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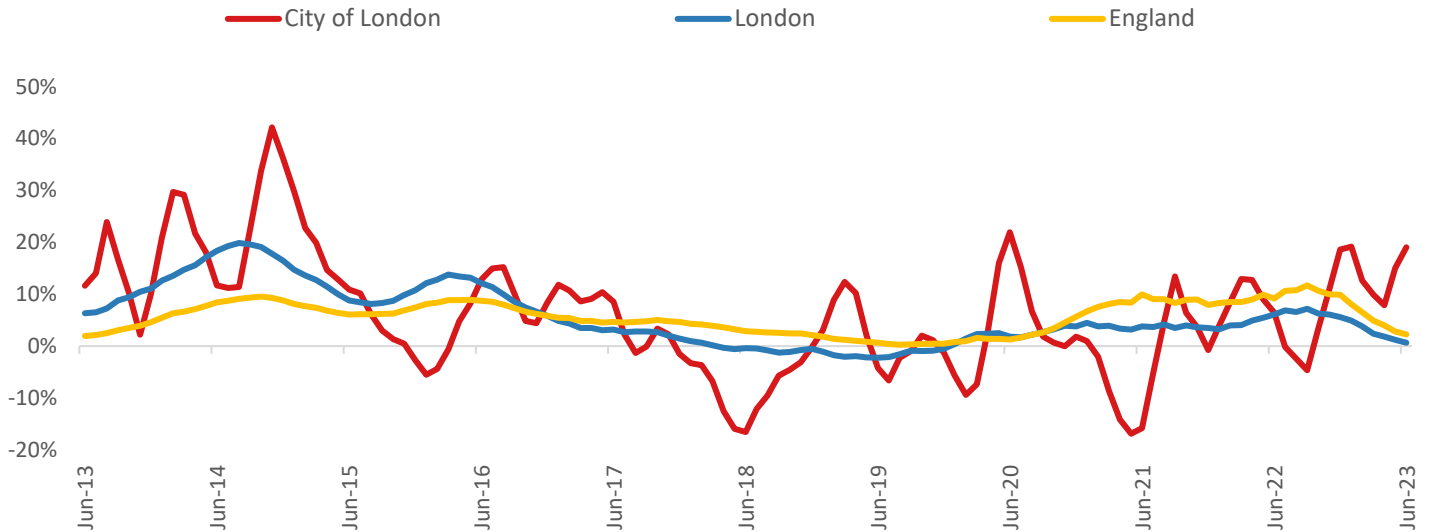

**House Price Growth (June 2023 data)**

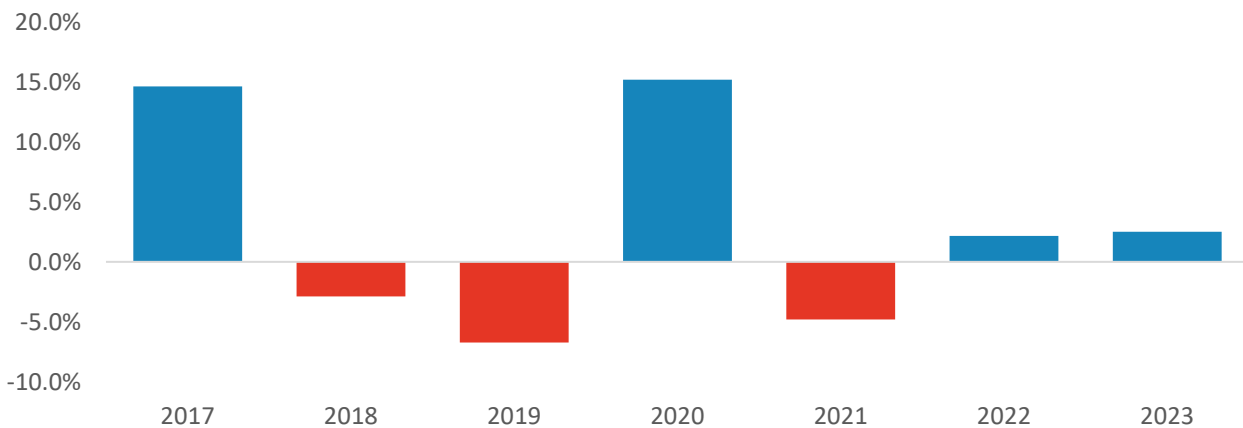
*Annual Change in House Prices*



House prices in City of London grew by 19.0% in the 12 months to June 2023 (based on 3-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 2.2% and prices in London grew by 0.7% over the same period.

