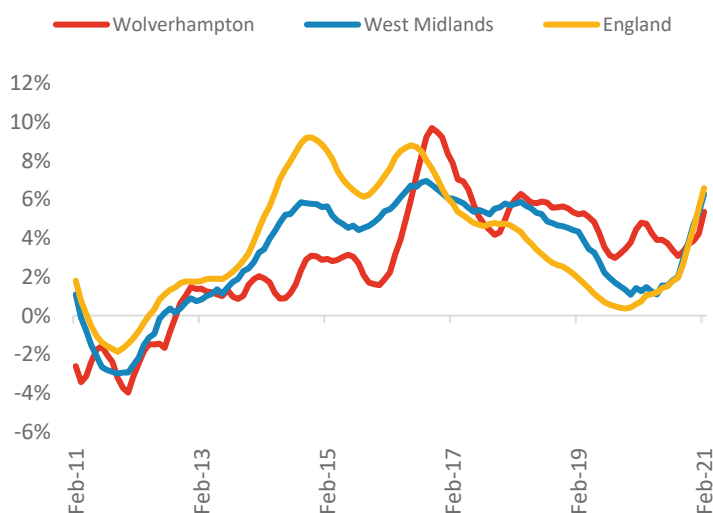

House Prices (February 2021 data)

Annual Change in House Prices



House prices in Wolverhampton grew by 5.4% in the 12 months to February 2021 (based on 6-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 6.6% and prices in the West Midlands grew by 6.3% over the same period.

Wolverhampton house prices are now 20.0% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +28.8% for the West Midlands and +36.1% across England.

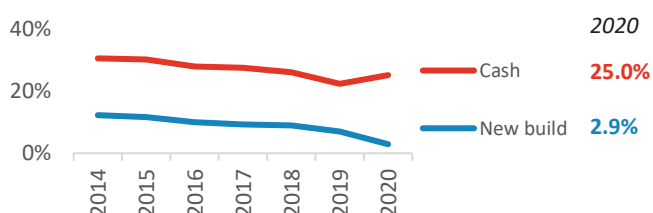
Local prices have grown by 1.2% in 2021 so far, compared to growth of 0.2% over the same period last year.

Transactions (December 2020 data)

There were 2,180 transactions in Wolverhampton during the 12 months to December 2020. This is 59% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is significantly below pre-downturn levels.

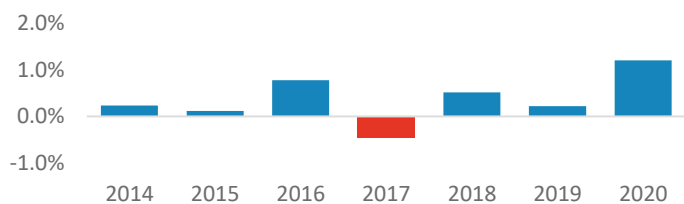
Transactions in Wolverhampton have fallen by 19.3% since 2014, compared to changes of -24.1% for the West Midlands and -28.7% for England.
