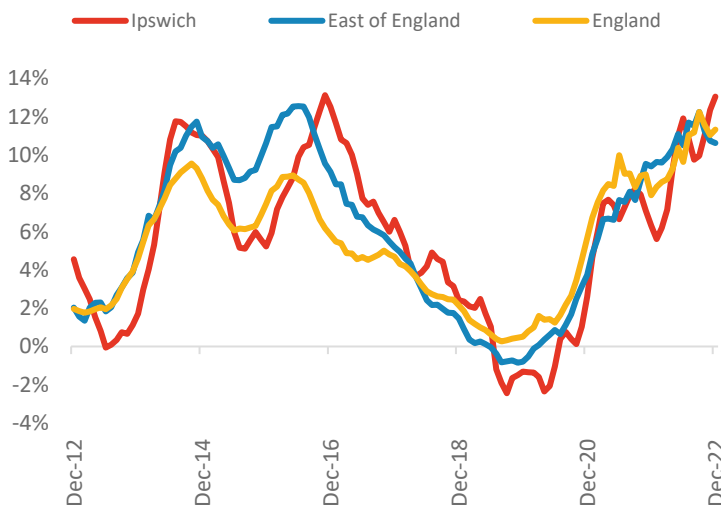

### House Prices (December 2022 data)

#### Annual Change in House Prices

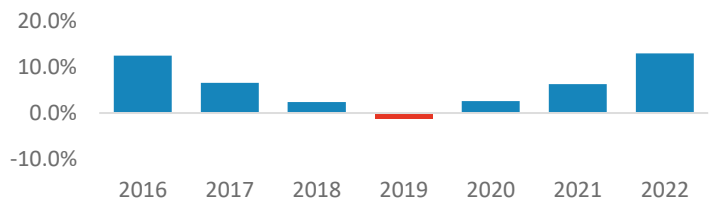


House prices in Ipswich grew by 13.1% in the 12 months to December 2022 (based on 3-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 11.3% and prices in the East of England grew by 10.6% over the same period.

Ipswich house prices are now 53.1% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +74.0% for the East of England and +61.9% across England.

Local prices have grown by 13.1% in 2022 so far, compared to growth of 6.3% over the same period last year.

#### Year-To-Date Change in House Prices, December to December

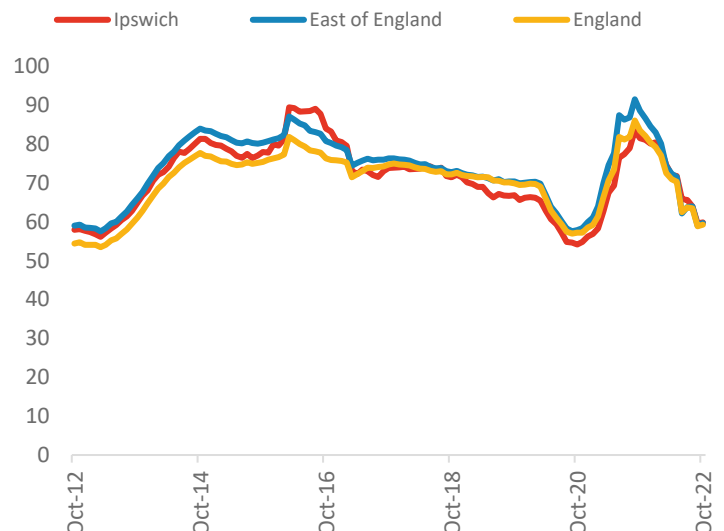


### Transactions (October 2022 data)

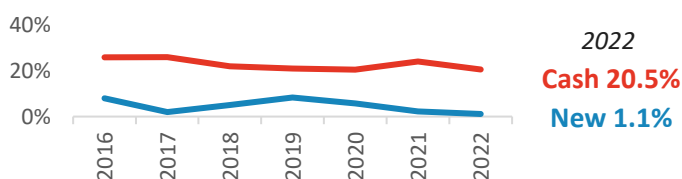
There were 1,762 transactions in Ipswich during the 12 months to October 2022. This is 60% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is significantly below pre-downturn levels.

Transactions in Ipswich have fallen by 25.5% since 2014, compared to changes of -28.4% for the East of England and -22.8% for England.
