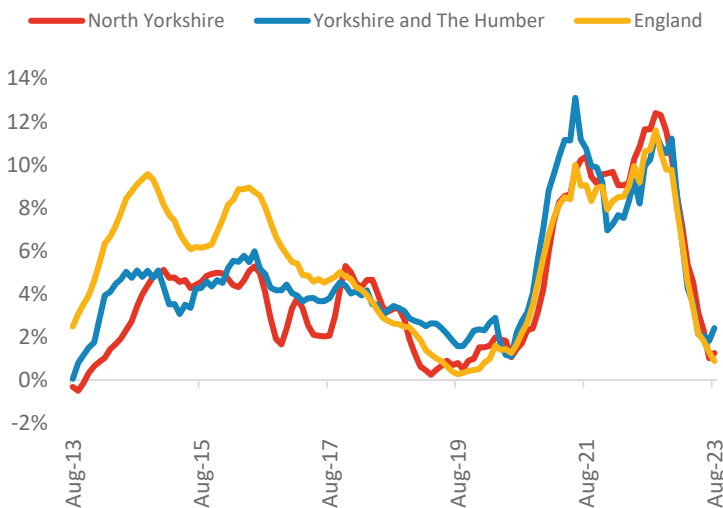

Annual Change in House Prices



House prices in North Yorkshire grew by 1.3% in the 12 months to August 2023 (based on 3-month smoothed data). By comparison national house prices grew by 0.9% and prices in Yorkshire and The Humber grew by 2.4% over the same period.

North Yorkshire house prices are now 37.8% above their previous peak in 2007, compared to +40.9% for Yorkshire and The Humber and +58.4% across England.

Local prices have fallen by 0.8% in 2023 so far, compared to growth of 8.1% over the same period last year.

Year-To-Date Change in House Prices, December to August

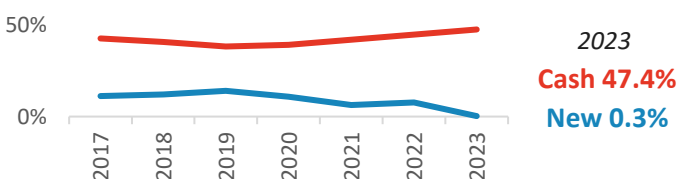


Transactions (June 2023 data)

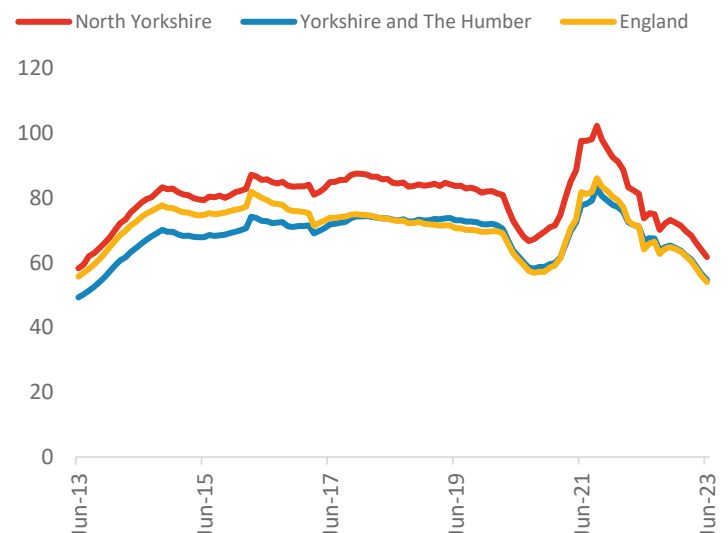
There were 8,364 transactions in North Yorkshire during the 12 months to June 2023. This is 62% of the average from 2001-05 and suggests activity is significantly below pre-downturn levels.

Transactions in North Yorkshire have fallen by 25.4% since 2014, compared to changes of -21.4% for Yorkshire and The Humber and -29.7% for England.
