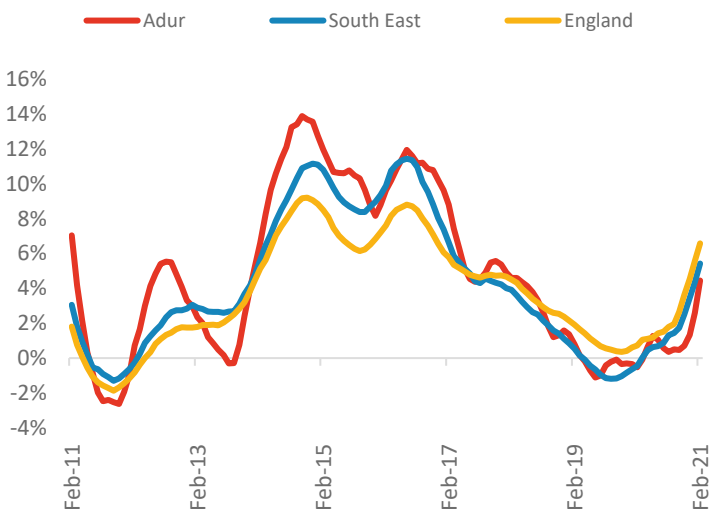

House Prices (February 2021 data)

Annual Change in House Prices



House prices in Adur grew by 4.4% in the 12 months to February 2021 (based on 6-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 6.6% and prices in the South East grew by 5.4% over the same period.

Adur house prices are now 46.7% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +42.8% for the South East and +36.1% across England.

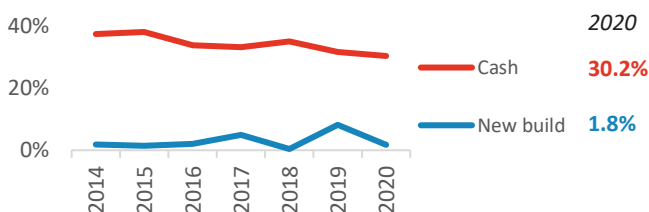
Local prices have fallen by 0.8% in 2021 so far, compared to a fall of 0.6% over the same period last year.

Transactions (December 2020 data)

There were 840 transactions in Adur during the 12 months to December 2020. This is 58% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is significantly below pre-downturn levels.

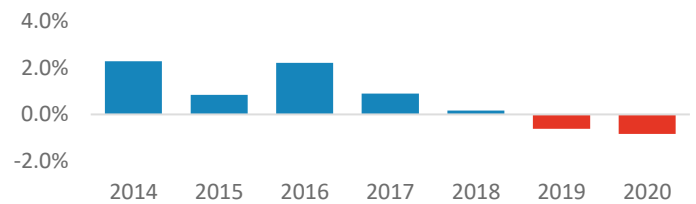
Transactions in Adur have fallen by 27.6% since 2014, compared to changes of -32.8% for the South East and -28.7% for England.
