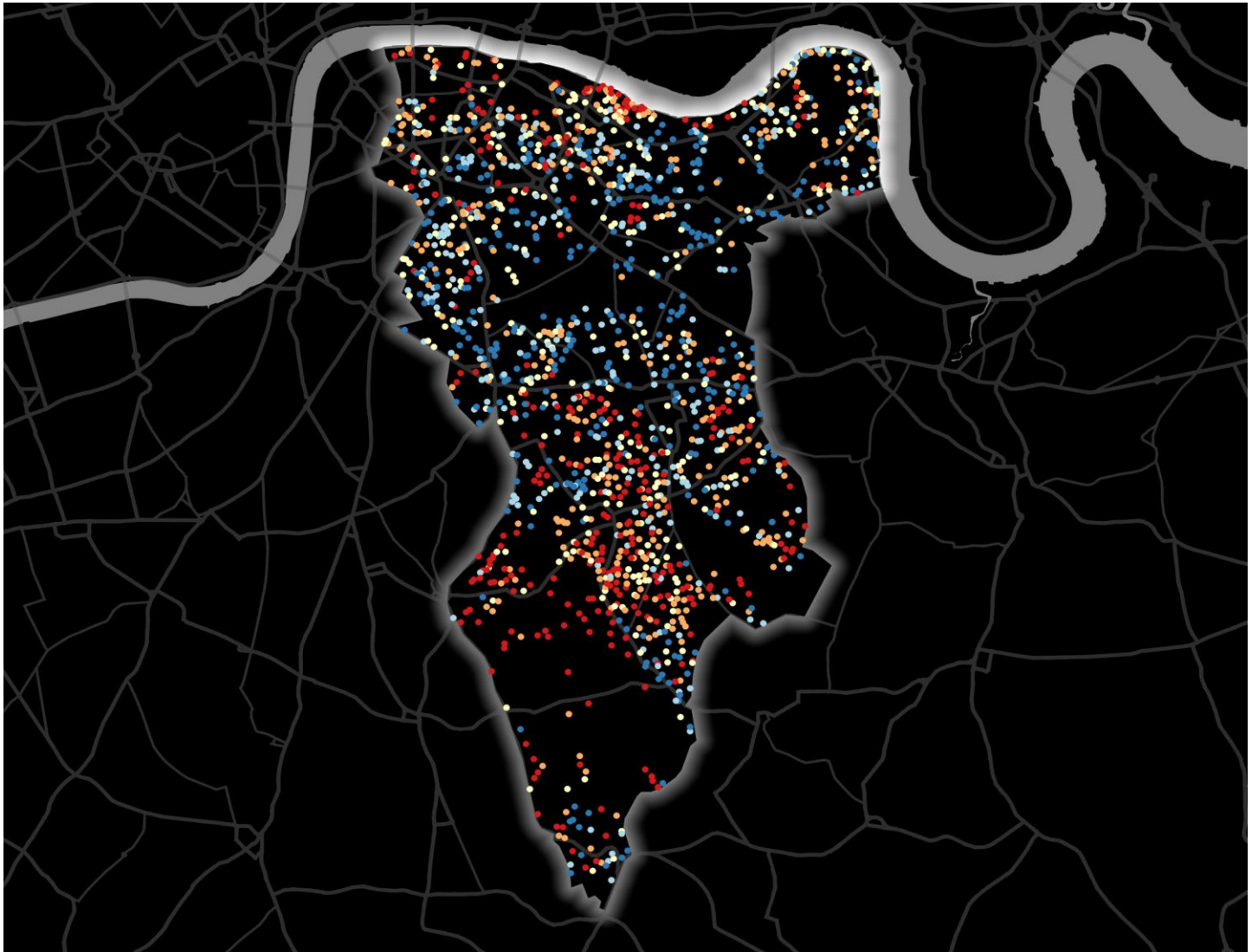
Year-To-Date Change in House Prices, December to March



Local prices have fallen by 1.3% in 2023 so far, compared to growth of 4.3% over the same period last year.

Each point is one postcode, coloured by the average value relative to all sales in this local authority (price bands are LA-specific quintiles).

