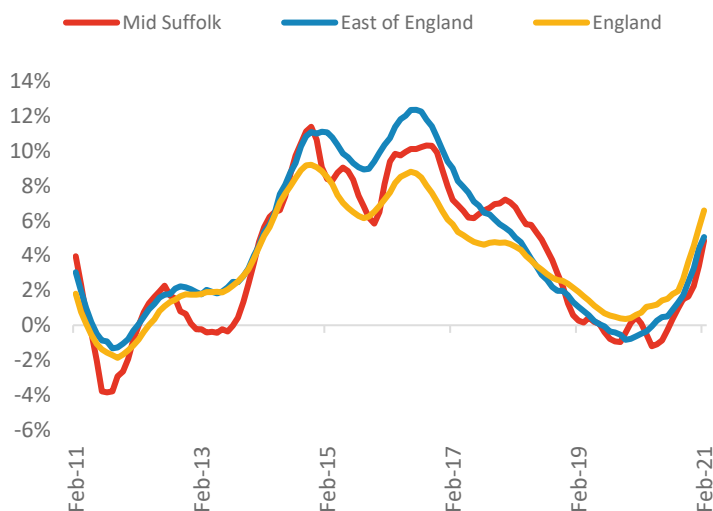

House Prices (February 2021 data)

Annual Change in House Prices



House prices in Mid Suffolk grew by 4.9% in the 12 months to February 2021 (based on 6-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 6.6% and prices in the East of England grew by 5.1% over the same period.

Mid Suffolk house prices are now 37.0% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +45.9% for the East of England and +36.1% across England.

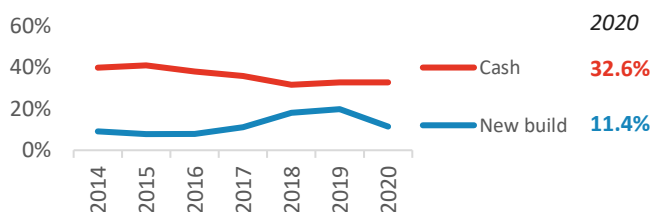
Local prices have fallen by 0.2% in 2021 so far, compared to a fall of 0.2% over the same period last year.

Transactions (December 2020 data)

There were 1,406 transactions in Mid Suffolk during the 12 months to December 2020. This is 67% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is significantly below pre-downturn levels.

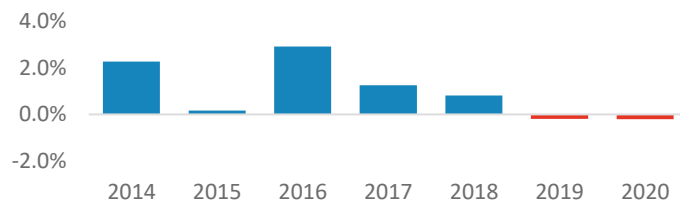
Transactions in Mid Suffolk have fallen by 28.4% since 2014, compared to changes of -33.1% for the East of England and -28.7% for England.
