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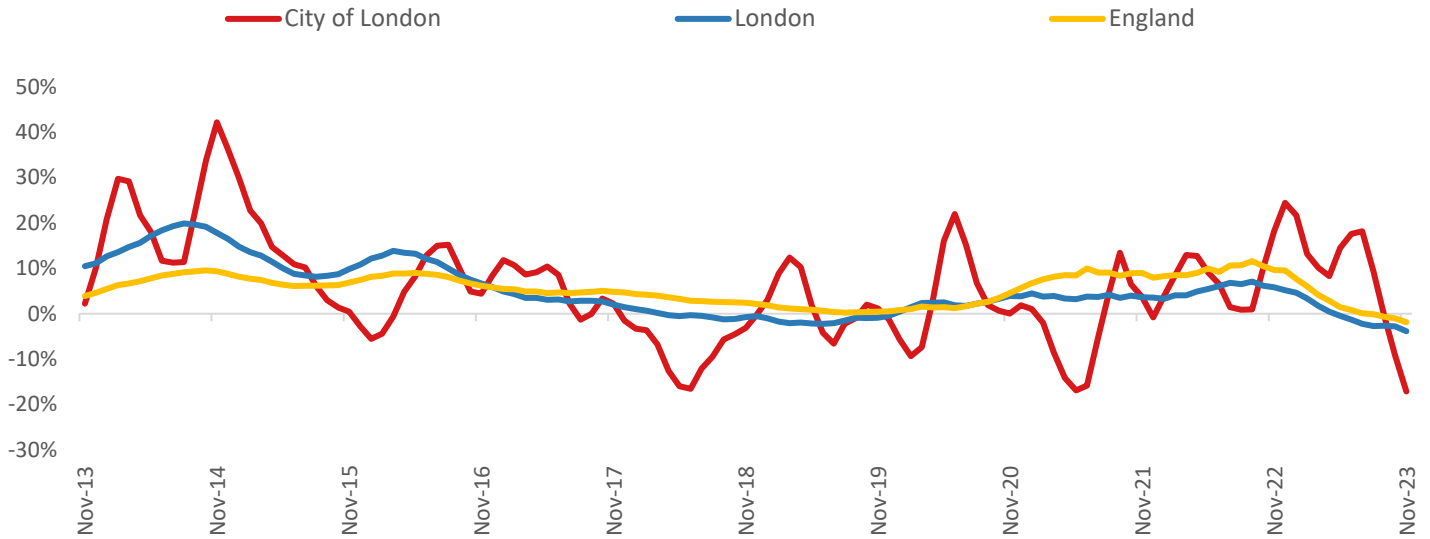

**House Price Growth (November 2023 data)**

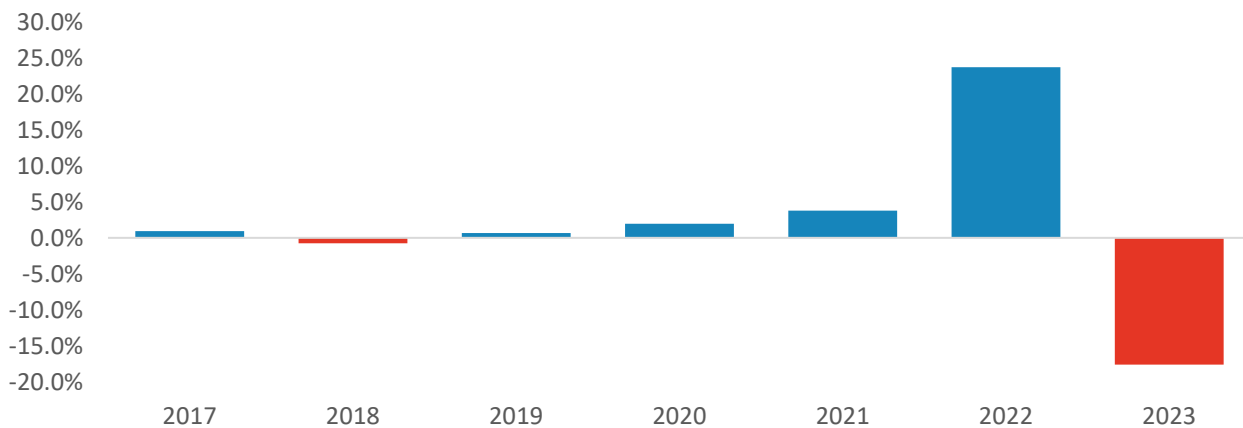
*Annual Change in House Prices*



House prices in City of London fell by 17.1% in the 12 months to November 2023 (based on 3-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices fell by 1.9% and prices in London fell by 3.9% over the same period.

