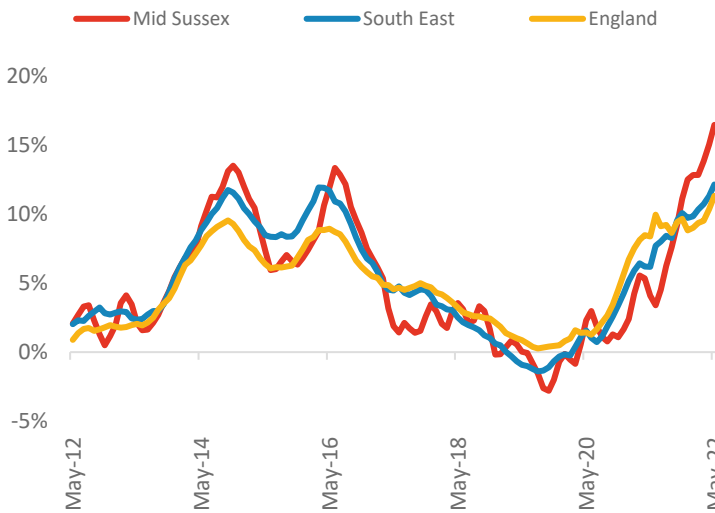

House Prices (May 2022 data)

Annual Change in House Prices



House prices in Mid Sussex grew by 16.5% in the 12 months to May 2022 (based on 3-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 11.3% and prices in the South East grew by 12.2% over the same period.

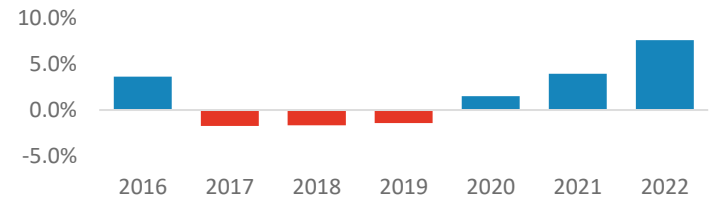
Mid Sussex house prices are now 60.7% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +61.2% for the South East and +53.6% across England.

Local prices have grown by 7.6% in 2022 so far, compared to growth of 4.0% over the same period last year.

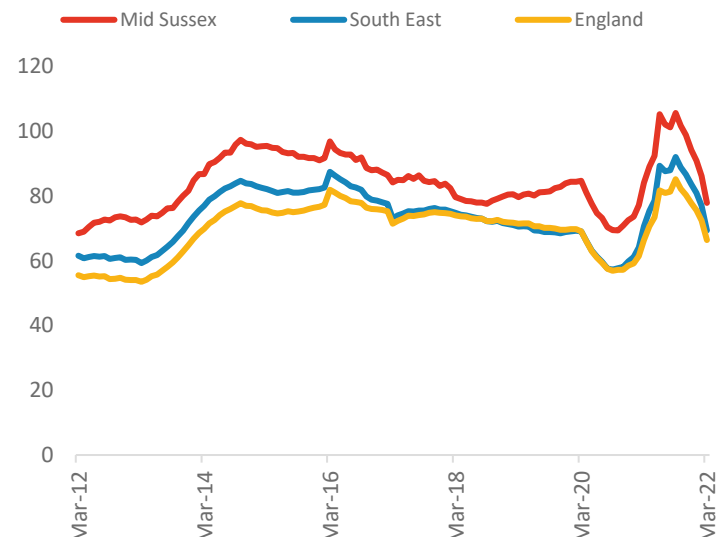
Transactions (March 2022 data)

There were 2,506 transactions in Mid Sussex during the 12 months to March 2022. This is 78% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is below pre-downturn levels. Transactions in Mid Sussex have fallen by 18.8% since 2014, compared to changes of -17.1% for the South East and -13.6% for England.

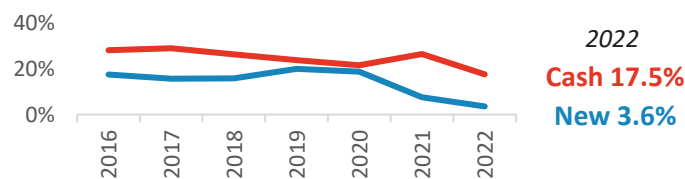
Year-To-Date Change in House Prices, December to May