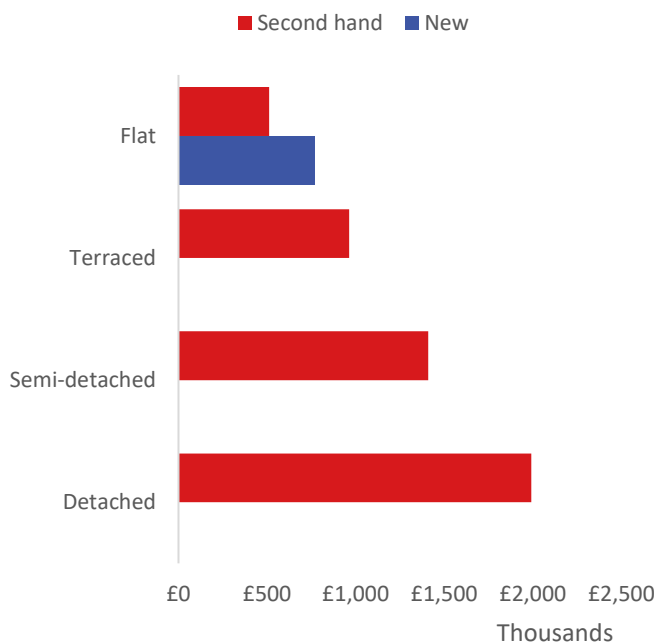

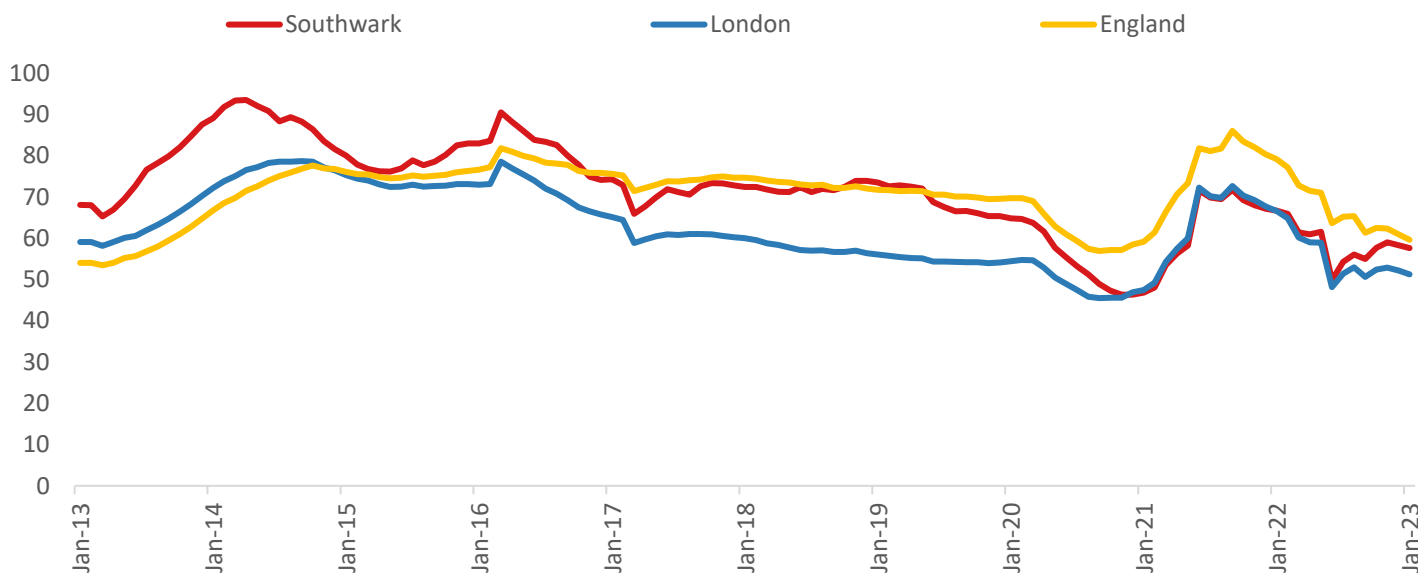

Transactions (January 2023 data)