City of London house prices are now 75.1% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +73.7% for London and +56.9% across England.

*Year-To-Date Change in House Prices, December to November*



Local prices have fallen by 17.6% in 2023 so far, compared to growth of 23.7% over the same period in 2022.

Each point is one postcode, coloured by the average value relative to all sales in this local authority (price bands are LA-specific quintiles).

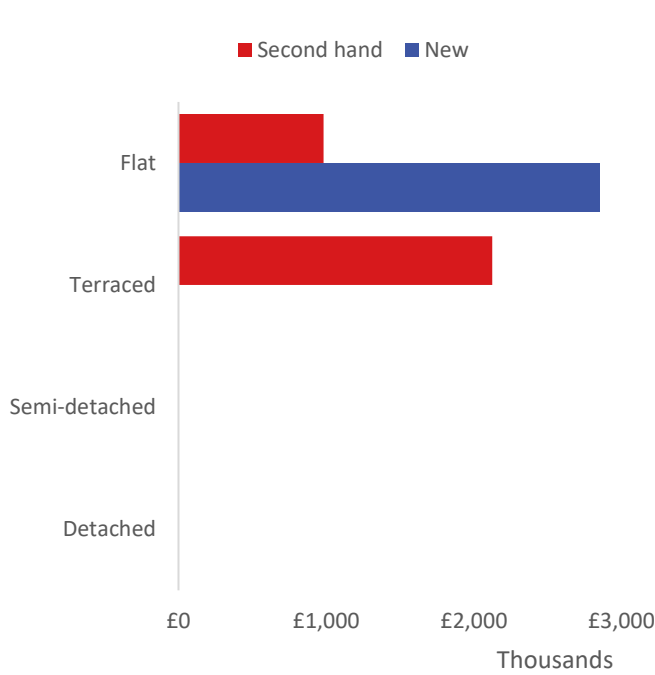

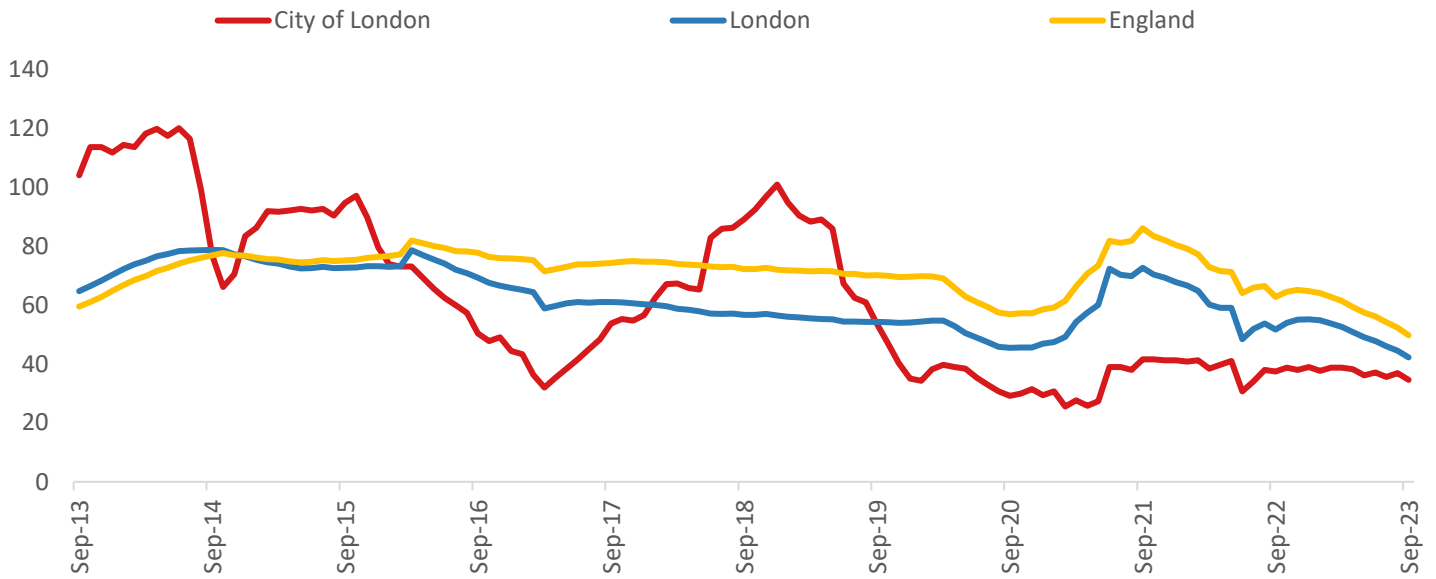