City of London house prices are now 107.7% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +77.2% for London and +56.8% across England.

*Year-To-Date Change in House Prices, December to June*



Local prices have grown by 2.5% in 2023 so far, compared to growth of 2.2% over the same period last year.

Each point is one postcode, coloured by the average value relative to all sales in this local authority (price bands are LA-specific quintiles).

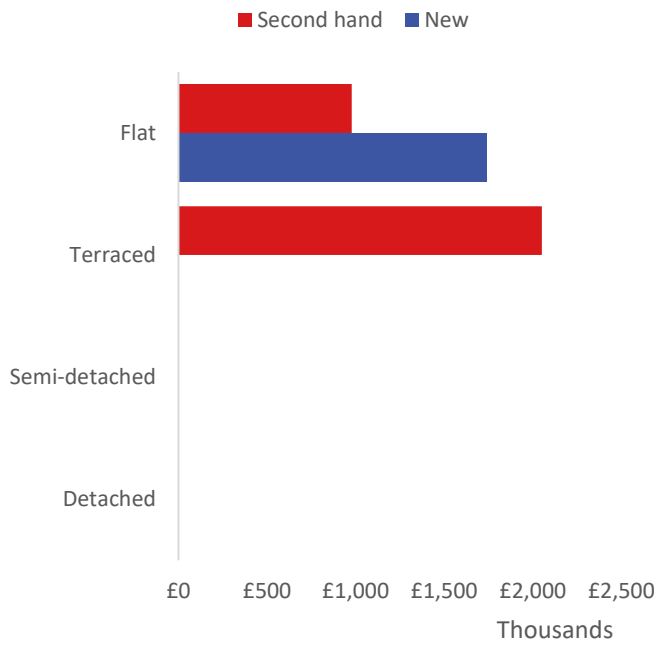

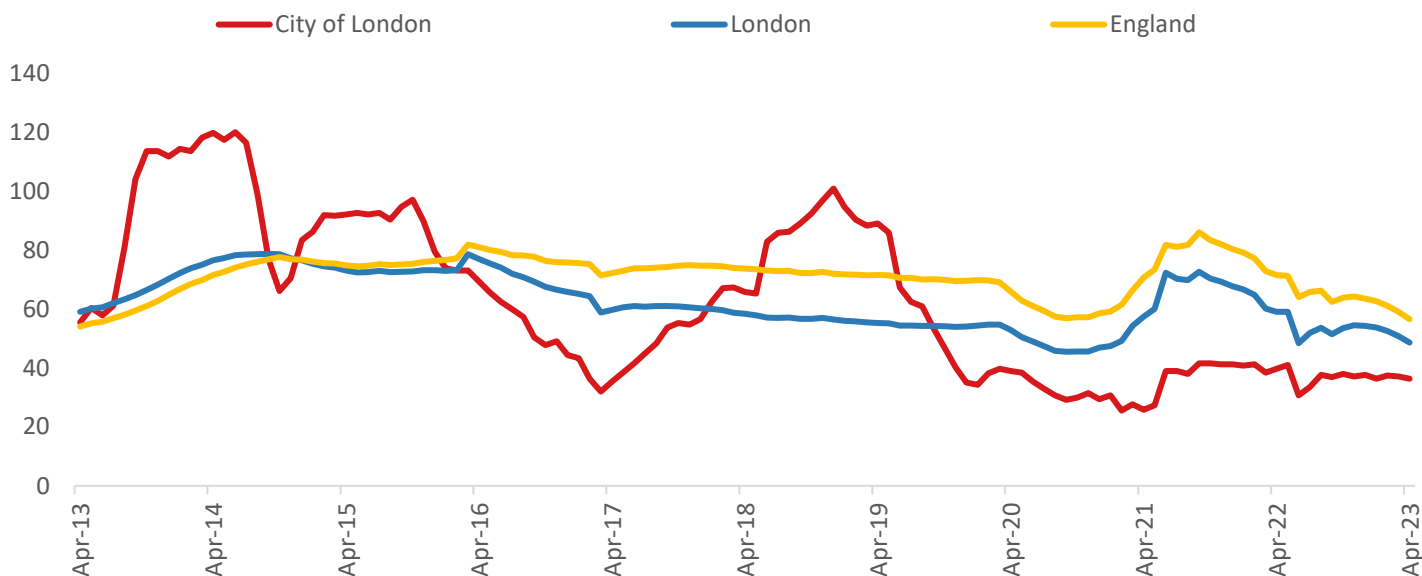