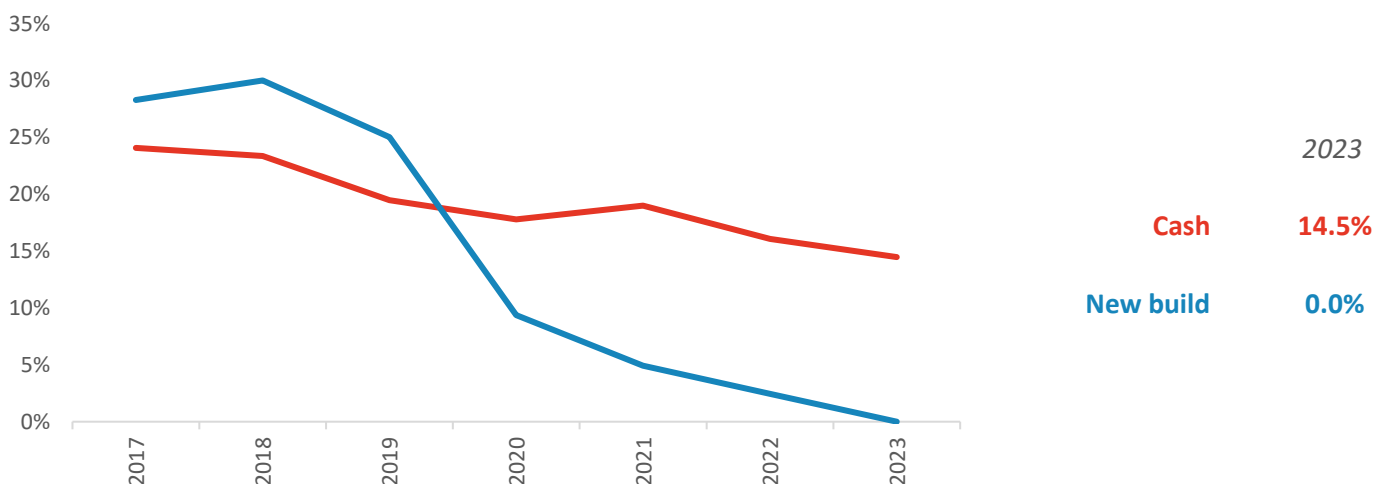
Annual Transactions, Indexed (2001-05 average = 100)



There were 2,818 transactions in Southwark during the 12 months to January 2023. This is 58% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is significantly below pre-downturn levels.

Transactions in Southwark have fallen by 29.4% since 2014, compared to changes of -33.0% for London and -22.4% for England.

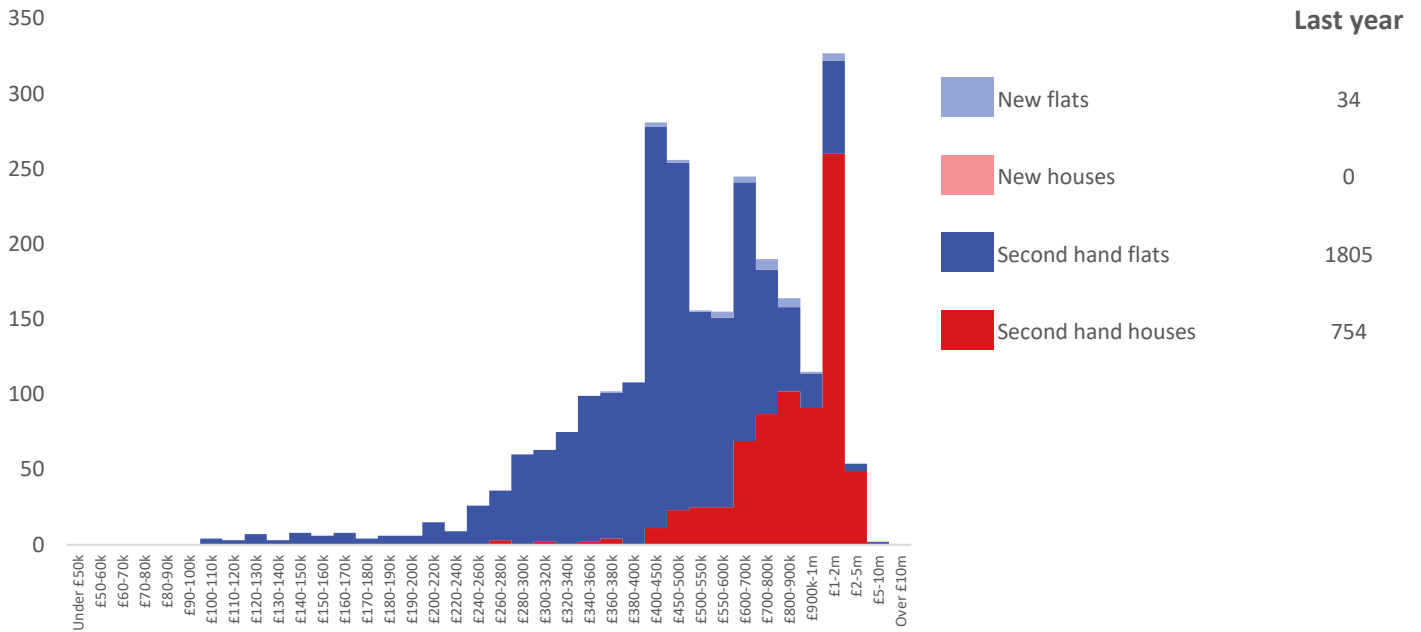
Cash and New Build Sales as % of Total, by Year