### Transactions (September 2023 data)

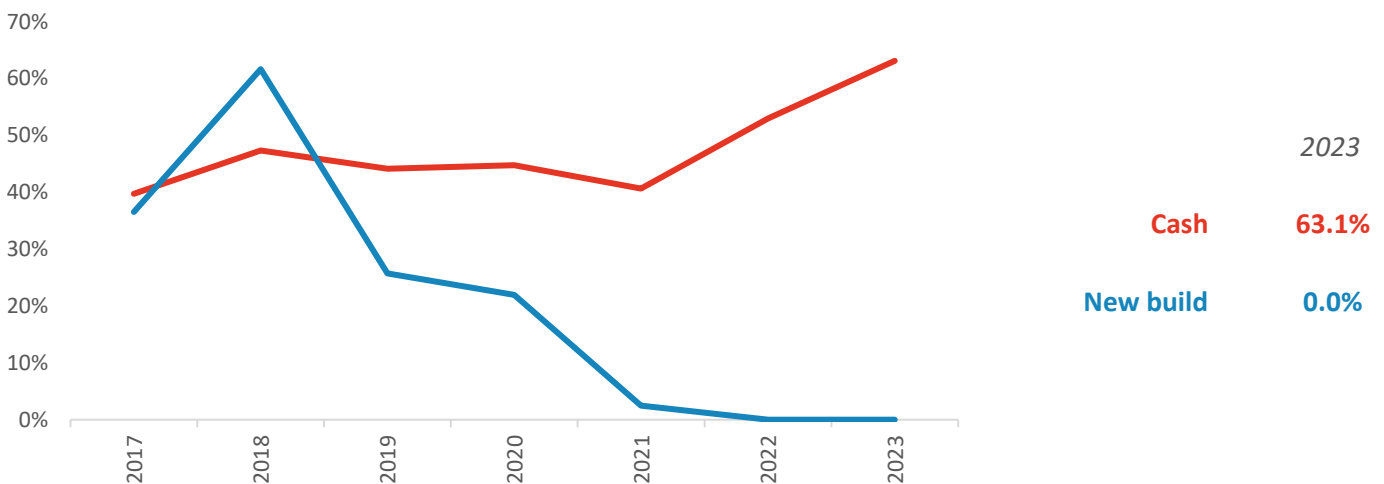
Annual Transactions, Indexed (2001-05 average = 100)



There were 134 transactions in City of London during the 12 months to September 2023. This is 35% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is significantly below pre-downturn levels.

Transactions in City of London have fallen by 58.5% since 2014, compared to changes of -44.8% for London and -35.3% for England.

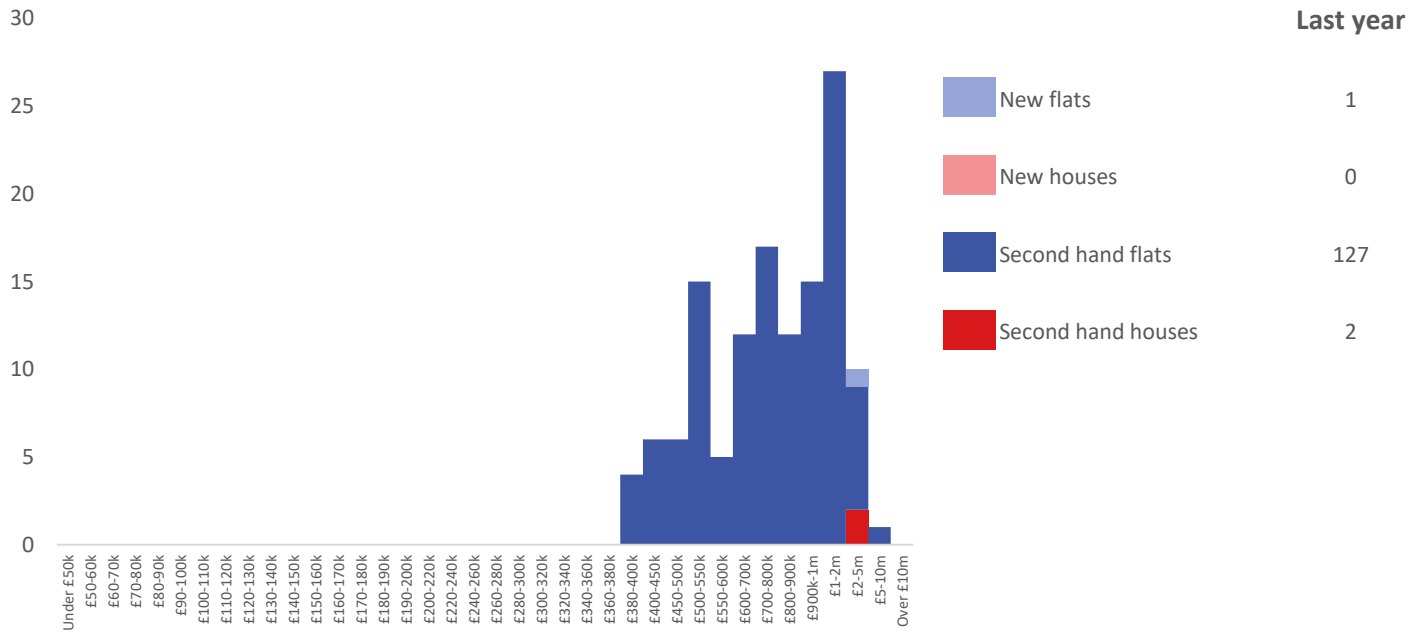
### Cash and New Build Sales as % of Total, by Year

