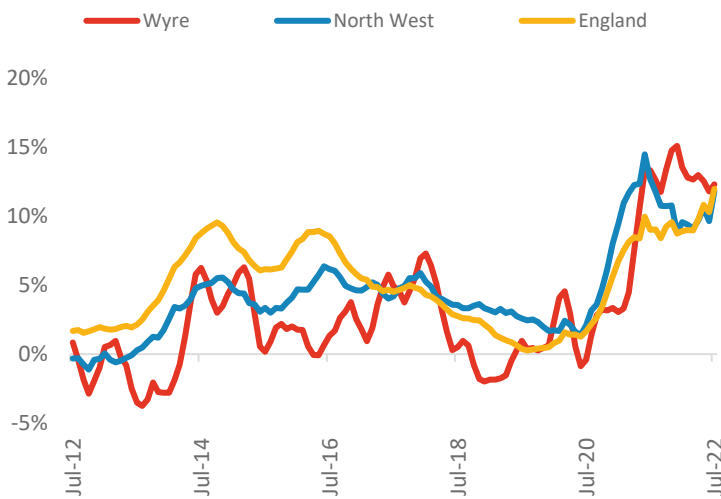

House Prices (July 2022 data)

Annual Change in House Prices



House prices in Wyre grew by 12.3% in the 12 months to July 2022 (based on 3-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 12.0% and prices in the North West grew by 11.8% over the same period.

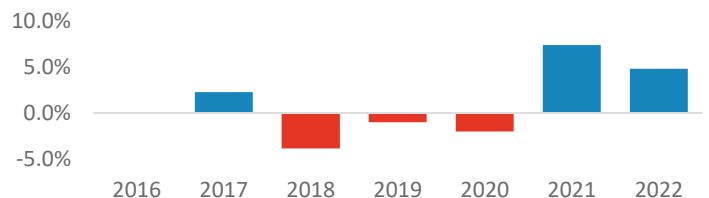
Wyre house prices are now 14.8% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +39.8% for the North West and +57.1% across England.

Local prices have grown by 4.8% in 2022 so far, compared to growth of 7.4% over the same period last year.

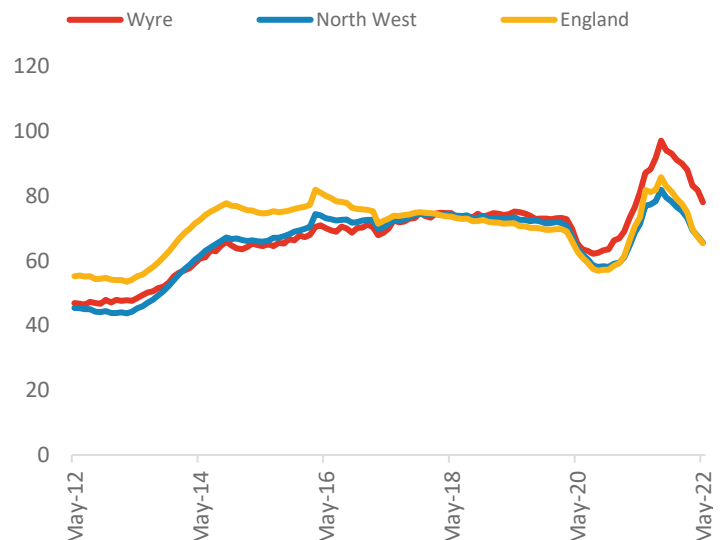
Transactions (May 2022 data)

There were 2,168 transactions in Wyre during the 12 months to May 2022. This is 78% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is below pre-downturn levels. Transactions in Wyre have grown by 22.3% since 2014, compared to changes of -2.0% for the North West and -14.9% for England.

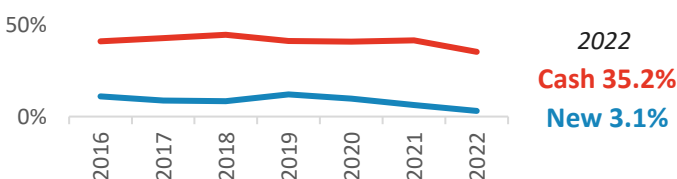
Year-To-Date Change in House Prices, December to July
