

House Prices (September 2022 data)


Annual Change in House Prices



Transactions (July 2022 data)

There were 3,372 transactions in Hull during the 12 months to July 2022. This is 56% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is significantly below pre-downturn levels. Transactions in Hull have fallen by 3.2% since 2014, compared to changes of -11.3% for Yorkshire and The Humber and -21.9% for England.


Note: These transaction counts do not include those identified as transfers under a power of sale/repossessions, buy-to-lets (where they can be identified by a mortgage), and transfers to non-private individuals.

House prices in Hull grew by 11.2% in the 12 months to September 2022 (based on 3-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 13.0% and prices in Yorkshire and The Humber grew by 12.8% over the same period.

Hull house prices are now 37.6% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +40.9% for Yorkshire and The Humber and +60.8% across England.

Local prices have grown by 10.4% in 2022 so far, compared to growth of 6.3% over the same period last year.
