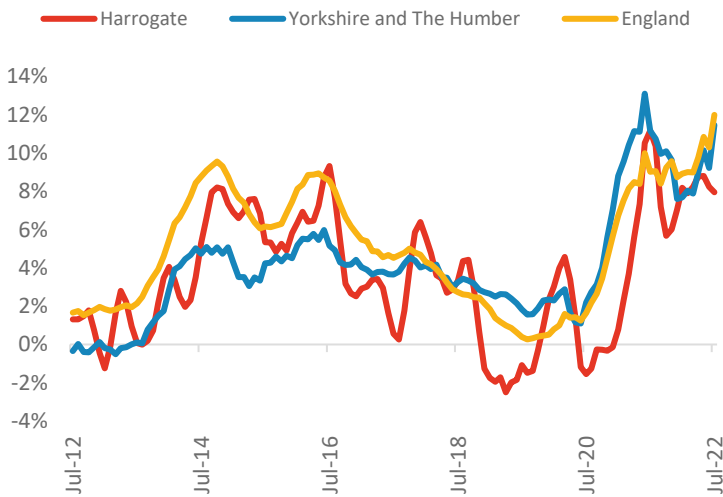

Annual Change in House Prices

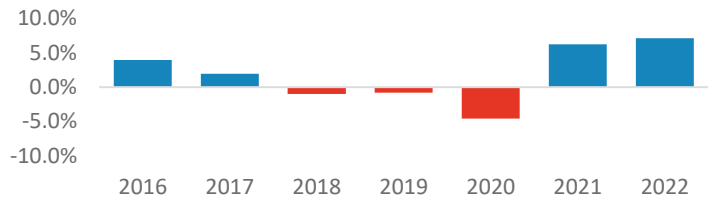


House prices in Harrogate grew by 8.0% in the 12 months to July 2022 (based on 3-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 12.0% and prices in Yorkshire and The Humber grew by 11.5% over the same period.

Harrogate house prices are now 36.6% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +38.0% for Yorkshire and The Humber and +57.1% across England.

Local prices have grown by 7.2% in 2022 so far, compared to growth of 6.3% over the same period last year.

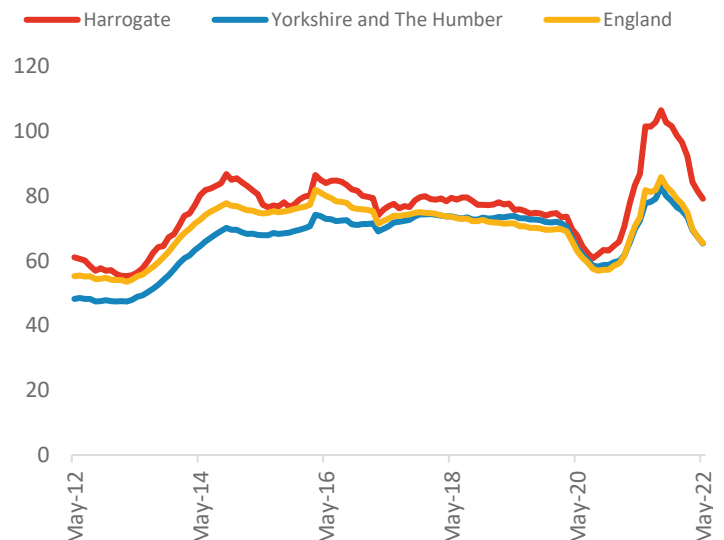
Year-To-Date Change in House Prices, December to July



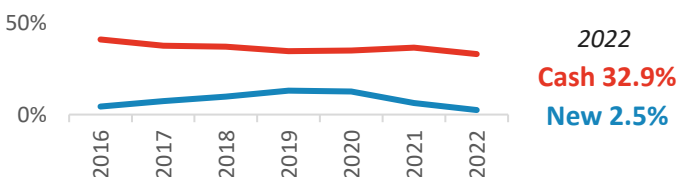
Transactions (May 2022 data)

There were 2,936 transactions in Harrogate during the 12 months to May 2022. This is 79% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is below pre-downturn levels. Transactions in Harrogate have fallen by 7.4% since 2014, compared to changes of -6.2% for Yorkshire and The Humber and -14.9% for England.