### Transactions (April 2023 data)

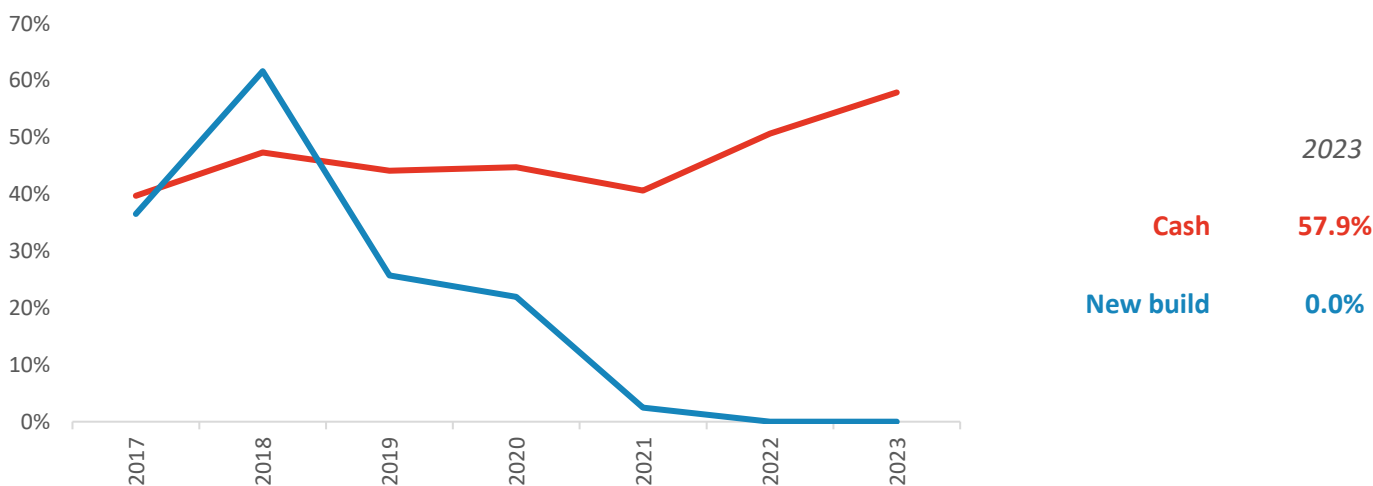
Annual Transactions, Indexed (2001-05 average = 100)



There were 141 transactions in City of London during the 12 months to April 2023. This is 36% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is significantly below pre-downturn levels.

Transactions in City of London have fallen by 56.3% since 2014, compared to changes of -36.4% for London and -26.4% for England.

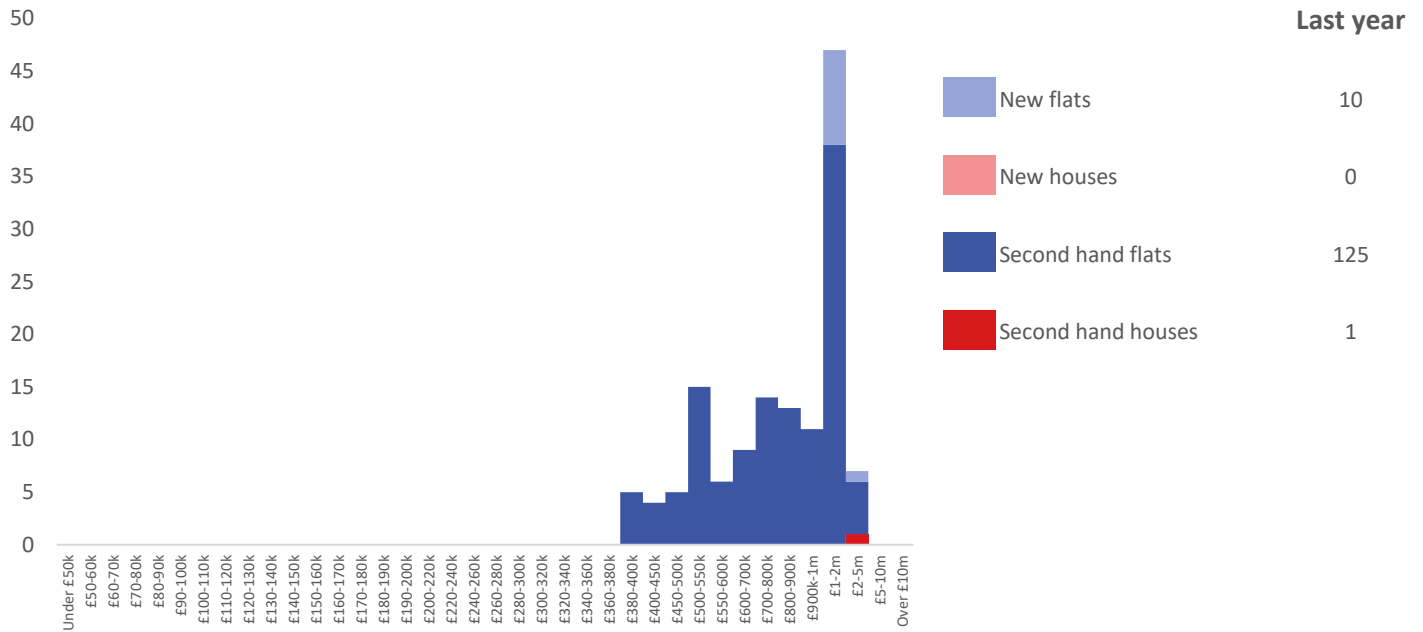
### Cash and New Build Sales as % of Total, by Year

