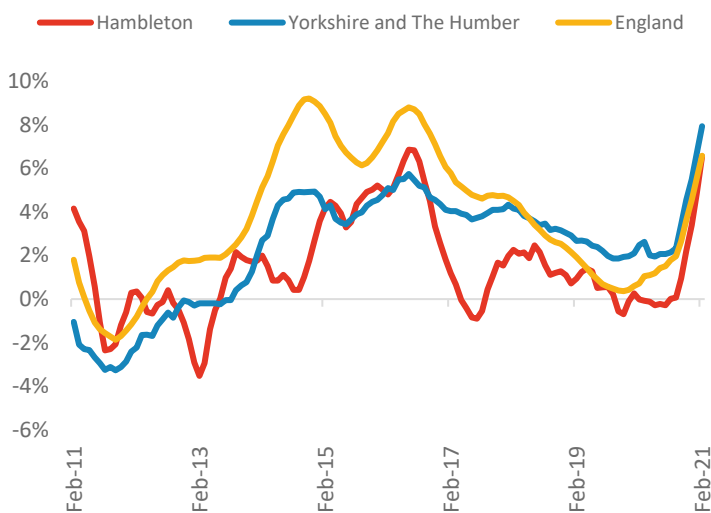

House Prices (February 2021 data)

Annual Change in House Prices



House prices in Hambleton grew by 6.5% in the 12 months to February 2021 (based on 6-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 6.6% and prices in Yorkshire and The Humber grew by 7.9% over the same period.

Hambleton house prices are now 11.6% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +19.0% for Yorkshire and The Humber and +36.1% across England.

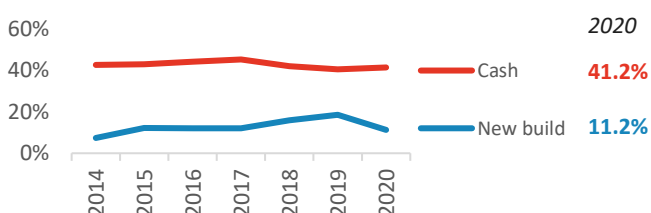
Local prices have grown by 0.3% in 2021 so far, compared to growth of 0.2% over the same period last year.

Transactions (December 2020 data)

There were 1,167 transactions in Hambleton during the 12 months to December 2020. This is 68% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is significantly below pre-downturn levels.

Transactions in Hambleton have fallen by 20.6% since 2014, compared to changes of -19.9% for Yorkshire and The Humber and -28.7% for England.

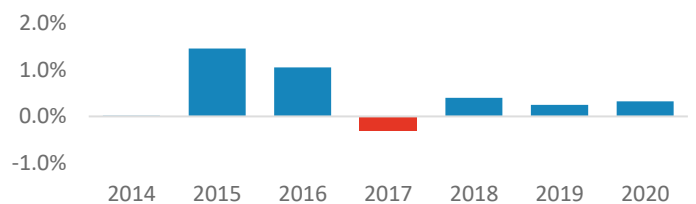
Cash and New Build Sales as % of Total, by Year