## Depth of Market by Property Type

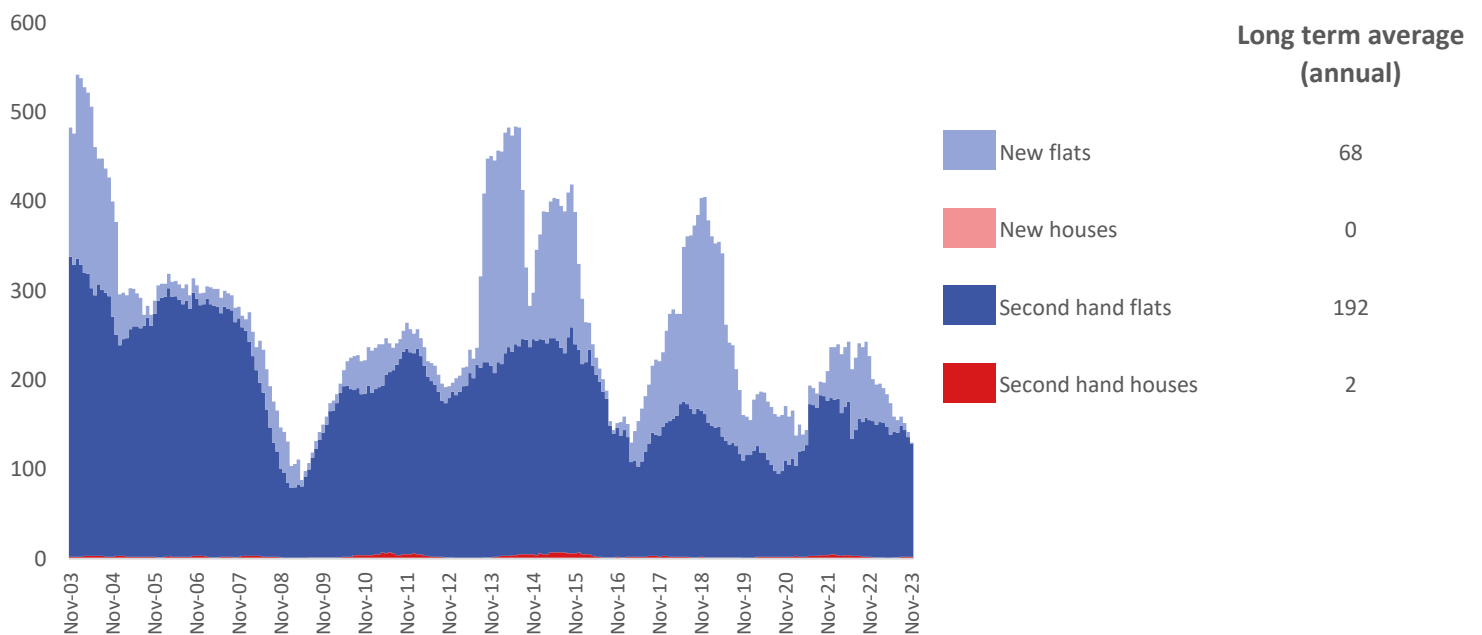
12 months to November 2023



The most common property type transacted over the past 12 months in City of London was 'second hand flats' with 127 sales, 98% of all sales over the same period. The annual total of 130 transactions is equivalent to 49% of the long term average level of activity.

## Timeline of Transactions by Type

Rolling 12 months, past 20 years



The most common property type transacted over the past 20 years was 'second hand flats' with the equivalent of 192 sales per year on average, making up 73% of the typical annual total over that period.