## Depth of Market by Property Type

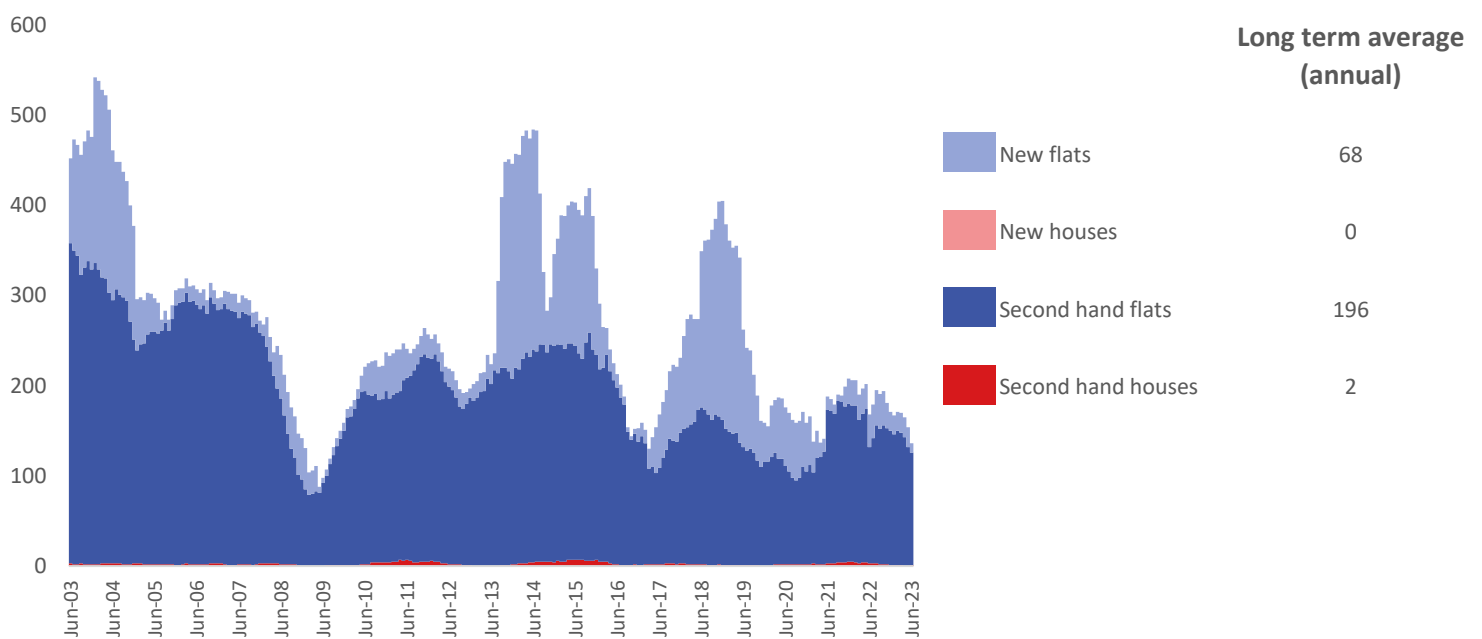
12 months to June 2023



The most common property type transacted over the past 12 months in City of London was 'second hand flats' with 125 sales, 92% of all sales over the same period. The annual total of 136 transactions is equivalent to 51% of the long term average level of activity.

## Timeline of Transactions by Type

Rolling 12 months, past 20 years



The most common property type transacted over the past 20 years was 'second hand flats' with the equivalent of 196 sales per year on average, making up 74% of the typical annual total over that period.