Depth of Market by Property Type

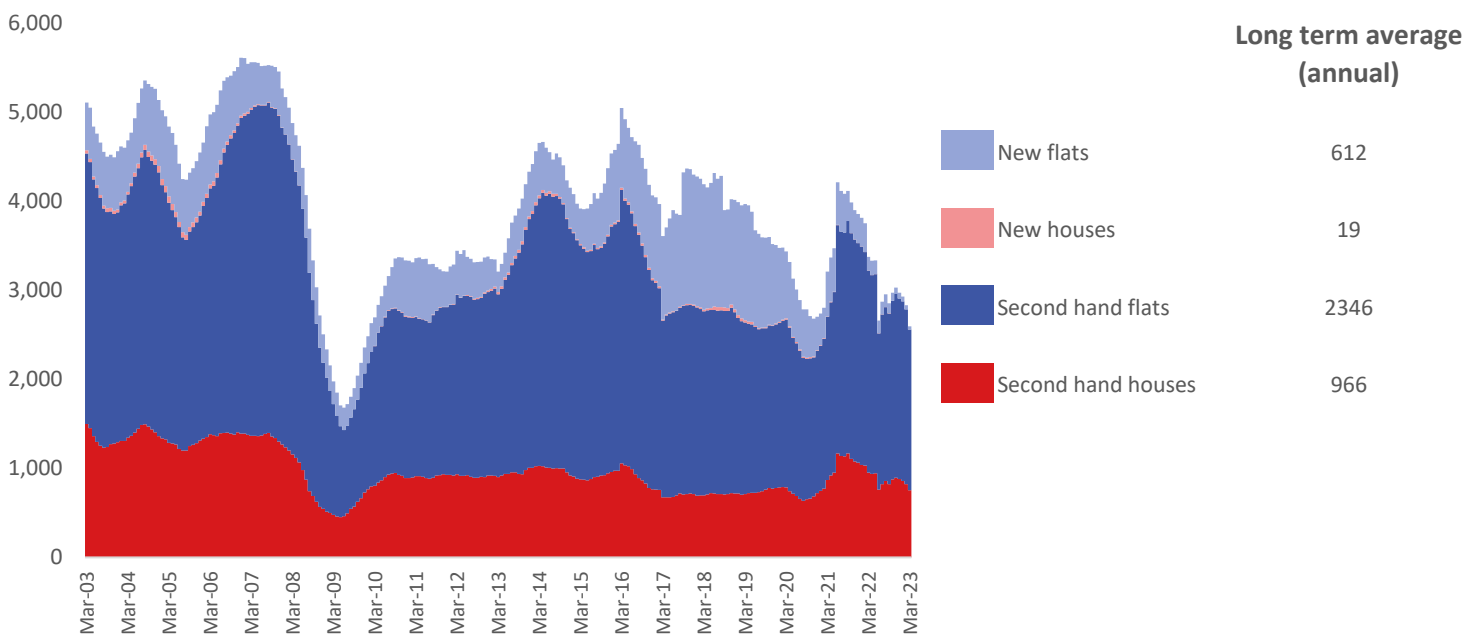
12 months to March 2023



The most common property type transacted over the past 12 months in Southwark was 'second hand flats' with 1,805 sales, 70% of all sales over the same period. The annual total of 2,593 transactions is equivalent to 66% of the long term average level of activity.

Timeline of Transactions by Type

Rolling 12 months, past 20 years



The most common property type transacted over the past 20 years was 'second hand flats' with the equivalent of 2,346 sales per year on average, making up 60% of the typical annual total over that period.
